## Mock Trial

On February 11, the Mock Trial Competition took place at the Portsmouth Court House. The case concerned the controversial right to free speech contained in the First Amendment. Following an attack on Biotex labs, the Animal Rights Foundation (ARF) was accused of inciting the violence by posting false information concerning animal testing on their website. After months of practice and with help from Attomey Nash, the two Mock Trial teams contrived convincing arguments for both plaintiff and defense.
