## Senior Class History

We had fifty-seven students in our Sophomore Class. Gary Hamilton served as president, Arnold Highfield, vice-president; Maxine Miller, secretary-treasurer; and Bill Welch, reporter. Judy Horne was our homecoming attendant. Mr. Washington and Mrs. Campbell were class advisors.

Our all-important Junior Year consisted of forty-two students. Mrs. Campbell and Mr. Jenkins were class advisors. Rita Shingler served as president; Arnold Highfield, vice-president; Maxine Miller, secretary; Gary Hamilton, treasurer; and Mary Kingrey, reporter. The important events in this year were: The arrival of our class rings, the Junior-Senior Prom held at the Elks City Club, and our class play, "Your Face Is Familiar," directed by Mrs. Campbell. Carol Carter was our homecoming attendant.

The Senior Class of thirty-nine students was led through its last year by the class advisors, Mr. Jenkins and Mr. Lodwick. Larry Brown was elected president; Arnold Highfield, vice-president; Mary Adkins, secretary; Gary Hamilton, treasurer; and Mary Kingrey, reporter. We were together for the last event as a class, graduation, June 6, 1958.
