
Mr. McCowen said in a statement to us:








We would like to give a special salute to the cooks, bus drivers, and custodians of our school.

After nine months of this work the last pages were finished and the last deadline met. Now our hope is that you will enjoy reading this yearbook as much as we have enjoyed putting it together.






The library staff learns through experience how to read shelves, categorize books, take inventory, and how to help students select and find the book they wish to read.

There was a trip to Cincinnati which was a bonus for all members.









At the February meeting the club held an indoor picnic followed by a program of "Living Portraits".


