


"Looking Back"








Class Play



Iota Sigma Kappa


Although there are few students in the Independent Studies classes, Iota Sigma Kappa accomplished numerous projects. 



National Honor Society






Social Studies Club




Girls' Tennis







Varsity and JV Volleyball




Varsity Boys' Basketball




Boys' Track

The boys' track team continued another successful season winning every track meet in the regular season while keeping both the Burg Invitational and SOC trophies at home. Among the personal bests established at the Burg Invitational was Adam Salvers in the shot put, setting a new meet record. Jonathan Dunham won the 100, 200, and 400-meter dashes and placed third in the long jump to finish with 36 points on the night. At the SOC tract meet, the home jinx was finally broken on the newly paved home track as Pirates had won the last title at home in 1982. Leading the way once again was Dunham, who was the high point medalist of the night with 38 points. Jonathan won the 100-, 200-, and 400-meter dashes and placed second in the high jump. Jonathan's time in the 200-meter, 22.4, broke the SOC record which had stood since 1976. Winning the SOC title marked the fifth year in a row for the Pirates. The Pirates left little doubt as to who was the ton team at the Division III Southeast District track meet finishing with 166.5 points over second-place Chesapeake with 124 points. For the Regional meet to be held at Lancaster, WHS qualified 12 of the 16 events that were run at district. Three throwers, Nick Musick, Adam Salvers and loe Vanmeter, all qualified for the region. After qualifying for the regional finals, Jonathan Dunham, the defending Div. III state champion in the 400-meter dash, was diagnosed with a broken ankle, ending hopes of a repeat title. At the end of the regional finals, WHS placed 5th in the team results with 37 points. The Pirates qualified four events for the state meet with the 800-meter run, 110meter hurdles, 300-meter hurdles, and shot put.












Senior Justin Evans moves to keep ahead of his nearest opponent in the relay event.



Girls' Track


After the first invitational relay meet of the year, the WHS girls' track team completed another dominating season by winning every track meet in the regular season and earning both the Wheelersburg Invitational and SOC trophies. At the Burg Invitational, the Lady Pirates compiled 199 points to win Division II, easily outdistancing second place River Valley, which had 66 points. The Lady Pirates placed first in 8 of the 16 events at that invitational. They were led by senior Tiffany Boggs, who took Medalist honors, scoring 34 of Wheelersburg's points. Boggs won the 100- and 200-meter dashes, placed second in the 400-meter dash, and third in the senior Lady Pirates won their fourth consecutive SOC champoinship with a close score of 162-152 over the second place Lady Tigers.

Wheelersburg finished fourth with 53 points in the Division II Southeast District Track Meet at Fairland. The Regional Meet as held at Byesville on May 28th. At the Division II Regional track meet, the Lady Pirates ended their season as a team in he 33rd place with 4 points. The 4 X 400-meter relay team of Amanda Pyles, Holly Porter, Tiffany Boggs, and Michelle chmidt finished in 5th place with a time of 4:10.16. 




Boys' Tennis

The WHS Pirates finished a perfect season in the SOC with a 3-2 win against Minford on May 20, 2003, and ended the regular season 14-1 overall. The Pirates won both the singles and doubles SOC Division II tournament championships. In the doubles final, the #1 seeded team of John Ochoa and Trenton Thomas topped Waverly's #2 seed 6-4, 6-3. In singles play, #1 seed Marcelo Molina, an exchange student from Ecuador, won the SOC championship over Minford's Nate Franke in straight sets. In the Sectional championship, Marcelo had to beat Nate Franke again, the defending champion, and did so 6-1, 6-1 to qualify for the district tournament as the #1 seed. Marcelo was the only area player to advance to the Division II District Tournament and won a pair of matches in straight sets to guarantee himself a spot in the state tournament, played at Ohio State University, as the #3 seed in singles. At the Division II state tournament, Marcelo played the #2 seed from Cincinnati Hills Christian Academy and lost 6-0, 6-0 to end the WHS tennis season.

Softball

The Lady Pirates completed the best season in WHS history at 23-4 while advancing to the regional championship game. The Lady Pirates won the sectional tournament by shutting out both Coal Grove and South Point. In district tournament action, the Lady Pirates beat Peebles 4-2 in the semifinal to advance to the championship game against Huntington Ross. Rachel Staley allowed only two hits on the night while striking out 12 batters. Run production was led by senior twins Danielle and Michelle Thomas. The Lady Pirates won the district championship with a 5-2 win over the Lady Huntsmen. Senior pitcher Rachel Staley dominated Huntington Ross, striking out 13 and walking only one. In the two previous times that WHS and Portsmouth West met during the season, a share of the SOC Division II Championship was at stake. West won both times in the regular season. When the two rival teams met for the third time on June 1st, after a postponed Saturday Division III regional final, a berth in the state tournament was up for grabs. WHS entered the final at 23-3 and West at 28-1 in the season. The championship game was tied 1-1 until the top of the fifth inning, but sadly the Lady Pirates saw their season come to an end with a 1-3 loss in the game.

























































"It's in our blood."
