








SOCIAL STUDIES EXCHANGE STUDENT PROGRAM



















BEARS BLANK INJURY-RIDDLED PHS—27-0 Spartan Stadium October 2, 1970



TROJANS FALL TO KETTERING IN DOUBLE OT — 66-68






