It seems almost every student stayed long after three o'clock many days for a variety of extracurricular activities.



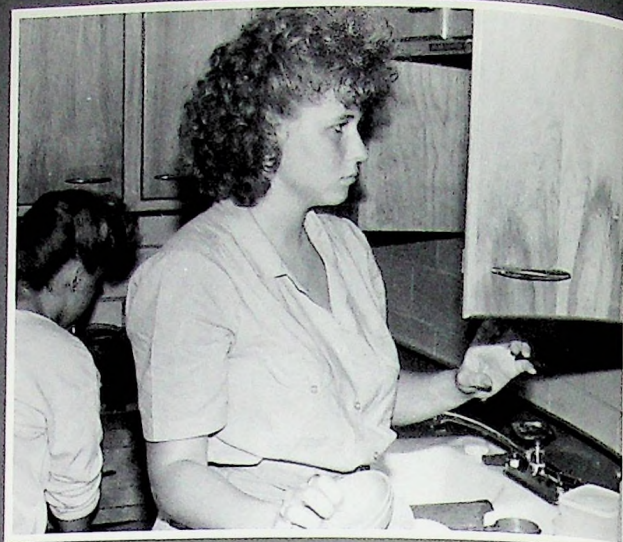
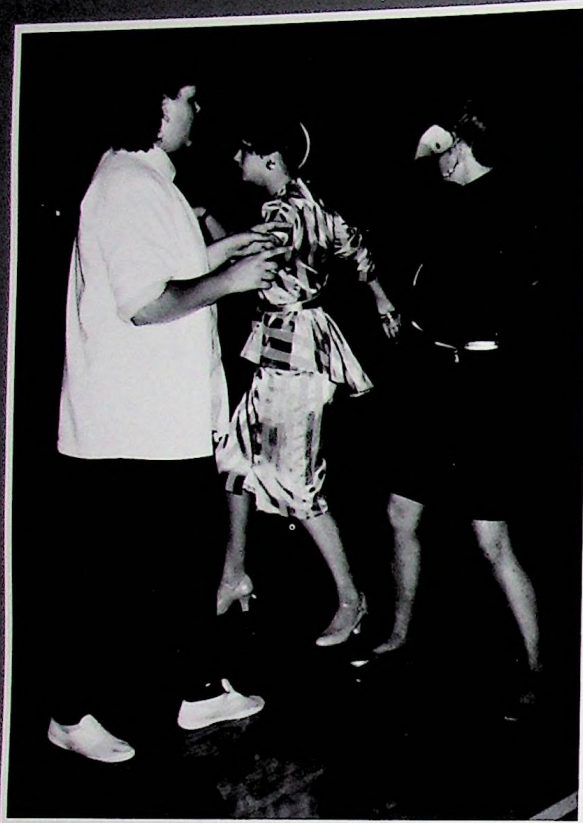
There was the yearbook staff, photography, quiz bowl, cheerleading, Spanish club, J.C.L., student council, and too many others to name.





Out of all of these, the vast majority of them kept very active throughout the year.

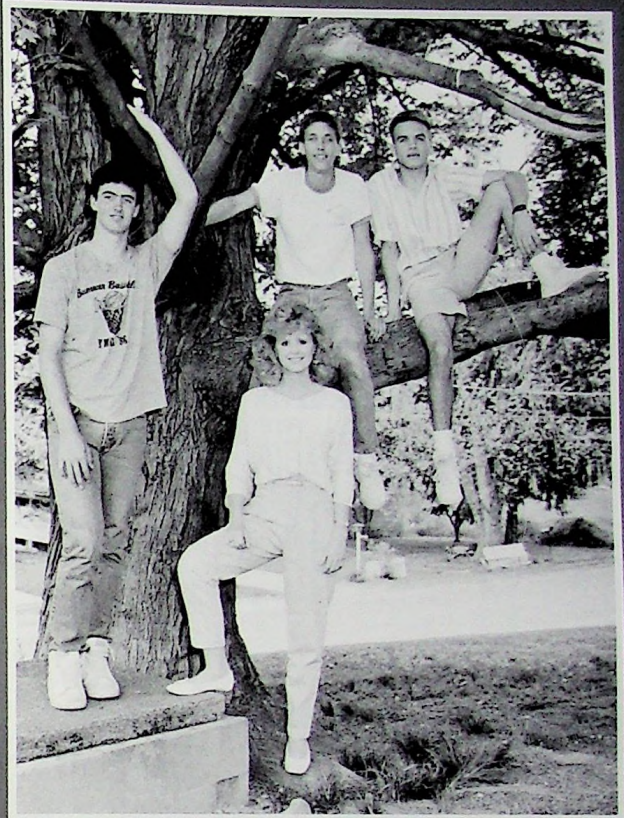
The quiz bowl team had its tournaments, many of which it had to travel to Columbus for; and the Spanish club raised funds by selling computer Valentine matches and Easter candy.

In case we sometimes forget, school is a place for learning as well as having fun with friends.



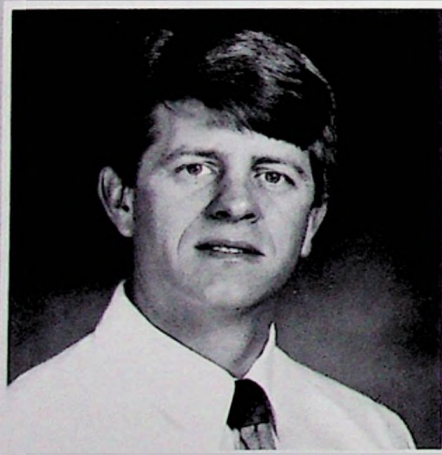

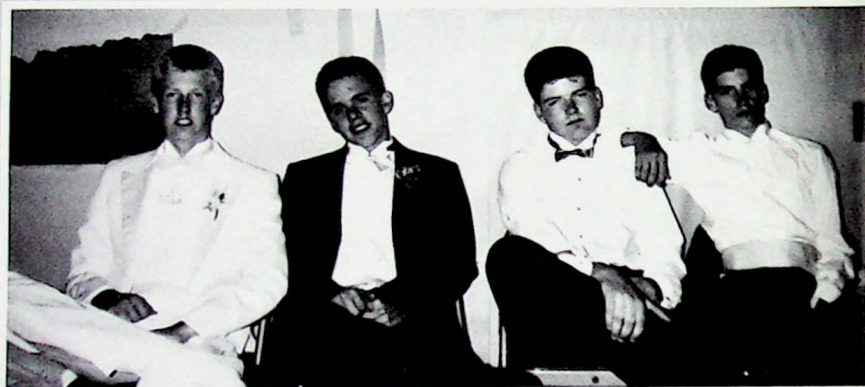

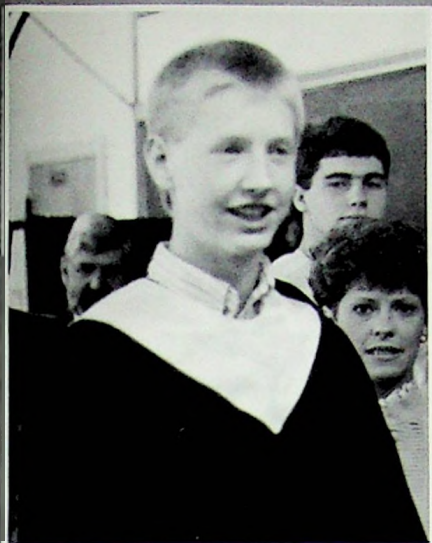
# National Honor Society

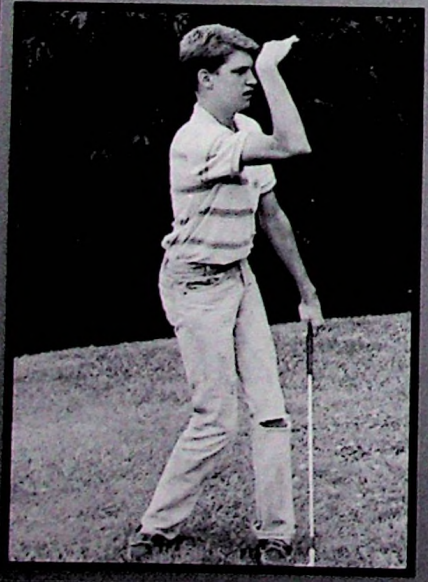

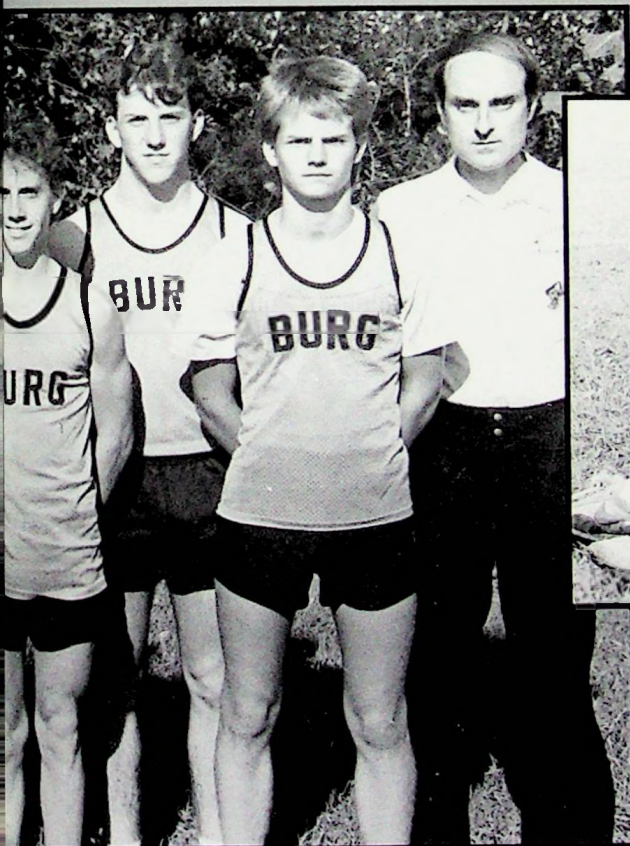
# COUNTRY

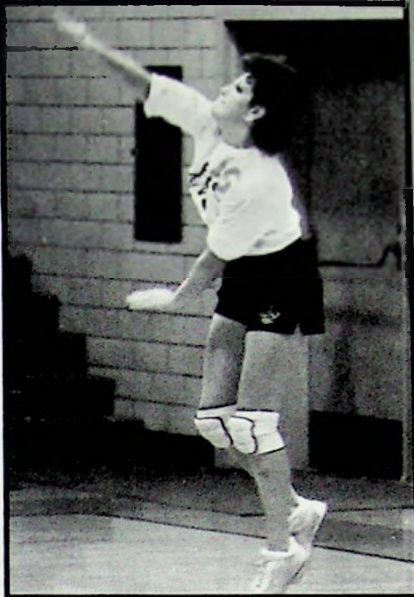
# VOLLEYBALL . . .

## NEW COACH BRINGS A NEW GAME

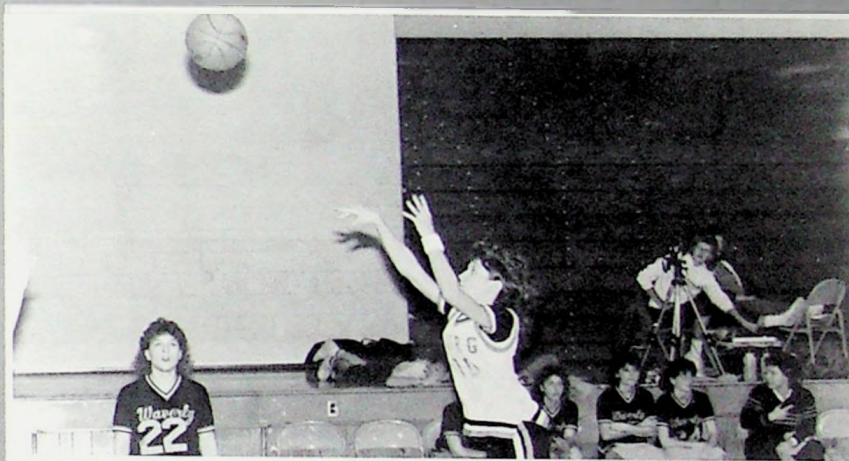

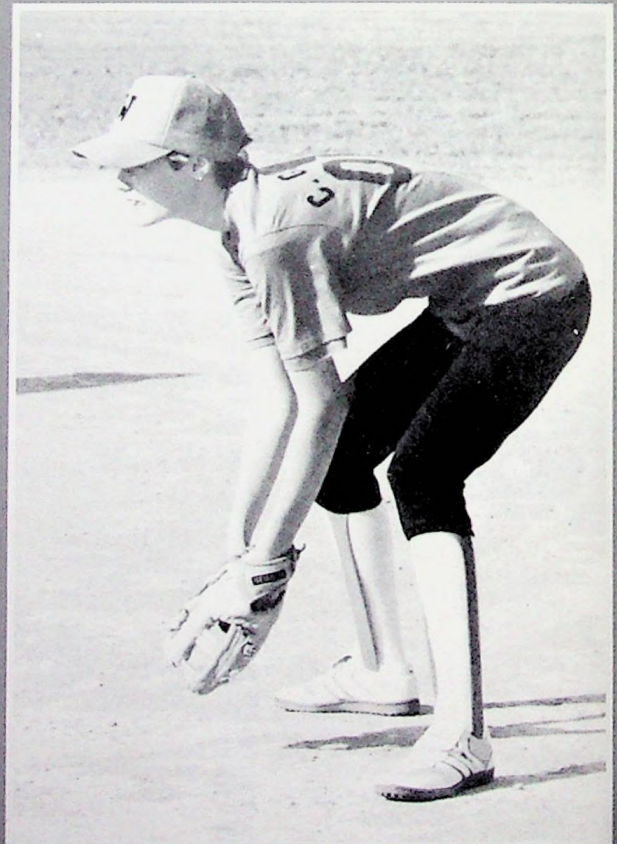


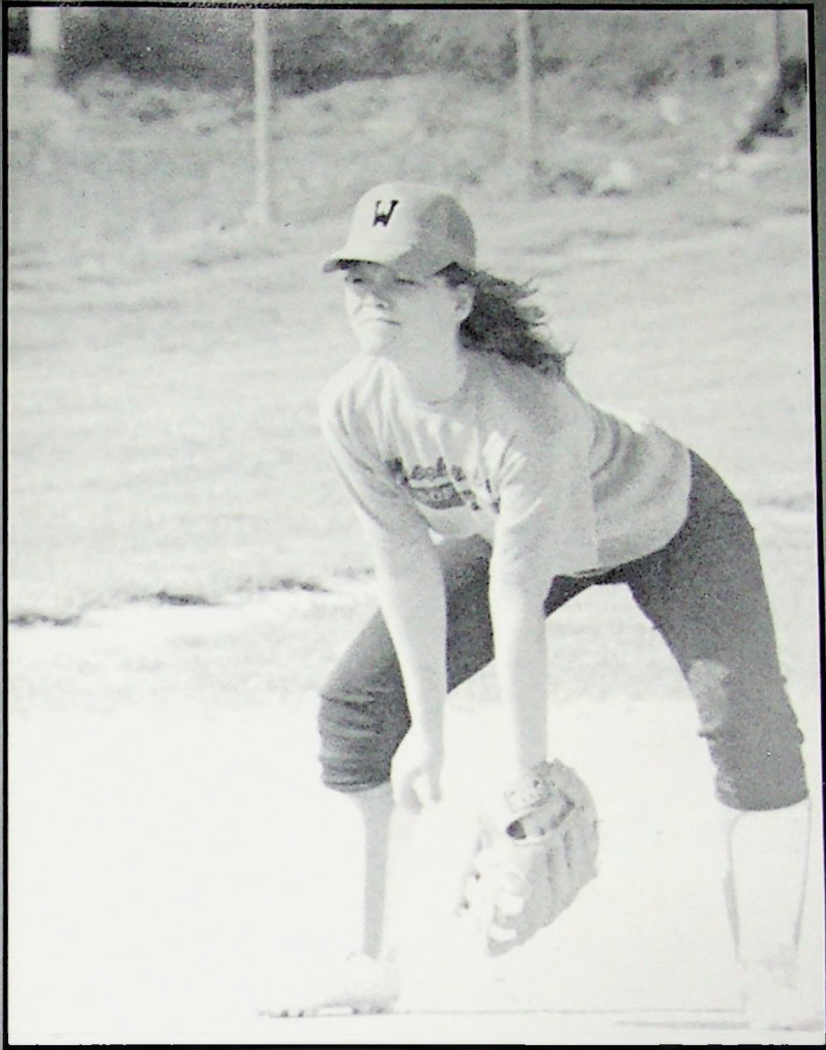


## GAINING EXPERIENCE

Still another scandal hit the nation, this time in the form of the "Holy Wars," or "Holy Gate" involving Jim Bakker. Bakker, head of the PTL or Praise the Lord organization was the center of the scandal dealing with his involvement in an extra-marital affair. Bakker's wife, Tammy Fae, was also scandalized for being treated for drug addiction. Consequently, Bakker resigned as leader of the PTL Club with the accusation that Jerry Falwell, another TV evangelist, conspired to take over the multi-million dollar complex. The "Holy Wars" rage on, but whatever the outcome, the scandal succeeded in giving religion a bad name.

In 1987, Congress, after much deliberation, passed the 65 Mile/hour speed limit. While the new speed would only affect interstate rural highways, it is designed to speed up travel in the less populated areas of the West.
