Mr. Jack Branon, Social Studies

Mr. Jack Branon is retiring at the conclusion of the 2001-02 school year from WHS after 35 years in the Scioto County schools. He taught two years at Clay and five years at Green, before spending the past 28 years in the Wheelersburg Schools system. Mr. Branon taught for 11 years at the junior high and for 17 years at the high school, teaching social studies at both levels. Mr. Branon coached four different sports at WHS. He coached 26 years of basketball, 20 of those as boys' assistant. Three of those basketball teams played in the state tournament. He was in the girls' basketball program for six years, five of those as Head Coach. Mr. Branon coached baseball for 20 years, winning the state championship in 1996. As cross country coach for 20 years, he had 16 runners in the state meet. He also coached swimming for one year. Mr. Branon coached in State All-Star games in two sports, girls' basketball (1997) and baseball (1996 and 2001), and was Ohio Division III Baseball Coach of the Year three times. Mr. Branon's plans for retirement include watching more baseball games as his son. Michael, plays for Rio Grande University, and to continue to enjoy time with his granddaughter. He plans to enjoy fishing, running, and perhaps a little part-time work. Mr. Branon also plans to do genealogy research. and eventually hopes to write a book or more.







In 2001, the Pirates looked to bounce back from a disappointing 5-6 record which had caused the Pirates not to capture the SOC the previous year. One of the biggest wins in 2001 was the victory against Minford. The Pirates traveled to Minford and defeated the Falcons 21-7. The Pirates suffered a huge loss due to this game when running back Billy Dever broke his ankle, but not before getting 140 yds on 7 carries against Minford. Jared Chamberlin did an excellent job of taking over fulltime running back duties. The Pirates would go on to finish the regular season 6-4, just falling short of their hopes for an SOC Perhaps the most Championship. memorable game was the Portsmouth The Pirates were down 7-21 game. with 5 minutes left. The Pirates scored. got an onside kick, and scored again. but a controversial call on a two-point conversion left the Pirates with a 19-21 loss. After a close playoff game with Cincinnati Reading, the Pirates finished the season at 6-5, but lost their last 3 games by a combined total of only 17 points. The Pirates' record by no means reflected their work ethic, heart, desire. and performance on the field, despite the losses of Coach Schmidt and Billy Dever. The Pirates gave all they had and that is what the 18 seniors will be remembered for at WHS.








Cross Country






























Yearbook Staff












Vocal Music






Football Homecoming












After Hours








