




Dedication

Class History

Penny Born and Doniece Salyers were freshman majorettes.

We entered our sophomore year looking forward to ordering class rings. Mark Baer was elected president. Other officers were Carol Lewis, vice-president; Diane Donley, treasurer; and Vi Wallace, secretary. Sharon Conkle was homecoming attendant.
