




Mr. McKelvey received his A.B. degree from Ohio University and his M.A. from Ohio State University.

Mr. Frowine's spare time is occupied by a number of activities, including golf.


His education includes a B.S. degree from Wilmington College, and a B.A. and an M.A. from Marshall College.





History of the Class of Nineteen Hundred and Fifty-Eight

In the fall of 1954, the class of '58 entered East High School with an enrollment of 125. Our class officers were: Tom Moorhead, president; Janice Krainz, vice-president; Judy Humphrey, secretary; and Donna Rowe, treasurer. Our money-making projects were: a shamrock dance.

Our freshman attendant to the homecoming queen was Janice Krainz and Ellen Gilpin was our candidate for the Yearbook Queen. Ten members of our class won places on the scholarship team. The '54 roster of the football team had 11 of our boys. They were: Ronnie Kirchner, Ray Moore, Dale Bahner, Wilbur Johnson, Dave Rose, Elmo Keller, Virgil Whisenant, Ed Reinhardt, Blaine Chamberlain, Arthur Vogel, and Doug Farmer. Our classmates on the reserve basketball team were: Dale Bahner, Ray Moore, Paul Bauer, Dave Atkins, Ronnie Kirchner, and Tom Moorhead.' Our members on the baseball team were: Ray Moore, Blaine Chamberlin, Doug Farmer, and Carl Burns, Virgil Whisenant, Jerry Williams, and Denny Mullins.

Our sophomore year, we chose as officers: Ellen Gilpin, President; Tom Moorhead, Vice-president; Ruth Hum-phries, Secretary; and Karen Crabtree, Treasurer. Our class advisors were, and, with the exception of Miss White-house, still are Edward Pogue, Christine Heer, Elizabeth Whitehouse, and Helen Basham.

During the winter, we sold name stickers, and on February 21, the class sponsored a dance in celebration of the birthday anniversary of George Washington. We also had a skating party. Our homecoming attendant was Judy Humphrey and Donna Rowe was the candidate for yearbook queen. Anne Hensley and Judy Humphrey were chosen junior varsity cheerleaders. Our class was represented on the scholarship team by 16 members. Seven of our girls were waitresses at the Junior-Senior Prom. These included Barbara Beasley, Carolyn Hale, Janet Kemp, Wanda Mullins, Nella Bradley, Ruth Humphries, and Barbara Gee. The sophomores on the football team were: Paul Bauer, Ray Moore, Arthur Vogel, Ed Reinhardt, Wilber Johnson, Gary King, Ronnie Kirchner, Blaine Chamberlin, Doug Farmer, and Dennis Hoerr. The reserve basketball team was composed of 8 of our members among others. They were: Paul Bauer, Dave Rose, Dale Bahner, Dannis Hoerr, Tom Moorhead, Ray Moore, Ronnie Kirchner, and Carl Burns. Ronnie Pack served as manager of the team. Members on the baseball team were: Gary King, Emory Parker, Dave Atkins, Carl Burns, Wilbur Johnson, and Ray Moore.

As juniors, we chose Paul Bauer president of our class. Other officers were: Dona Dever, Vice-president; Ellen Gilpin, Secretary; and Barbara Gee, Treasurer. Miss Madeira replaced Miss Whitehouse as a class advisor. Our projects for this year included publication of the school newspaper, "Blue and White"; with Carolyn Hale as Editor-in-Chief and Gary Blackburn as Assistant Editor; the football concession stand, a dance, and the annual Junior-Senior Prom.

Ellen Gilpin was chairman of our magazine sale. Homeroom captains were Donna Rowe, Tom Moorhead, and Joan Allard. High salesman was Jean Boggs. Our attendant to the homecoming queen was Marilyn Fowler. For the first time, there was a king to accompany the yearbook queen. Our candidates for this honor were Dona Dever and Dave Rose. Ovid Young was selected to be the junior editor of the "Tartan." Sixteen of our girls were chosen for the Tri-Hi-Y.

Barbara Gee, Carolyn Hale, Tom Moorhead, and Ovid Young were elected to membership in the National Honor Society. Dona Dever replaced Judy Humphrey as a varsity cheerleader. We presented "Desperate Ambrose" as our class play. It was directed by Miss Baily and Miss Madeira. It was given in East Auditorium. The scholarship team was made up of 7 members of the junior class in addition to the others. Marilyn Fowler was our only member of the majorette squad. Ovid Young was our school's delegate to the World Affairs Institute in Cincinnati. Adrian Spearry attended Buckeye Boys' State. Barbara Gee was a representative to the Youth in Government project in Columbus. Ovid Young was the recipient of the Delphic Literary Society's junior cup. Our members on the football team were: Wyatt Cooper, Paul Bauer, Dave Rose, Ronnie Kirchner, Gary King, Doug Farmer, Ray Moore, Elmo Keller, Ed Reinhardt, and Willard Mullins, Art Vogel, Blaine Chamberlin. 

Members of the football team were: Blaine Chamberlin, Paul Bauer, Dale Bahner, Dave Rose, Dennis Hoerr, Gary King, Doug Farmer, Ronnie Kirchner, and Ed Reinhardt. Ovid Young was president of the Science Club the 1st semester, Adrian Spearry served as Lab Assistant and Barbara Gee was secretary-treasurer. 



These after-game dances were the first in the history of the school. They were held in the cafeteria and sponsored by the Girls' League.



Our lunch room comes under the Federal Public School Lunch Room and Surplus Commodity Program of Congress. Many surplus foods are distributed to our school monthly. The amount and kind of food depends upon what is available in the state at that particular time. Each day's menu must consist of certain basic food values. This is set by National and State Nutritionists. The city health and food inspectors make periodical checks of the kitchen and the way the food is handled. Each cook must pass certain health examinations.
