


The Northwest cheerleaders gather for a quick shot with Jennifer. All the girls supported Jennifer and wished her the best in the pageant.

Katie Miller waves as she catches sight of a familiar face in the crowd. Despite her enthusiastic smile, she was exhausted after walking the entire parade route.














August 6, 2007 was a day we will never forget.
