



Office Education

CLERICAL OCCUPATIONS WILL CONTINUE TO PROVIDE MANY JOB OPPORTUNITIES

MISS ALBERTA WITTENBURG-Co-Ordinator

Co-operative office education with its "flexibility of the principle of integrating theoretical study and practical employment" is adaptable to individual conditions at different schools. Its program varies from school to school, from city to city.

At Portsmouth High, COE on-the-job work experience is given by the Portsmouth employers who co-operate with the school in a training course to prepare youths for careers in the business office. These students attend school four periods a day for classroom instruction and are on the job for training during the afternoon.

By co-ordinating work experience with the classroom program, theory and practice are more closely integrated, and students find greater meaning in their studies. Miss Alberta Wittenburg is the teacher-co-ordinator.



Co-operative education helps markedly to orient students to the world of work . . . they have opportunities for exploring their own abilities in connection with real jobs and have a chance to test their own aptitudes more fully than is normally possible.

For many students, work experience contributes to a greater sense of responsibility for their own efforts, greater dependence on their own judgments and their understanding of other people.

Students find that a retailing career is exciting as they serve as trainees gaining experience and training by working a sales job part-time while still in school. A successful salesman is one who is prepared for his career through study, training, and experience.

TRADE AND INDUSTRIAL EDUCATION O. M. GWINN, Vocational Supervisor


Vocational education prepares boys to enter trades and industrial occupations. Three hours each day are spent in the "shop" of the student's choice where the correct use of hand and machine tools are taught. The work performed in the shop must be on a useful basis under actual job conditions so far as possible. Students are given individual attention rather than group instruction in their shop training.

Approximately thirty percent of the student's time in school each day is devoted to the study of trade technology which includes shop mathematics, science, blueprint reading, sketching and trade information. These subjects differ from general subjects in that they are designed to apply directly to the chosen trade.

Your future is strictly up to you. As a citizen of free, dynamic, ever-progressing America, your opportunities will be limited only by your vision of what your future may become, your abilities and how you use them, your character and your determination.







The Trojans finally broke a victory famine that lasted through six weeks by putting down a fighting McKell football team 24-14.



Trojan Basketball Record 1961-1962 Season

TROJANS NOSED OUT IN OPENER 66-62

All in all, the Trojans showed plenty of spirit. They were handed their defeat at the foul line where the Panthers tallied 20 out of 35.

NORTHWEST WINNER OVER PORTSMOUTH 74-72




