
Mangus Hald was this year's foreign exchange student.



leadership, and service.





Distributive Education is a cooperative training program for those students interested in employment in a wholesale, retail, or service establishment.





A NEW DIMENSION


Our work in PHS Office Practice Class stresses the role of today's American woman, whose contribution to Twentieth Century democratic living represents a new dimension in individual fulfillment and responsibility. Today, some 28 million women serve in our

American workforce, and the electric typewriter is as potent as the electric dishwasher.

In the Secretarial Practice Class at PHS, we seek to develop skills which will be useful for initial employment. These include taking dictation, transcribing from shorthand notes and from voice machines, operating desk calculators, filing, and using the telephone properly.

Cooperative Office Education

Cooperative Office Education class places emphasis on jobs and the importance of preparing students for employment now while they are still in school. COE believes this emphasis helps to give more meaning to the student training program with its flexibility of integrating classroom and office employment. Students attend school four periods a day for classroom instruction and are on the job for training during the afternoon.

The COE program of study includes: office procedures, office machines, business correspondence, filing, data processing, and advanced shorthand and transcription. This year's activities included: the Tom Wat sale of Christmas gifts, the COE Regional Convention with election of Cheryl Weaver as treasurer of Region 5 (30 schools and 400 students). COE students attended and participated in Regional Leadership Conference, State Convention, Employer-Employee Dinner, Thanksgiving and Christmas projects, an overnight trip, and field trips to Data Processing Centers.


After another Blue Devil touchdown, Portsmouth held onto the ball for the remaining seconds to end the game victoriously 22-20.


Regardless of the loss, the Trojans outplayed the Tigers in first downs, yards gained—both passing and rushing, and outstanding defensive plays. Penalties,

TROJANS TRAMPLE LOGAN—21-6 MUNICIPAL STADIUM SEPTEMBER 19, 1969


The Trojans, through "real team effort" defeated Logan, West Virginia, 21-6. The mighty Trojans played a superb game, both offensively and defensively.

Half-time festivities resulted in the crowning of vivacious Monica Glynn as Homecoming queen. Members of her court were Terri Morgan, Mary Carol Horton, and Cindy Myers. Third quarter action was unexciting, but the fourth quarter resulted in the second touchdown by the Cavaliers with only 1:10 left in the game. Junior J. B. Marshall earned "lineman of the week" honors while substitute quarterback Fred Myers was named "back."

TROJANS TAKE COME-FROM-BEHIND VICTORY OVER ASHLAND—15-8 ASHLAND OCTOBER 10, 1969

"It was a real fine team effort" stated a happy Coach Benhase and truly it was, especially by the Trojan defense who held Ashland on many tough plays.

Ashland's one and only touchdown came in the first quarter after a fumble by Trojan fullback Jim Harley. The powerful Trojan defense then rallied to hold the Tomcats scoreless in the final three quarters. A tight play came with 10:46 left in the game, when on a fourth and four situation, the Tomcats went for the first down. But Junior defensive end J. B. 



A cold and wintry October afternoon set the scene for the Lima-Portsmouth game. The Trojans, playing before no more than fifty Trojan fans in an unfamiliar afternoon game, were defeated by the Spartans 27-13.

Although the Trojans lost the match, two Portsmouth records were broken in the game. Co-captain Sam Mc-Graw, a superior guard and linebacker, racked up 11 tackles in the game, giving him 102, breaking Dave Chapman's 100 set in 1966. The other record was broken by split end Glen Kizer. He equaled the pass reception record of 16 set by Tom Cook in 1968 and then went on to make a new one of 17 receptions.

Kizer received "lineman of the week" honors for his performance in the game. "Back of the week" went to Jeff Turner, who made 8 unassisted tackles in the game. Turner, at 5'8" and 135 pounds, proved that you don't have to be a 200 pound monster to play high school football.

TROJANS BATTLE TO 6-6 TIE AGAINST BLUE DEVILS MUNICIPAL STADIUM OCTOBER 31, 1969

The scoreboard read 6-6, but statistically, the Trojans were victorious all the way. On first downs, the Trojans racked up 21 first downs compared to only 9 by the Blue Devils. Co-captain Sam McGraw was a real wonder throughout the game. From his new wingback position he gained 115 yards in six runs, in addition to numerous tackles on defense. He did return to his guard position long enough to lead Junior workhorse Jim Harley into the end zone for the final touchdown. The other two touchdowns were made by Fred Myers and Larry Moore.



Seniors Tony Webb, with 16 points, and John Davis,














PHS Spanish Club


A highlight of the Hi-Y program is the annual Youth



Voice of Democracy Contest


