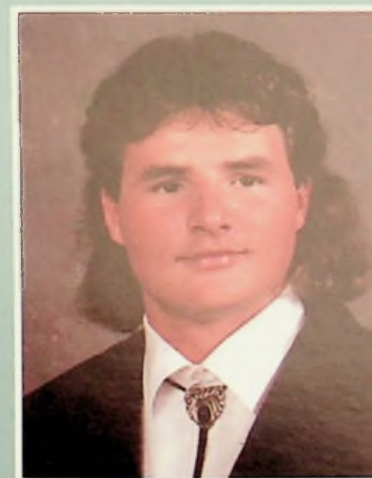

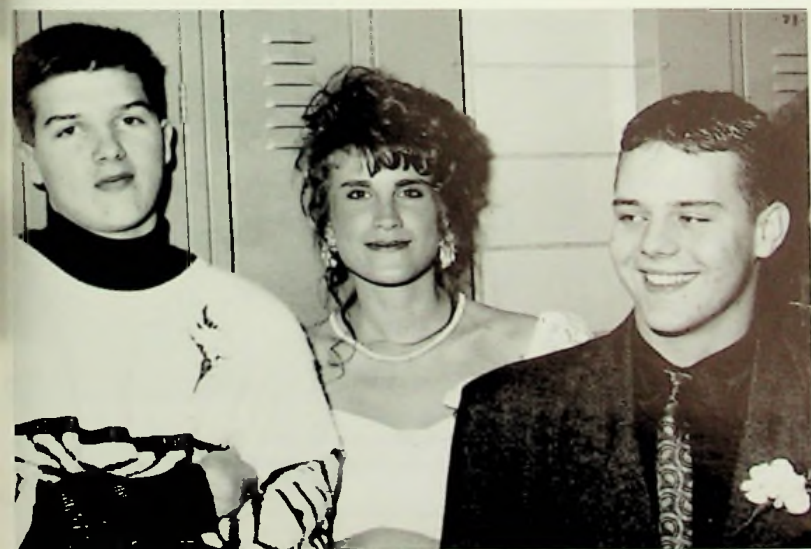

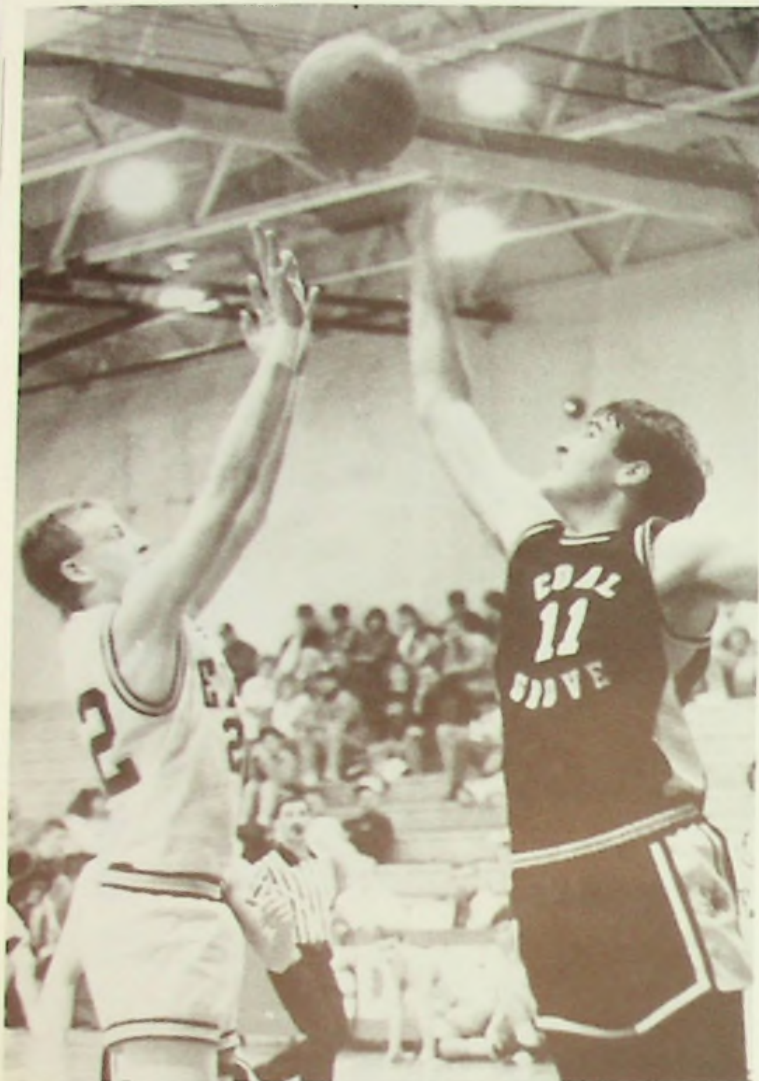

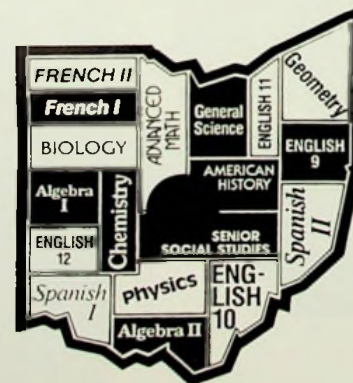

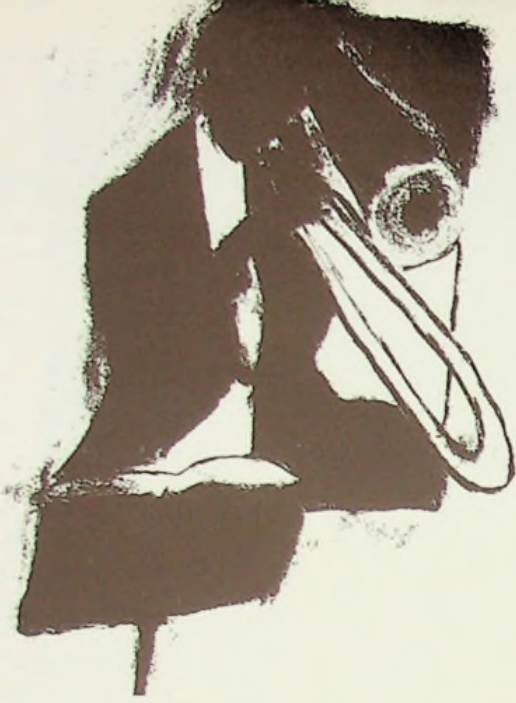

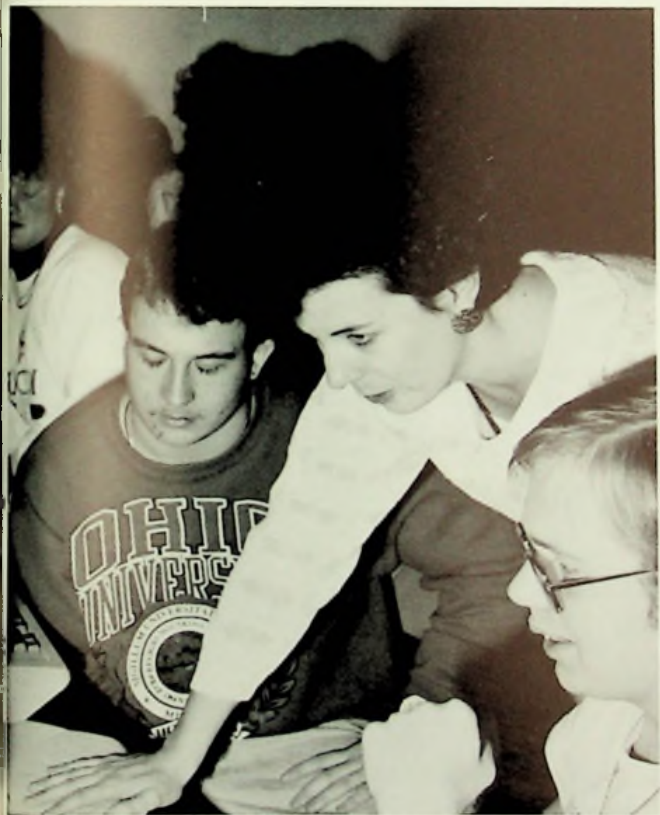

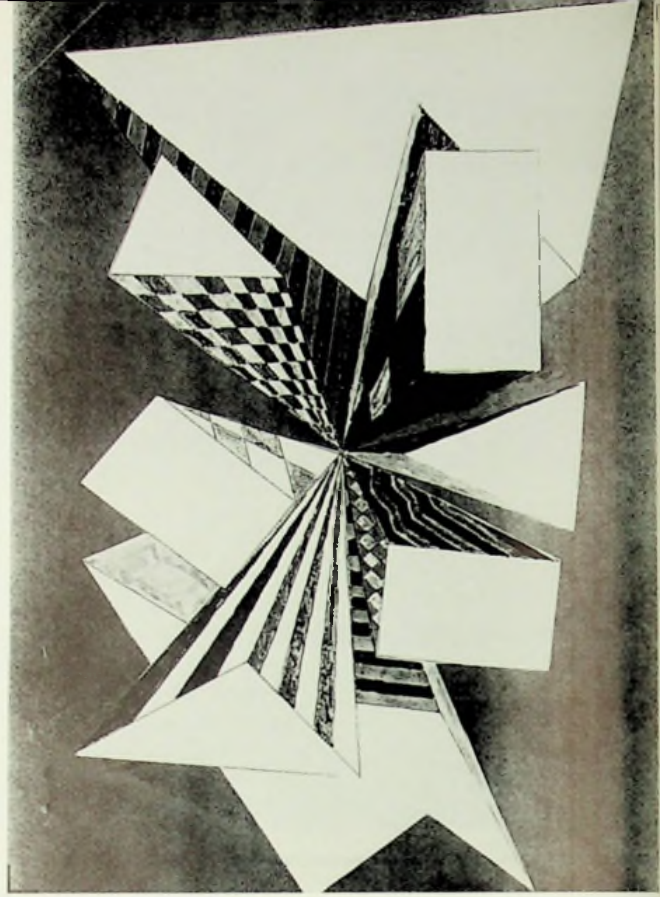
Coach Encourages 'Success'
