He was unable to speak or move his right side. The doctor said this was caused by a cancerous tumor. Several mornings later sitting on the side of my bed at the Ronald McDonald House, praying, telling God that I don't understand, God spoke and told me the he would raise Rodney up. Several weeks later, Rodney wrote on his board that "God told me in a dream that he was going to raise me up." Since then, we have gone through 31 treatments of radiation. Rodney was so sick he couldn't eat or drink. Anyone who came into his room left knowing that he trusted God completely. On October 12th, Life Ambulance flew Rodney from Children's Hospital and landed him on the 50 yard line at the school on Senior Night. He got out of the helicopter and walked to the sideline. Praise the Lord! November 7th, we came home from the hospital. On November 19th, the MRI showed absolutely NO TUMOR! He is still very weak and sick, but he knows that God has him and our whole family in the very center of his will! We wish to thank everyone for their prayers and support.
