We are thankful that they are such a capable and forward looking group of men who have done such a splendid job of organizing our district and constructing, equipping, and running our new school building.

The original board was composed of members selected one from each of the former township boards of education. These men were President Glenn Shelton, from Union Twp.; Vice Pres. Glenn Emmett, Rush; Clerk Homer Penn, Brush Creek; Earl Crabtree, Morgan; and Joe Reynolds, Rarden.

In the fall of 1956, a special election was held in which the bond issue for construction of Northwest High passed by a high percentage. Construction by Don King Construction Co. began in March, 1957, and the building was ready for use at the beginning of this school year.

We wish to thank our local board of education, the county administration, the state department, the voters, and everyone who played a part in giving us NORTHWEST HIGH SCHOOL.

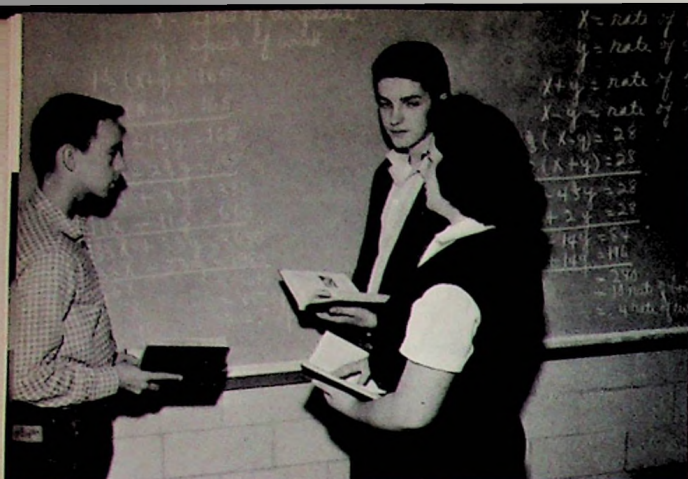

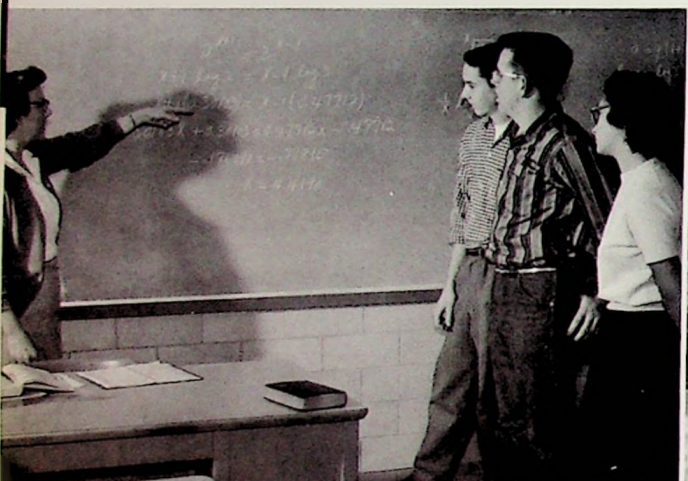

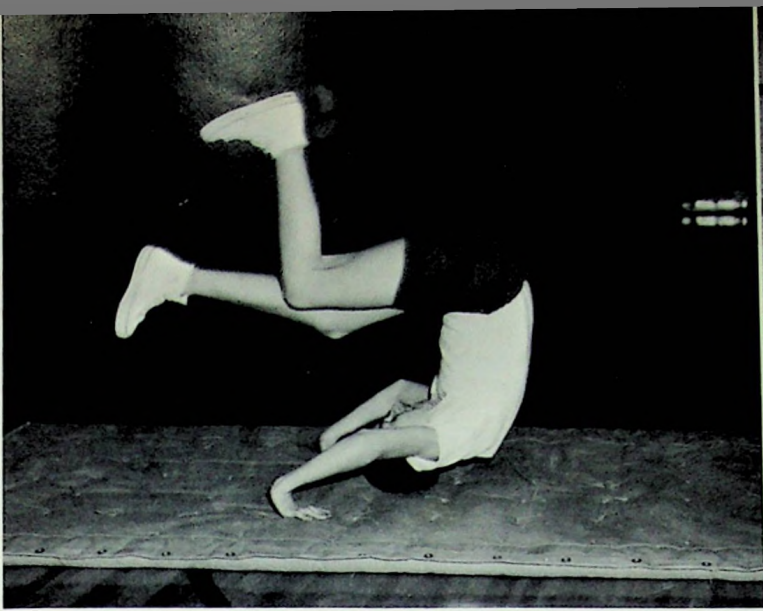

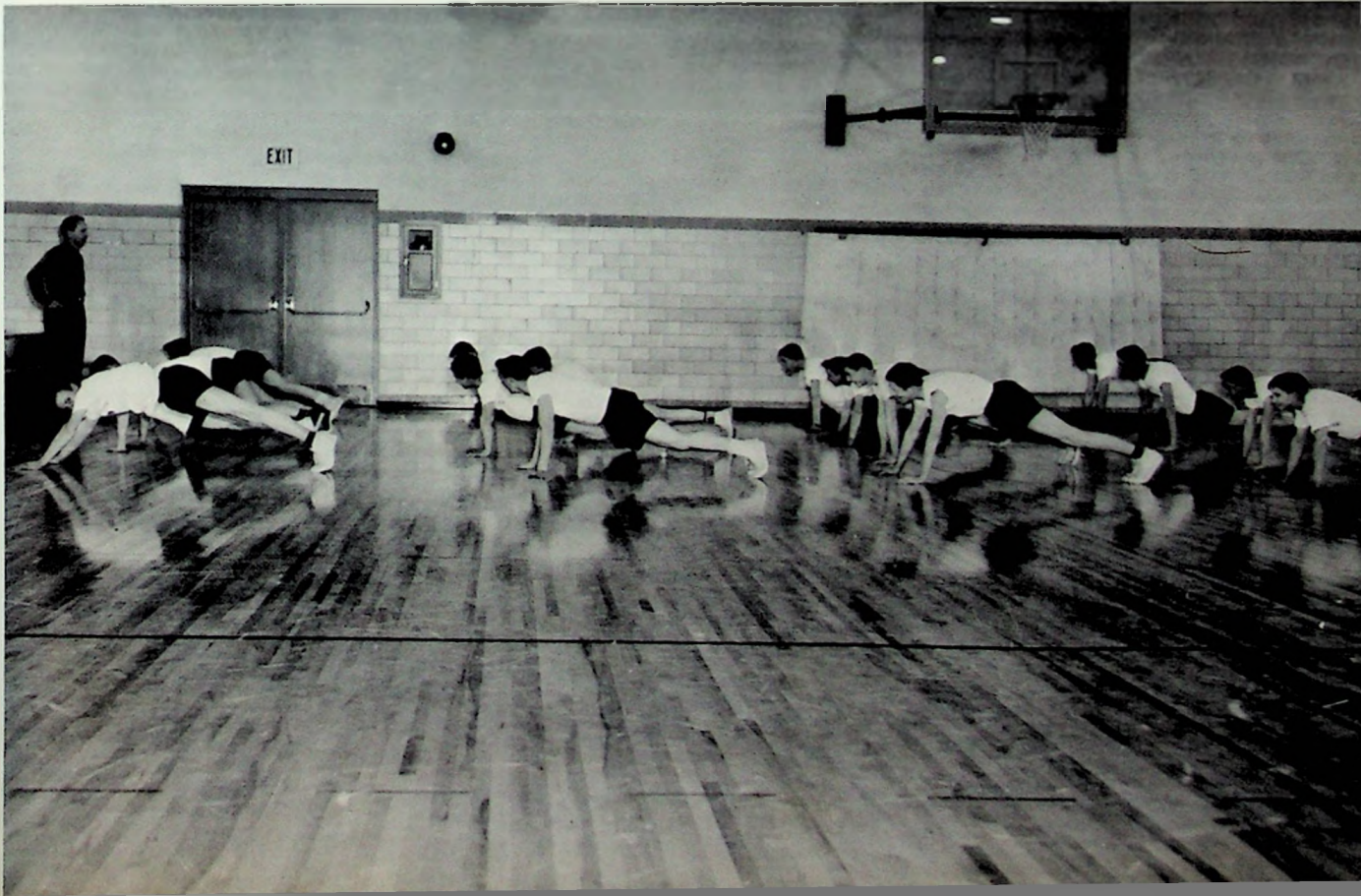
