Q: How did you feel when you were asked to escort Christie?

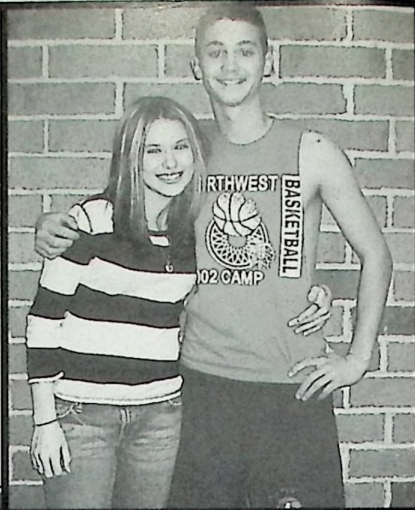
A: It was an honor, but it made me a little nervous knowing I would be in front of so many people. It was an awesome experience, and I wouldn't have changed a thing.

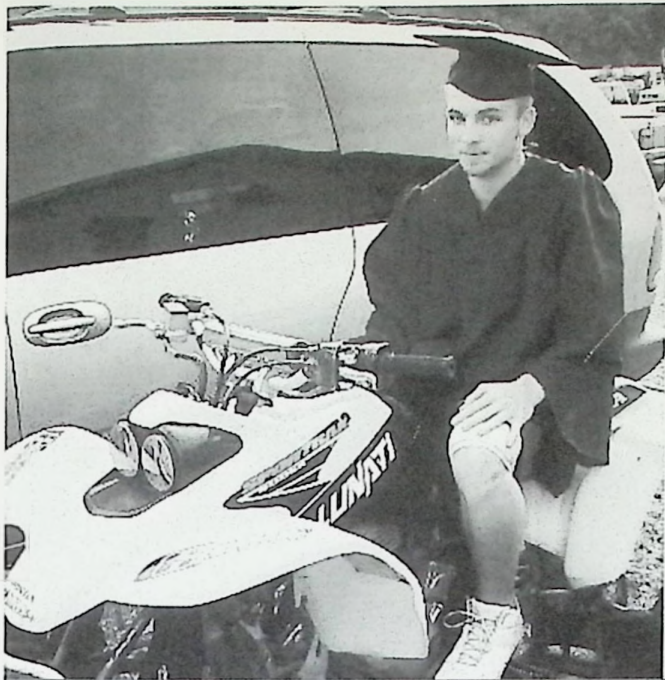

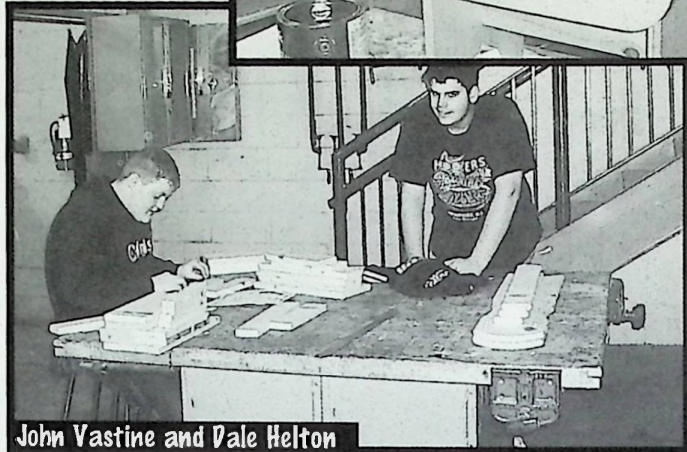

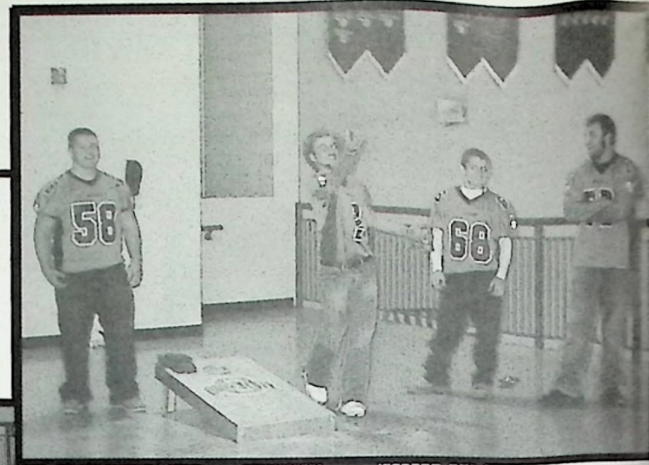

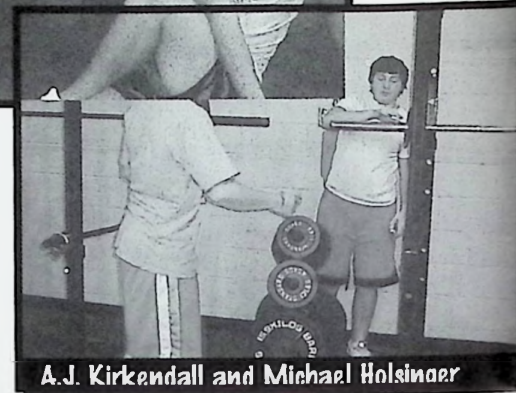

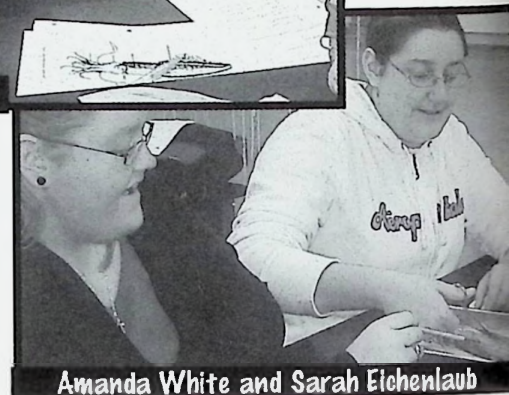

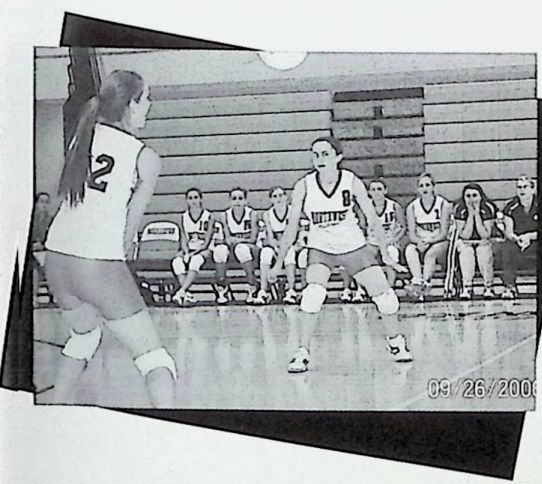

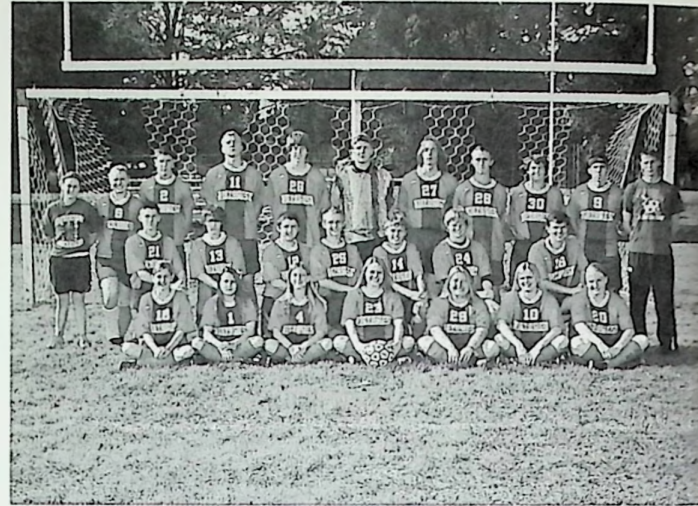

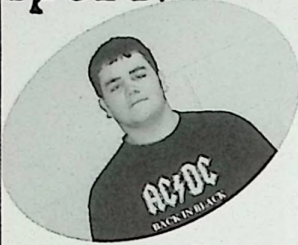

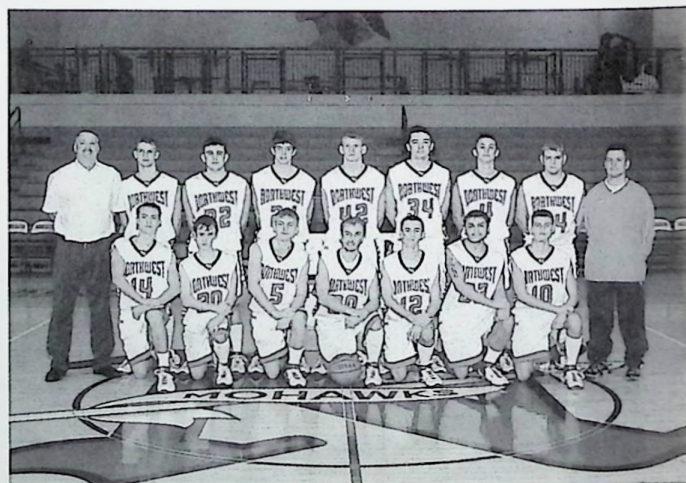

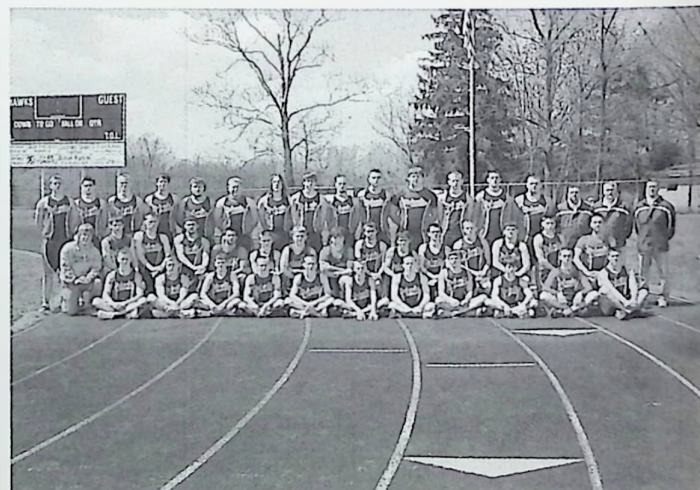

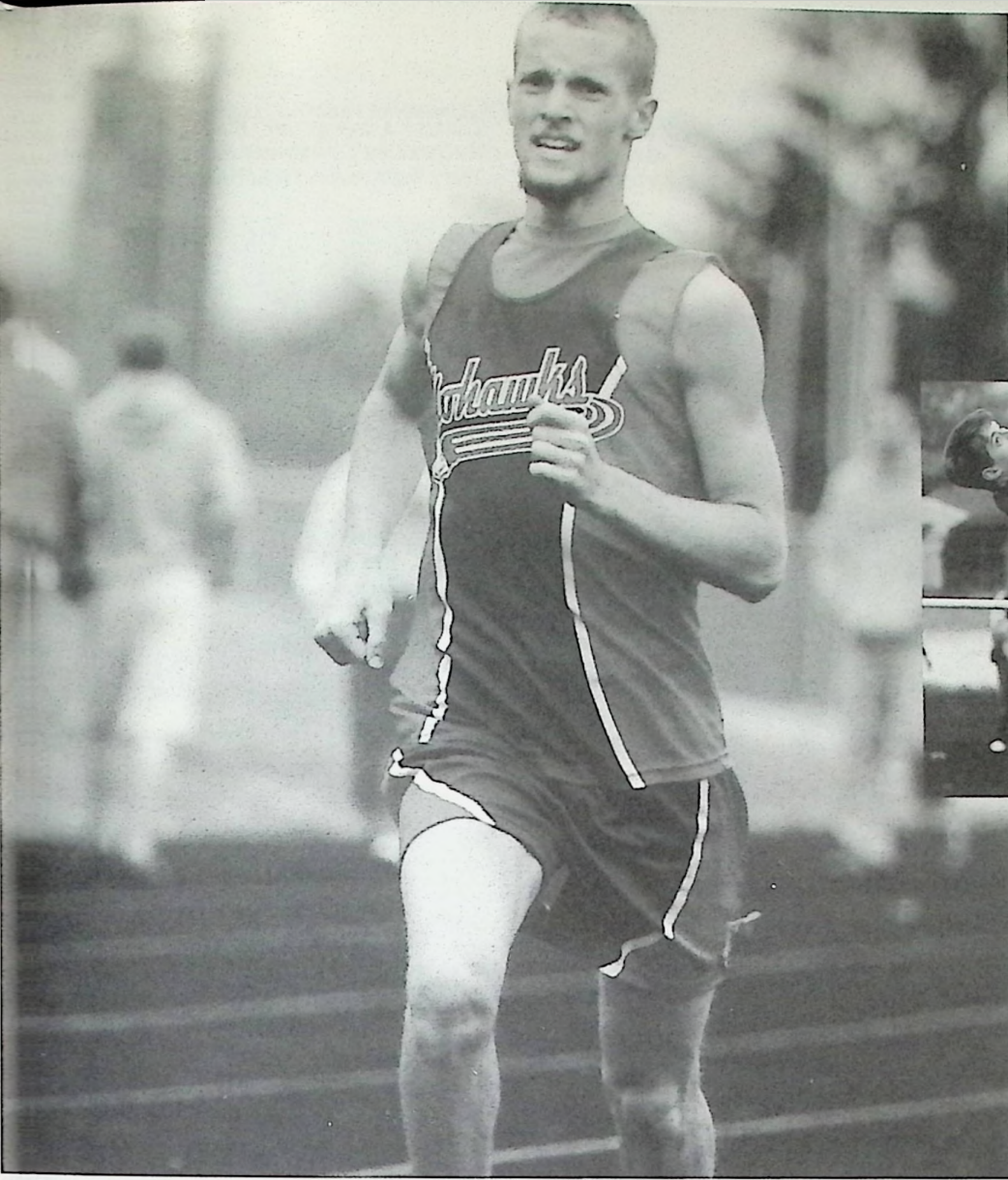

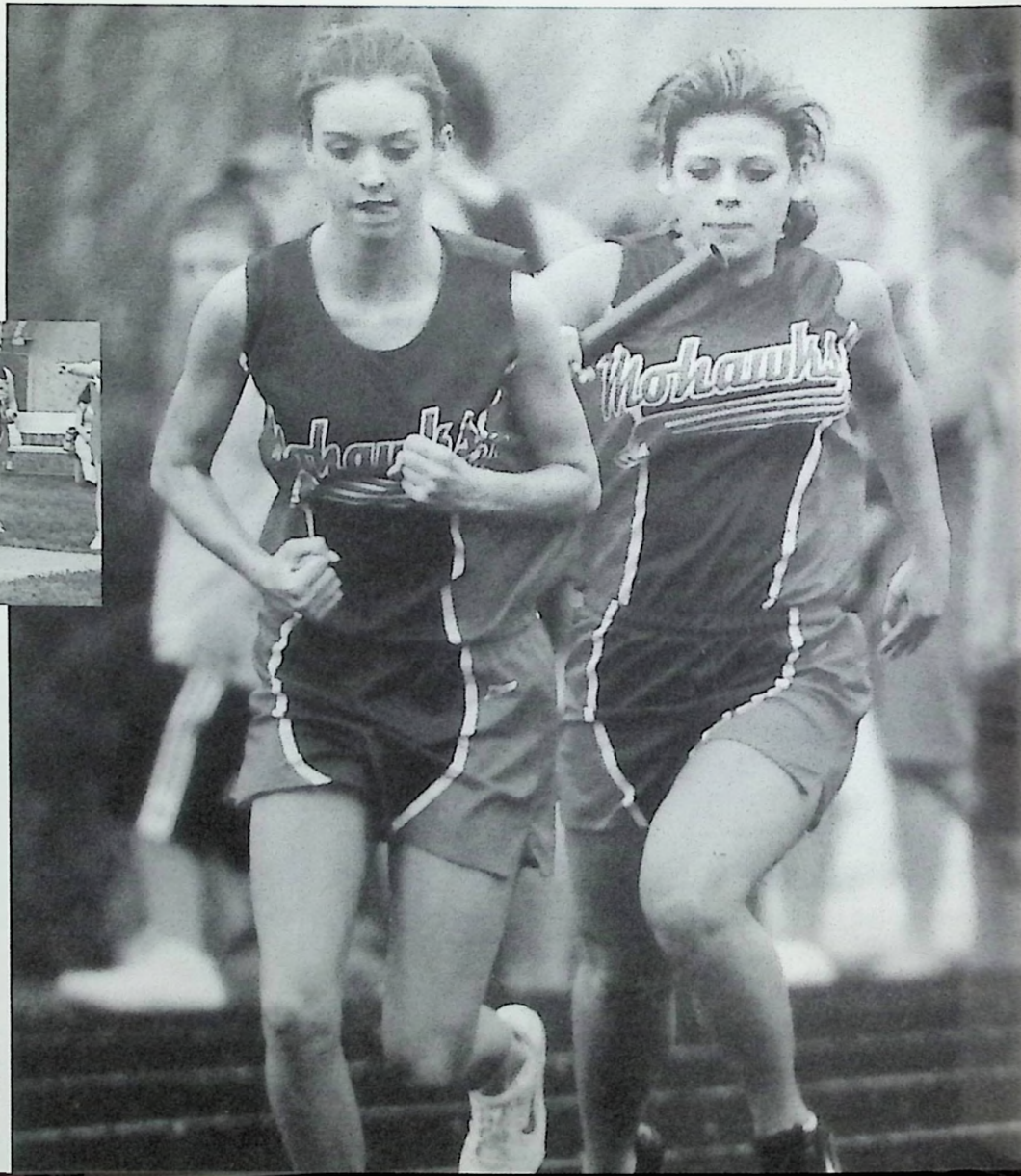
