Senior Class History

The Freshman Class of 1954-55 consisted of sixty students. Mr. Rickey, Mrs. Davis, and Miss Clark served as the class advisors. Harold Schwable was president, Rita Shingler, vice-president; Carol Carter, treasurer; and Arnold Highfield, secretary. Rita Shingler was elected homecoming attendant.

We had fifty-seven students in our Sophomore Class. Gary Hamilton served as president, Arnold Highfield, vice-president; Maxine Miller, secretary-treasurer; and Bill Welch, reporter. Judy Horne was our homecoming attendant. Mr. Washington and Mrs. Campbell were class advisors.

Our all-important Junior Year consisted of forty-two students. Mrs. Campbell and Mr. Jenkins were class advisors. Rita Shingler served as president; Arnold Highfield, vice-president; Maxine Miller, secretary; Gary Hamilton, treasurer; and Mary Kingrey, reporter. The important events in this year were: The arrival of our class rings, the Junior-Senior Prom held at the Elks City Club, and our class play, "Your Face Is Familiar," directed by Mrs. Campbell. Carol Carter was our homecoming attendant.

The Senior Class of thirty-nine students was led through its last year by the class advisors, Mr. Jenkins and Mr. Lodwick. Larry Brown was elected president; Arnold Highfield, vice-president; Mary Adkins, secretary; Gary Hamilton, treasurer; and Mary Kingrey, reporter. We were together for the last event as a class, graduation, June 6, 1958.

After my visit with Gary, I returned to my room and as I did, there came a knock on my door. It was Harold Schwable and Ron Hale, who had heard I was in town. They informed me that they were now running the local speedway located on top of "Gobbler's Knob."

For the last game Glenwood played West in a muddy S. O. C. contest. While the Tigers slipped to defeat the Senators rolled to a 33-6 victory.



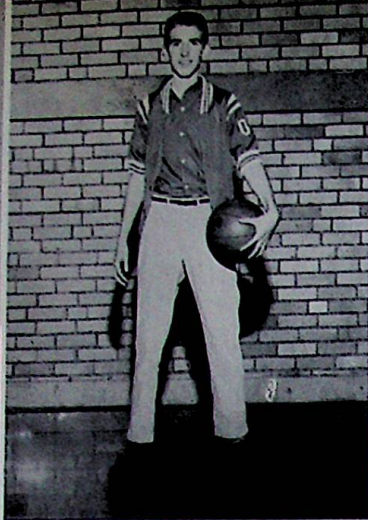

Basketball

Coach Pellegrinon did it again. After losing the first five starters from his All-Star 1957 team, he did a tremendous job of rebuilding to come back and take his third consecutive S. O. C. championship.

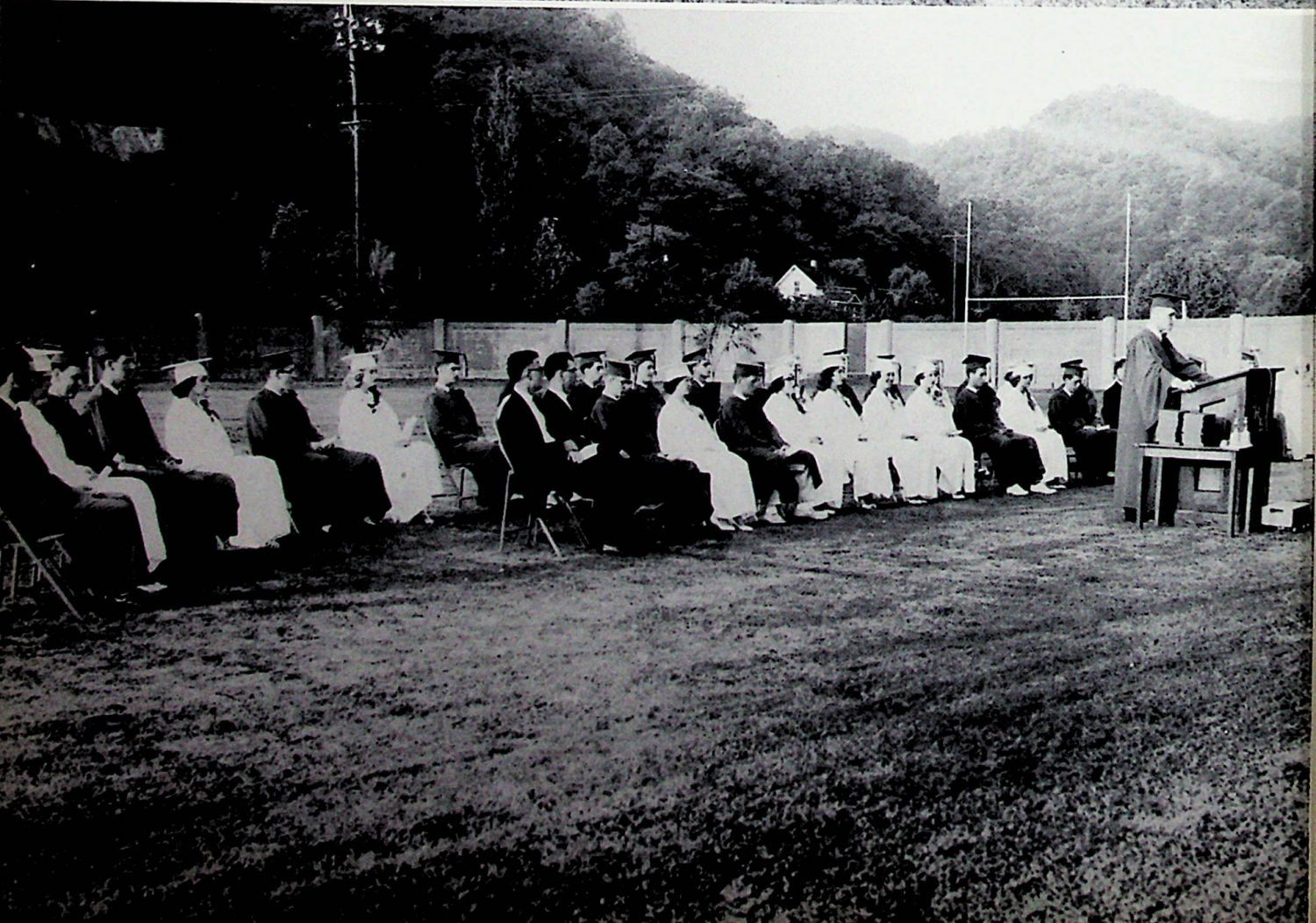

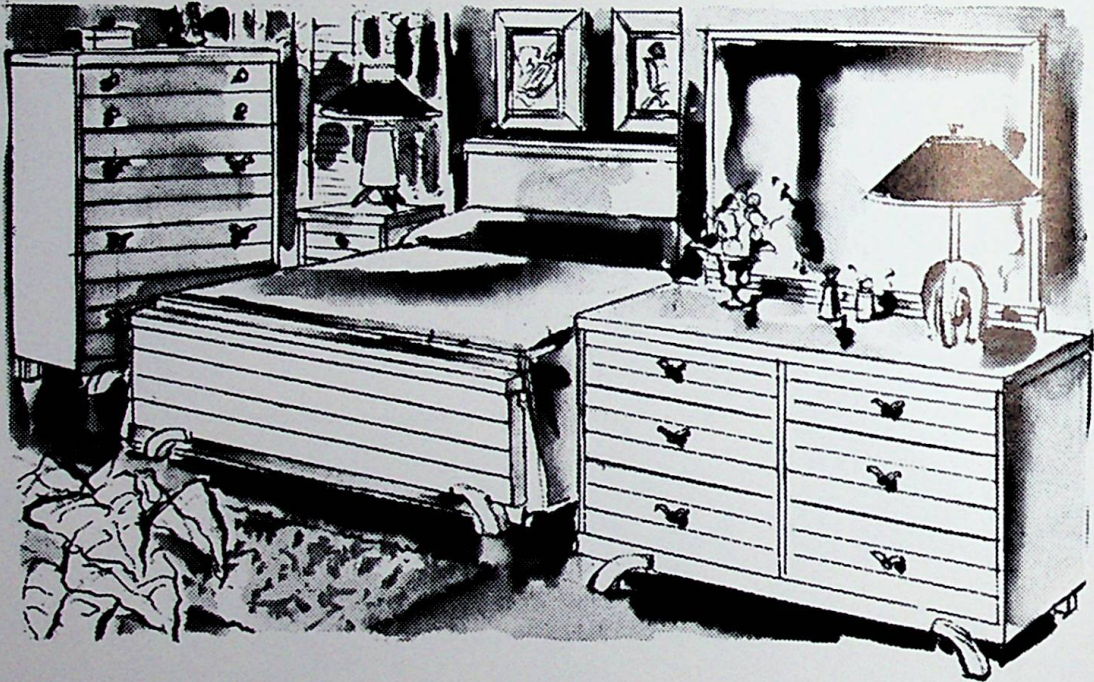
