Out of the United States' support for the contras arose the Iran-arms, hostage-contras issue. The arms operation, headed by retired Air Force Major General Seccord and Lt. Col. Oliver North of the United States Marine Corps, involved selling weapons to Iran and using the money

Another scandal rocking 1987 involved Presidential hopeful, Gary Hart. Hart, the prime Democratic candidate for the 1988 Presidential election, challenged the Miami Herald to follow his actions. The Miami Herald obliged and by staking out Hart's Washington townhouse uncovered Hart's relationship with model, Donna Rice. Denying the relationship at first. Hart soon dropped out of the Presidential race in the heat of the scandal.

Still another scandal hit the nation, this time in the form of the "Holy Wars," or "Holy Gate" involving Jim Bakker. Bakker, head of the PTL or Praise the Lord organization was the center of the scandal dealing with his involvement in an extra-marital affair. Bakker's wife, Tammy Fae. was also scandalized for being treated for drug addiction. Consequently, Bakker resigned as leader of the PTL Club with the accusation that Jerry Falwell, another TV evangelist, conspired to take over the multi-million dollar complex. The "Holy Wars" rage on, but whatever the outcome, the scandal succeeded in giving religion a bad name.

In 1987, Congress, after much deliberation, passed the $65 \mathrm{Mile} /$ hour speed limit. While the new speed would only affect interstate rural highways, it is designed to speed up travel in the less populated areas of the West.
