
Mohawk Pride & Spirit










I Could Not Ask For More




Hanging Out




Student Interests


American Literature and Appalachian Studies.




It All Adds Up







Life and Fitness


In this class students learn about dating, marriage and family, just to name a few. Students get to feel what it is like to prepare for weddings and care for a child.


John Ward, an intern at the elementary said, "I absolutely loved Internship class. I became so close with all of the kindergartners in my class. I will miss them so much."








A Work of Art


