

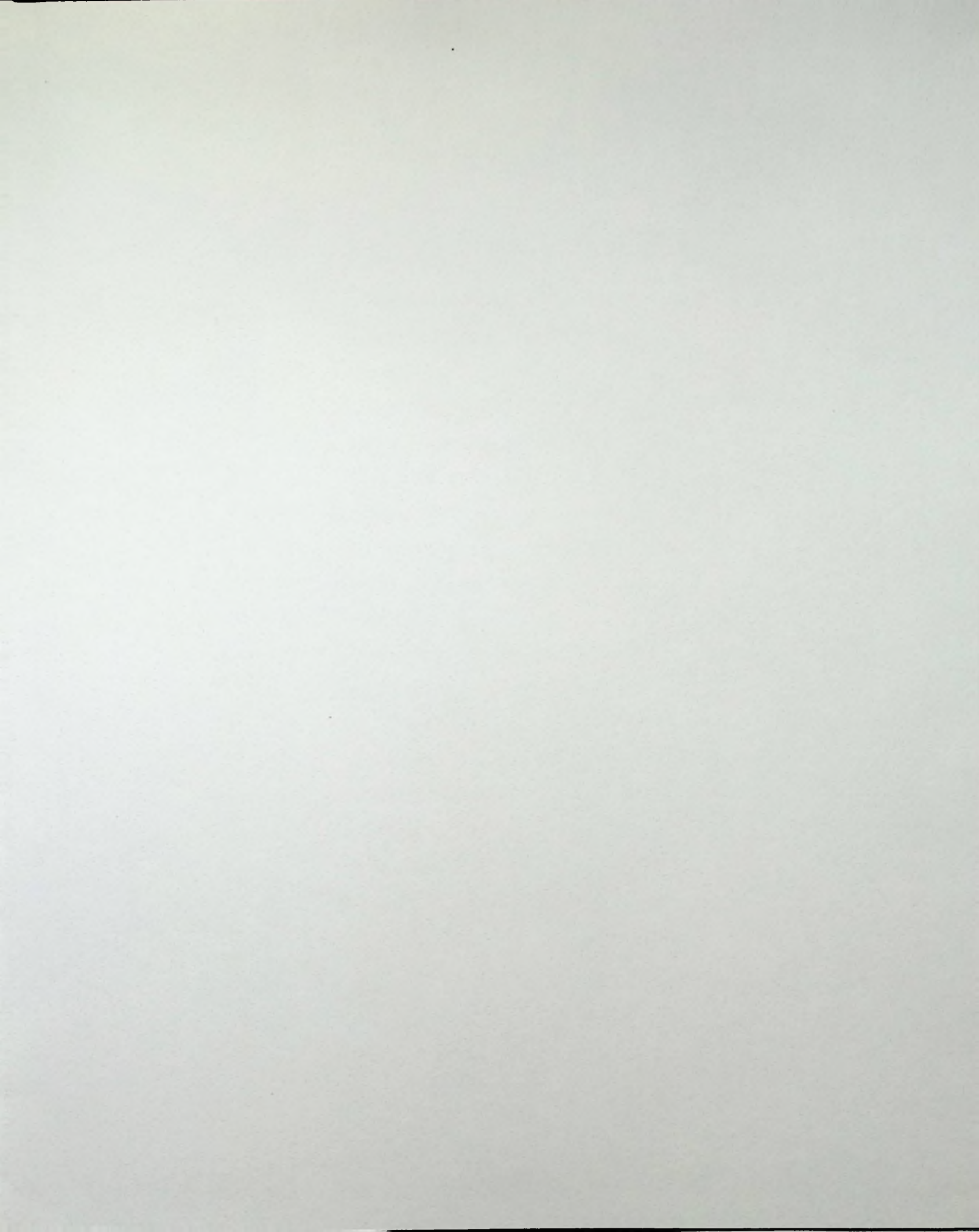

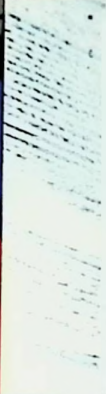






# MOHAWK PRIDE

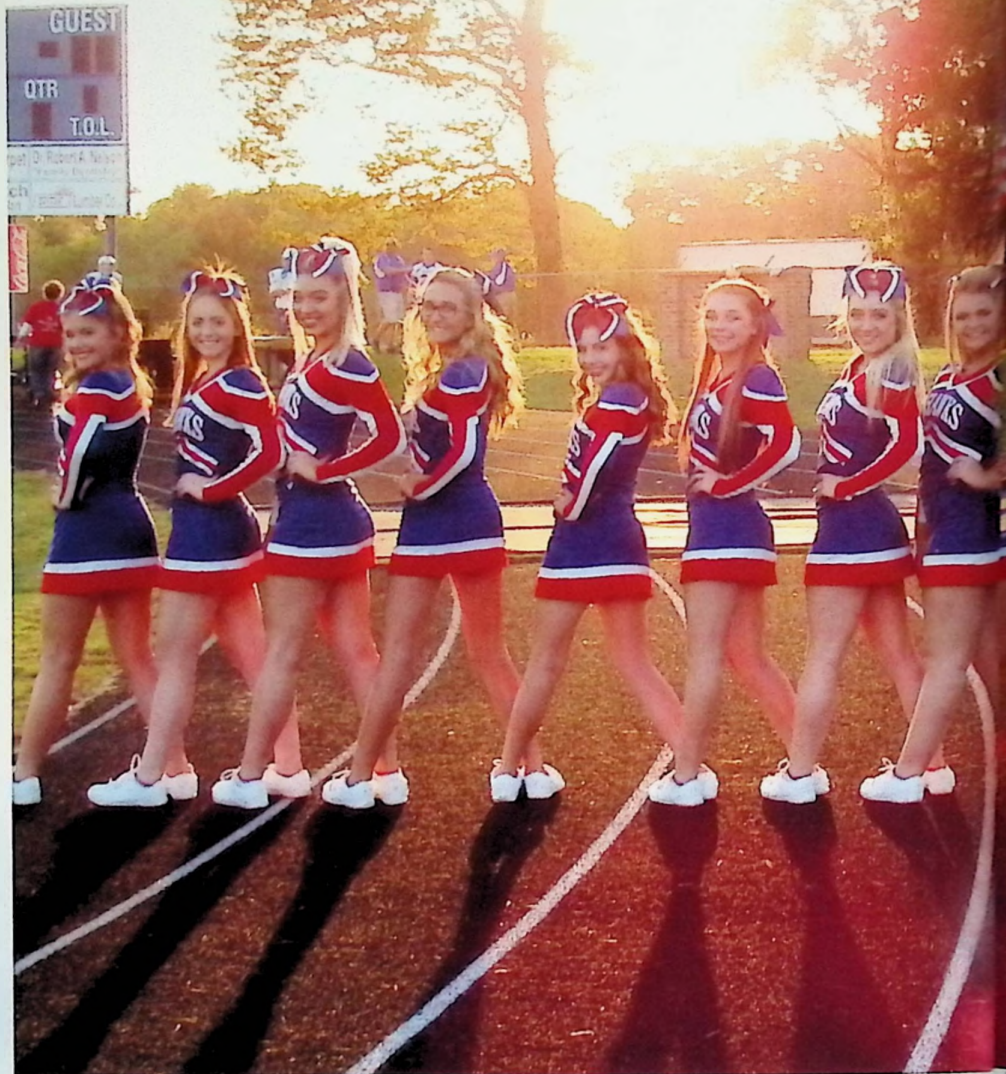

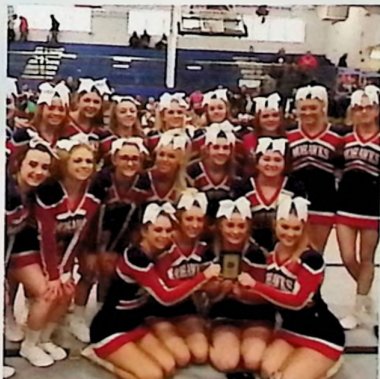

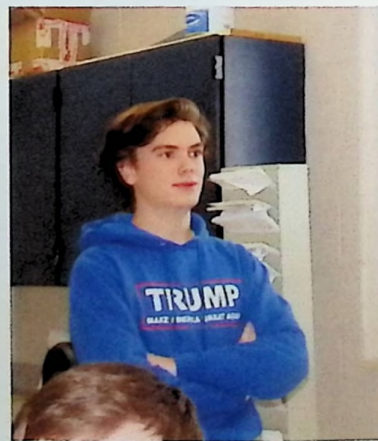

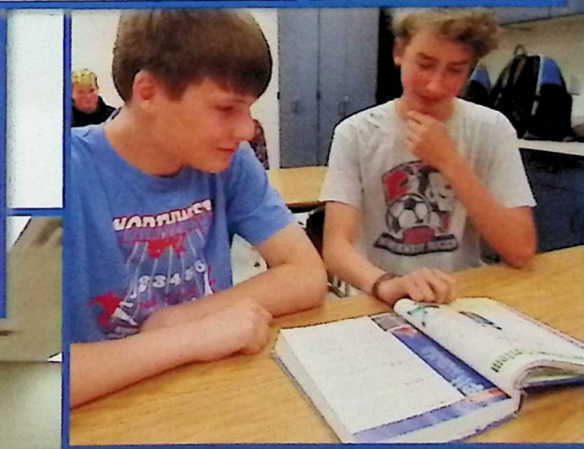

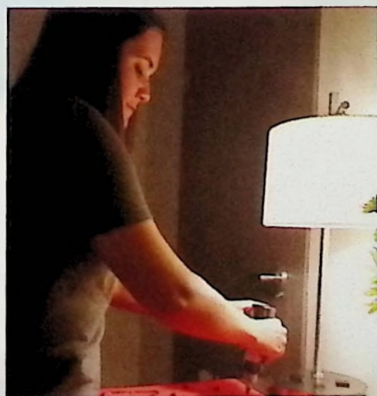

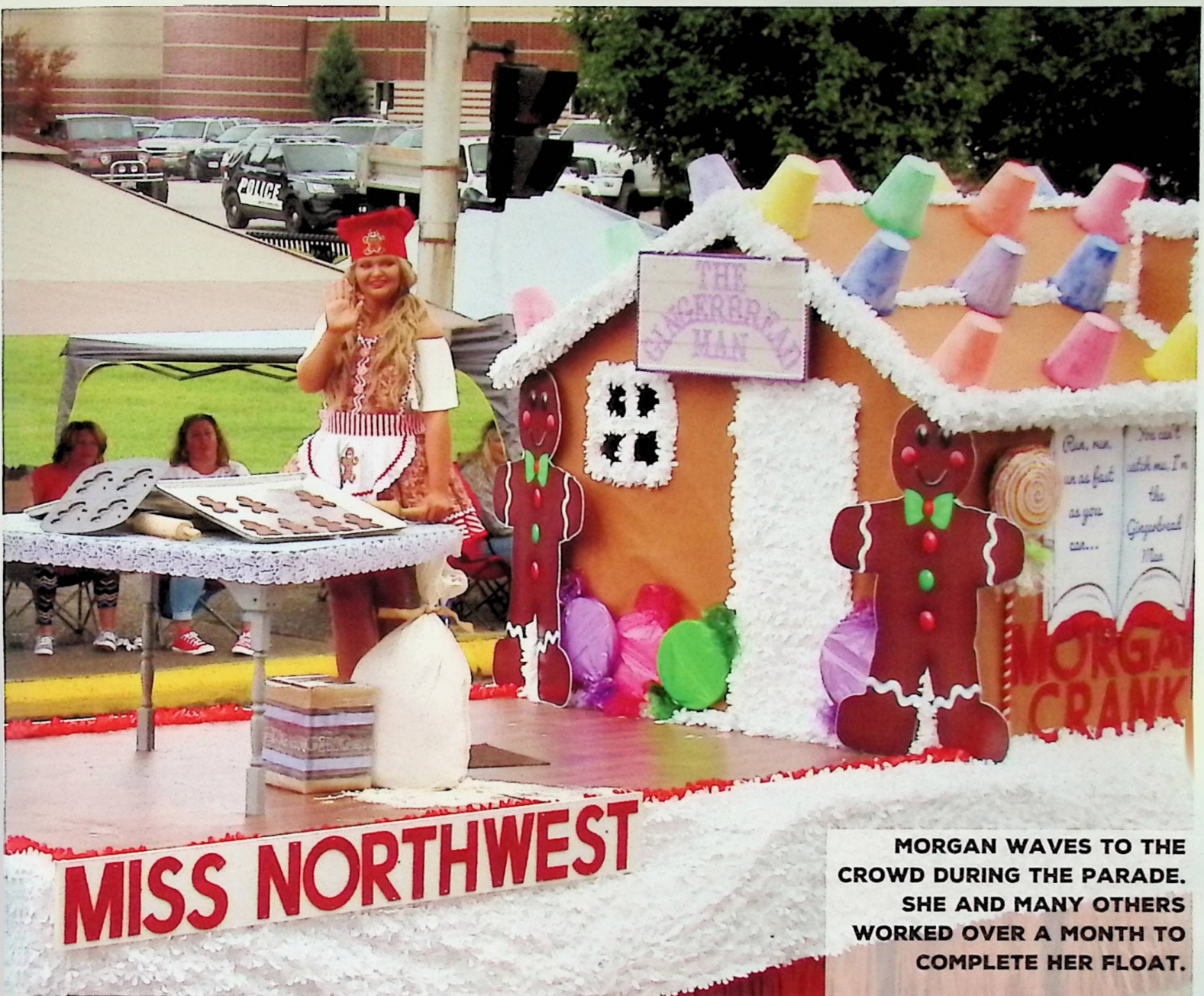

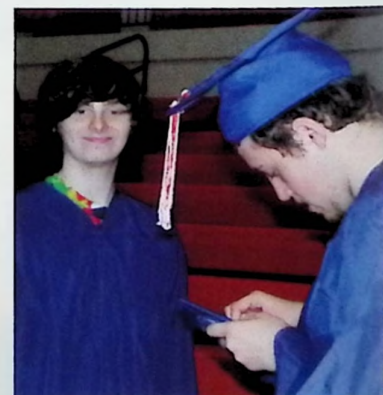
