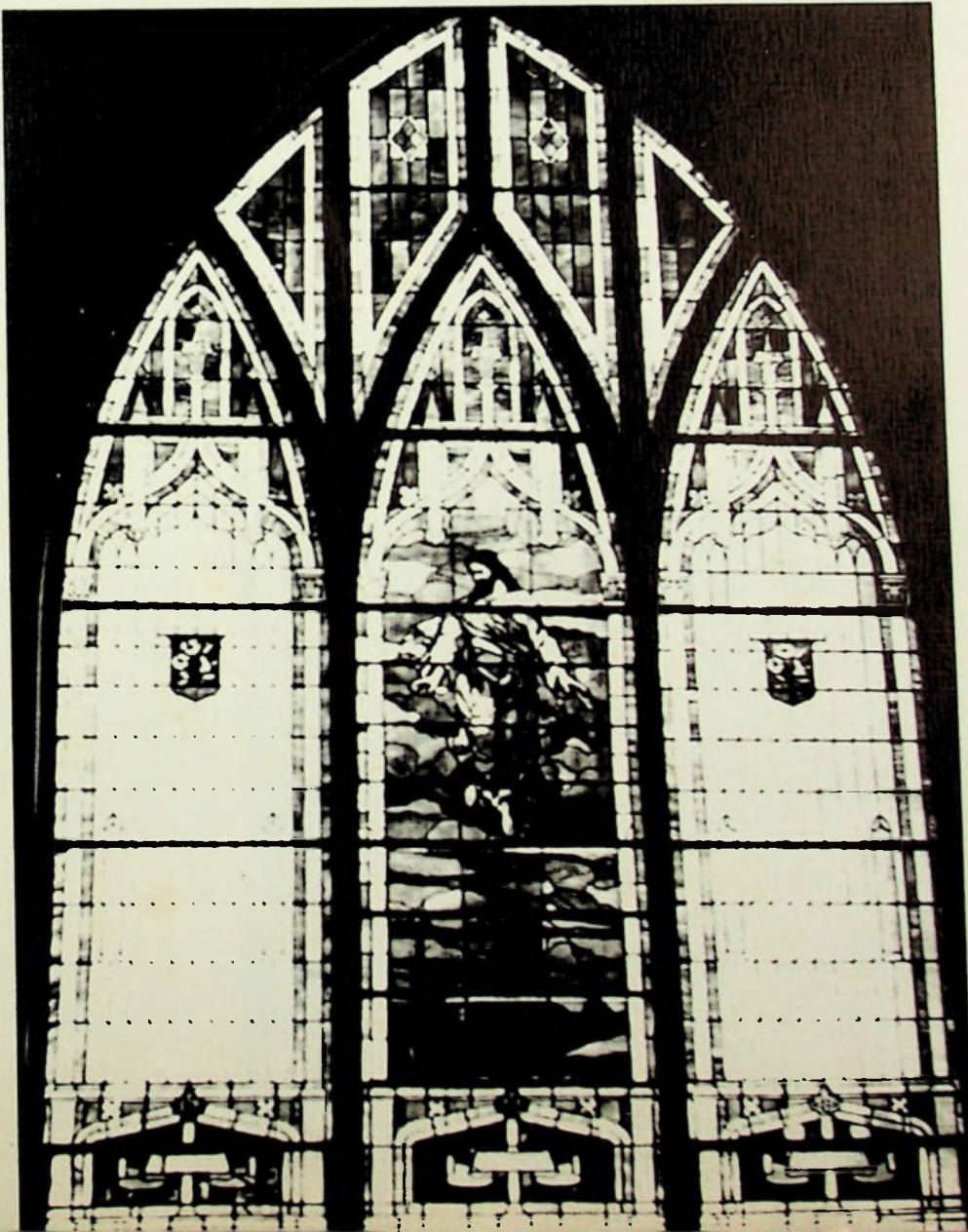
DEATH BE NOT PROUD

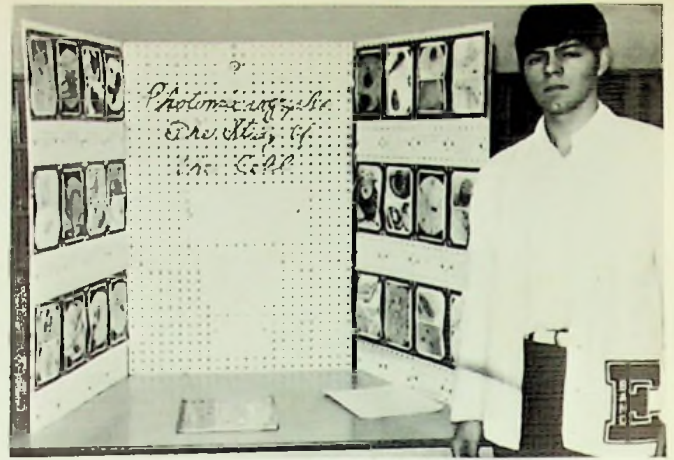
