the evening.

a little after dark  
I have spent  
the day reading  
the new papers  
and other books.

Nov. 3.

A cool day.  
We worked at  
the crib all day.  
I went down  
to the Mill after  
mail.

Went to all three  
stores and they  
did not get the  
nails I wanted.  
Effie is here  
making Battie's  
dress.

Smith has  
agreed to build  
the ferry across  
the wood.

Nov. 4

Chilly.  
Nice day for  
fiction today.  
He began to  
cover the cribs  
today.

Squire & I  
went down  
in the evening  
to the lecture  
Brought Mr.

Chappin's ex-  
press to go to  
town with to  
morning.

Nov. 5:

A nice day.  
A heavy frost.  
Pa & I, Squire &  
Mr. Call went  
down to town

in Aunt R's.  
He are all a long  
to night Pa & Ma  
-up there

Nov. 18:

A nice day  
Tharm. Raining  
this evening.  
The shucked  
corn all day.  
Pa came back  
from Aunt R's  
& he is better.  
He went back  
up there this  
evening. I took  
Lillian with him  
and left her  
ma up there.  
Harry & Oscar  
is here to night  
Smith & his place

Nov. 16.

A damp day  
Rained during  
the day  
Ma & Lillie in

We have been  
at home all day  
Required barrow

afternoon.

Nov. 17.

A very warm  
day for the time

to rain in the

afternoon.

We have been  
fixing brush for  
The creek is bank  
full. Matt took

Aunt Rens and

back yet  
Smith & Jenni got  
our supper & I strain  
the milk away.

Nov. 18.

A nice day.  
Colder than yesterday.  
He worked at  
fence, nailed on  
roof and got out  
board timber.

Mattie did not  
get back till  
Gene had dinner  
ready.

Smith & Jennie  
got up this morn-  
ing and got out  
breakfast.

The first time  
we ever was left  
alone over night.

Nov. 19,

A nice day. Cool.  
He has worked at  
a little of every thing.  
Bolted up boards  
cutting, fixed a chick  
nest, scraped,  
fixed fence,  
worked at the pump,  
gravelled the front  
bank, and shuc-  
corn.

He are ready to  
move the press  
over to the stacks  
in the bottom.

I looked over my  
books keeping set

Nov. 20.

A nice day,  
Big frost.  
He started our  
press across the  
creek and got  
stalled right in  
the creek. He got  
3 yoke of cattle  
from Mr. Chaffin  
and pulled it  
out.

We got to pressing  
before noon  
Got to bailing out  
down a gully  
I wd for in the  
afternoon.

Nov. 21

A nice day  
Heavy frost  
He pressed all  
day on the but  
of a stack  
Ben's stayed at  
home and helped  
us Pa went in  
to hunt Reuss  
and down to  
the hill.

He took some  
wheat down  
and got it ground  
It is warm  
this evening.

Nov. 22.

A nice day,  
cool. The horse  
hay all day.  
The resty Genie  
to mill with  
the cratly.  
Ma & Billie  
came back with  
him. They got  
back a little  
before dark.  
The hauled in  
hay after dark.

Nov. 23.

A nice day.  
cool.  
I have been  
at home all day.  
Tom Chaspen  
Charly Salter  
John Neal was  
here for dinner.  
Mr. Chappins  
was here in  
the afternoon.  
Genie & Smith  
are at church.

Nov. 24.

A nice day.  
We pushed hay  
all day.  
Mr. Homer was  
here on a track.  
Uncle Jack  
came down  
for a shunt.  
We hauled in  
the back of  
dark.

Nov. 23:

A nice day.  
Smith & I got  
up at one o'clock  
to get Pa's team  
ready to go to  
town. We greased  
the buggy - kitcher  
the tipples and  
got the team  
ready.  
We should eat a  
right good breakfast  
and then  
went to head  
got up and then  
got rope cuttings from

Mr. Chaffin  
set out a bu.  
and a half of  
onions pulled  
the turnips  
and then went  
up and placed  
the bails of  
hay,

Nov. 26  
A nice day.  
Cool.  
The pressed hay  
all day and  
hauled it in  
after dark.  
Mr. Smith said  
it was a night  
shift.

Nov. 27,

A cold day,  
Froze last night  
a little.

Snowed a  
little all day  
but not near  
as hard as last  
Thanksgiving.

The spirit thin, thank  
given, quite differ-  
ent from a year

Last Thanksgiving  
we were over to  
Bro. Demore. This  
Thanksgiving we  
passed hay hauled  
it in and moved the

A cold frosty  
morning. Froze  
The coldest morn-  
ing we have had  
The butchered  
three hogs and  
one of grapes  
Packed hay  
after dinner



Nov 29

A heavy frost  
froze, chilly  
all day.  
We went out  
early at the  
hay press.

Hauled in in  
the afternoon  
mould the  
press and  
gathered up  
the damaged  
hay. Jack  
Bennett came  
down and got  
a couple of chickens.

Nov 30

A blunder done  
blessed cow  
in the morning  
Smith & I had  
hours running  
sheep. The dog  
up and went  
out and found  
a couple of hours  
on a sheep  
I shot one of  
them but did  
not kill him  
He hunted around  
for then the most
