
























## HISTORICAL SKETCH OF NEW BOSTON

Information compiled by Mr. Rickey and Senior History Class

In giving anything on the story of New Boston and its development, it is necessary to go back to events that happened before New Boston was settled.

The first settler in what is now New Boston was Samuel Marshall, who came here from Manchester in February, 1796. He built a log cabin in the field somewhere near the lower end of the steel plant. He was not only the first settler in New Boston, but was the first settler in Scioto County. He said that when he built his cabin here in 1796, there were no other people, "Neither White nor Redskin" in the present limits of Scioto County.

New Boston was platted February 17, 1791 by James Skelton, A. T. Holcomb, and M. Stanton. There were 191 lots in this first plat from 37 acres of the John Rhodes farm. The Yorktown addition was added by a plat filed by M. T. Stewart on October 23, 1900. There were other additions to both New Bos-

ton and Stewartsville.

New Boston was named after Boston, Massachusetts. Some capitalists from Boston put a lumber mill here in 1887. The logs were floated down the river from Eastern Kentucky and West Virginia forests. The mill was on the river bank about where West Avenue now is located, and the office was over on Gallia Street near West Avenue. This company was called the Little Kanawa Lumber Company. They had a good business supplying lumber to the local lumber yards and they also shipped lumber by both rail and boat. In 1898 both the lumber yard and the mill were destroyed by fire. They did not rebuild, but New Boston did not suffer from this experience as the Breece Manufacturing Company moved from Portsmouth to New Boston in 1900.

The Detroit Steel Company which is New Boston's main industry is the outgrowth of the Burgess Steel and Iron Works. This was started in New Boston in November 1898 by Levi D. York and others. This industry also came to New Boston due to a fire destroying their plant on Front Street in Portsmouth,

June 7, 1898.

The first Scioto County Fair Grounds were where the steel plant is now. When the mill was built, the fair grounds were moved farther east, up to where the Coke Ovens are now. Then later to the present location at Lucas-ville.

New Boston was incorporated as a Village in 1906. William Kent (died Jan., 1954) was its first Mayor. Art Rutter who was killed while on duty, was the first village Marshall. The first Mayor's salary was \$50 per year plus fees, and the Marshall received \$50 per month. New Boston became a city in 1930. This came about by having a population of over 5,000. It was about to be reduced to Village status in 1950, but a recount gave us the necessary pop-

ulation to retain city government.

The first school in New Boston was under the Clay Township Board of Education. It was held in a rented building in 1893. A new building was put up on Stanton Avenue in 1896 and first used in the fall of that year. It was used till 1903 when a four room building was erected on the present Stanton Avenue site. Later the Oak Street and Glenwood buildings were provided and the Stanton Avenue building was enlarged. The High School for New Boston was started by a teacher in one room at Stanton Avenue in 1909.

The first Superintendent of Schools was S. D. Eckhart, and the first High School Principal was Dan E. Ross.

Any New Boston pupils taking more than the Eighth Grade up to this time went to Portsmouth High School and the tuition was \$10. per month.

The first graduating class was the Class of 1919.

In 1894 there were fewer than ten houses scattered throughout the farm-

lands which now form New Boston. The population did not exceed fifty.

The oldest house in New Boston is located at 3763 Gallia Street. It was built in 1816 as the farm house on the John Rhodes farm, when first built, it stood opposite Ohio Avenue, 3781 Gallia Street. It was moved from this site to its present location by Lewis Elhoff who put up the brick house at 3781 Gallia for his own home. The oldest business property in New Boston is the Conley Building at West and Gallia. Built in 1900.

One of the early business men in New Boston was Lewis Elhoff. He had a Livery Stable on the site now occupied by the Streitenberger Radio and Television Repair shop. In addition to the Livery business he sold farm wagons, express wagons and buggies. He also had the honor of being the first New

Boston resident to own an automobile.

The first Drug Store in New Boston was started in 1904, by Jack Fisher. It was located at the corner of Center and Gallia Streets. He was here only a few years and closed his store.

Then in 1909 Carl Emmert started a drug store across the street from the present Kelso building. He was here for two years and closed his store

here and located in Columbus.

Earnest Coburn was the first druggist to continue in the business here. He opened his store known as Coburn's Drug Store on April 1, 1912, and continued in business in the present Kelso building for six years. Then due to other financial interests which demanded his time, he sold to John and James Kelso, both of whom were registered pharmacists, and the drug store has continued to the present as Kelso's Drug Store.

Dr. Carl Emmert mentioned above was the first dentist in New Boston. He

was followed by Dr. C. E. Beatty.

Then Dr. Lett came to New Boston, and we have had Drs. Beatty and Lett

to take of our dental needs to the present time.

For fear some of you do not know this we remind you that there was a cement plant at the head of Glenwood Avenue. This was the York Portland Cement Company. The B & O Railroad ran a switch from their line up to the plant to furnish them with raw materials and to ship the finished product.

This B & O branch line ran over the ground on which our Glenwood High

School now stands.

A Chapel car was run on the line on the east side of Gallia Street. (See

Picture.)

When the Little Kanawa Lumber Company was here, they had a general store on West Avenue, around 1890. The first privately owned grocery store was owned by Ed Brady, around 1894. It stood where the Acme Hardware is today. Ed Brady soon sold out to M. T. Stewart.

The first Self-Serve Market in New Boston was the Piggly Wiggly Store. It was on Gallia Street in the building where the American Restaurant is now.

The first Post Office in New Boston was on the South West corner of Gallia and Ohio Avenue. M. T. Stewart was the first postmaster. The Post Office was in what is now Dr. Lett's home, and later from there it was moved to Park Avenue. It remained there until it moved to the present location.

Before the days of Milbrook Park there was a small park on the hillside

opposite West Avenue. It was called Grandview Park.

The history of the early churches dates back to the beginning of New Boston. The first church in New Boston was started by the Presbyterians from First and Second Church in Portsmouth. It was located at Ohio and Rhodes and first used in 1899. It was under the care of the Second Presbyterian Church of Portsmouth for some time and then abandoned. The second Church to start in New Boston was the present Ohio Avenue Christian. Nate T. Rickey furnished the building and Mrs. Nancy Elhoff and Mr. Rickey both being members of the Christian Church in Portsmouth, interested the Portsmouth Church in helping to get a Church started here. This was the beginning of the Ohio Avenue Christian Church. The date was 1901.

New Boston withstood two severe floods of 67 ft. 10 3/4 in. in 1913, (highest March 31) and the other in 1937, the high mark of which was 74 ft. 3 in. on January 28 of that year. (See Pictures). These floods provided the urge for better flood protection and along with Portsmouth, New Boston now has a flood wall able to keep out 77 ft. of water.

Nearly all the streets and alleys of New Boston are paved. This paving movement started in 1914. The same year New Boston by special agreement


with Portsmouth got pure water.

We have tried to find the oldest resident of New Boston, and to the best of our knowledge, Mrs. Cleresey Mauck of 805 Harrisonville Avenue qualifies for the honor. (See Picture) She was 97 years old on January 30th of this year. She was a resident of New Boston at the time of its incorporation into a village in 1906, and has lived here continuously ever since that time.


Not being a prophet, the future of New Boston will not even be suggested here, but let us hope that as much progress can be made in the next 50 years





two extra points.


