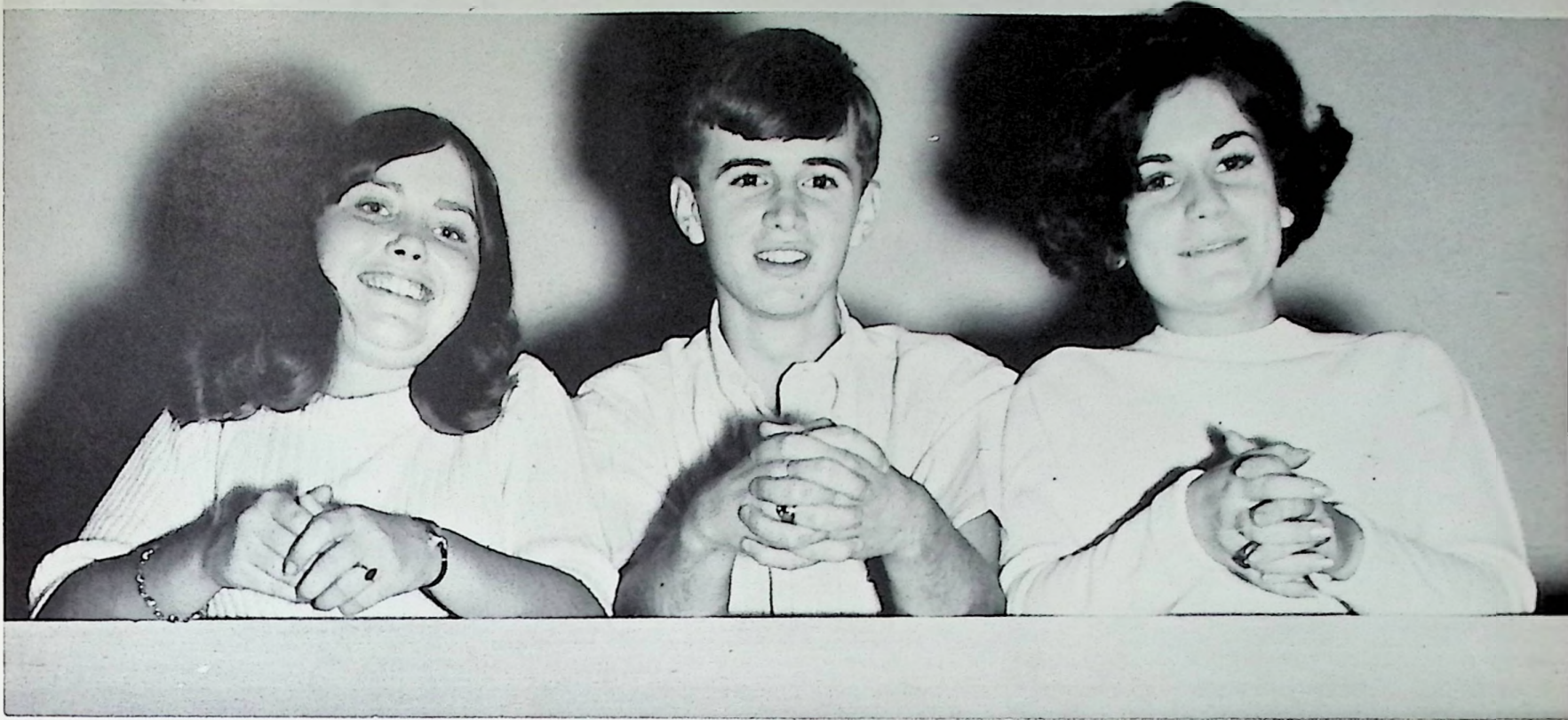

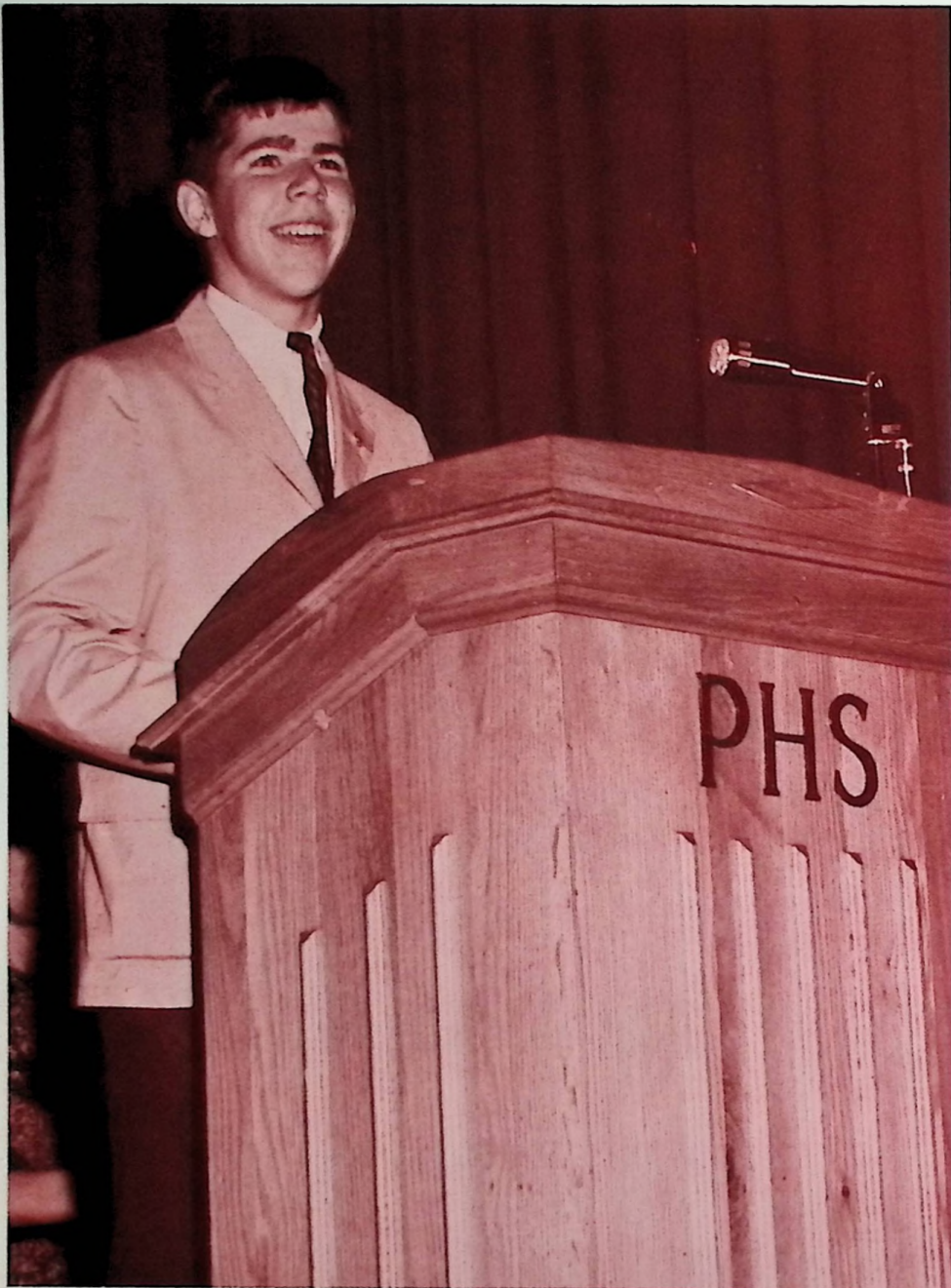

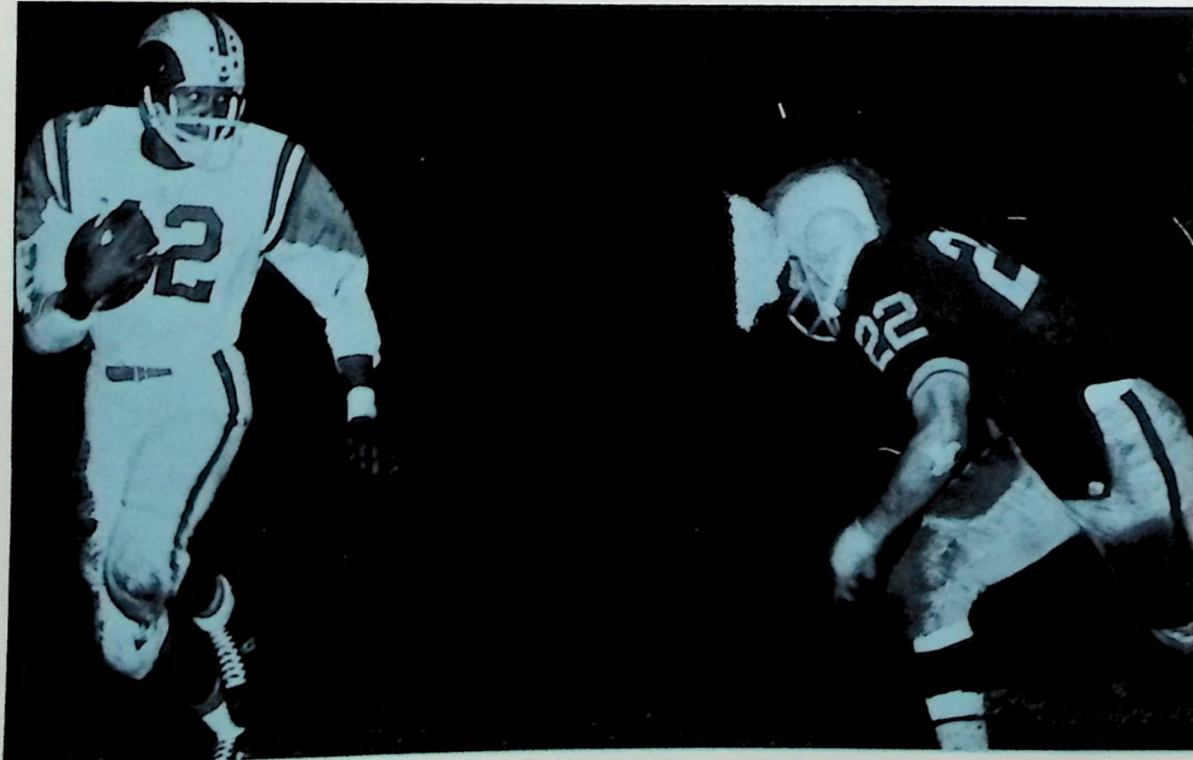

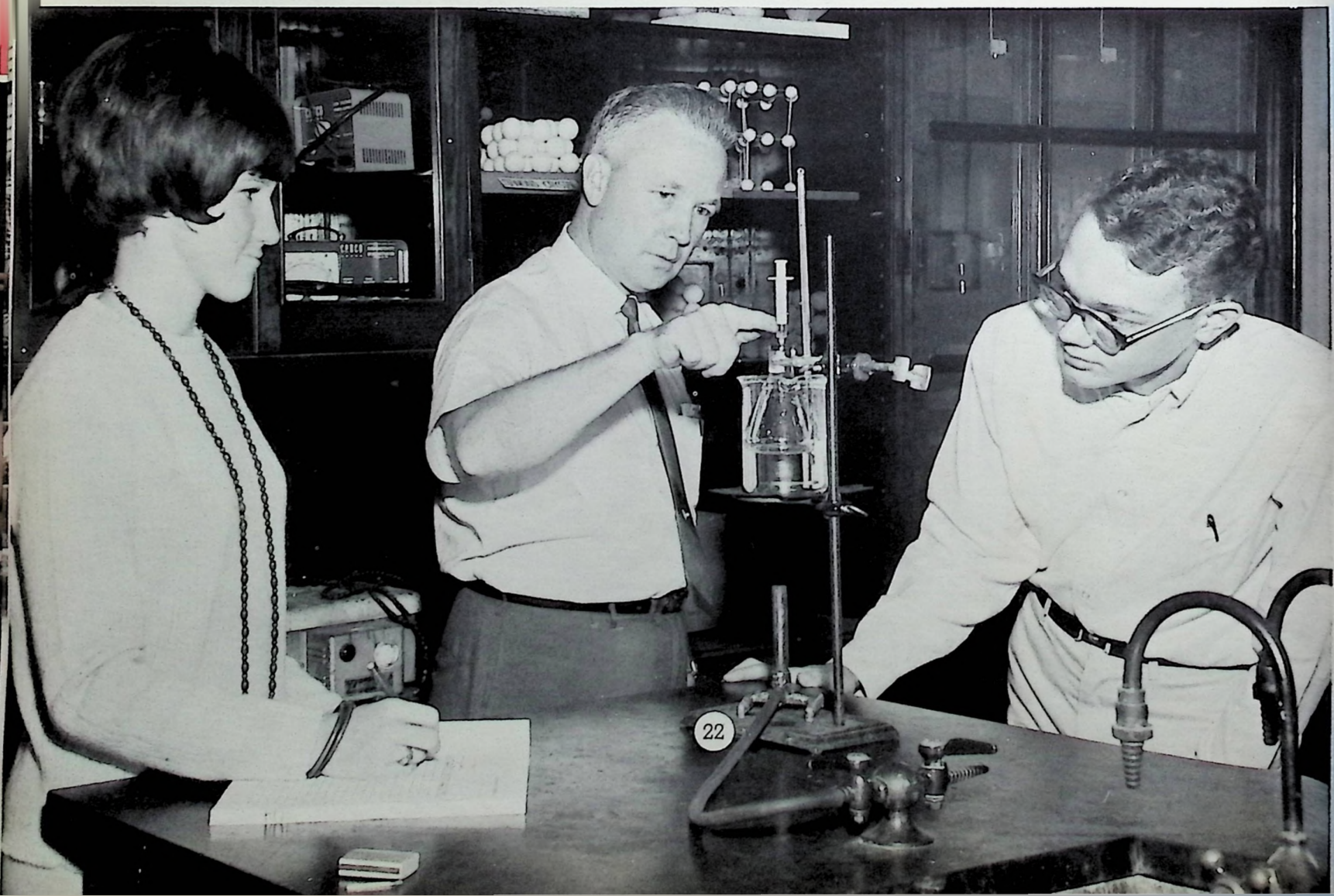

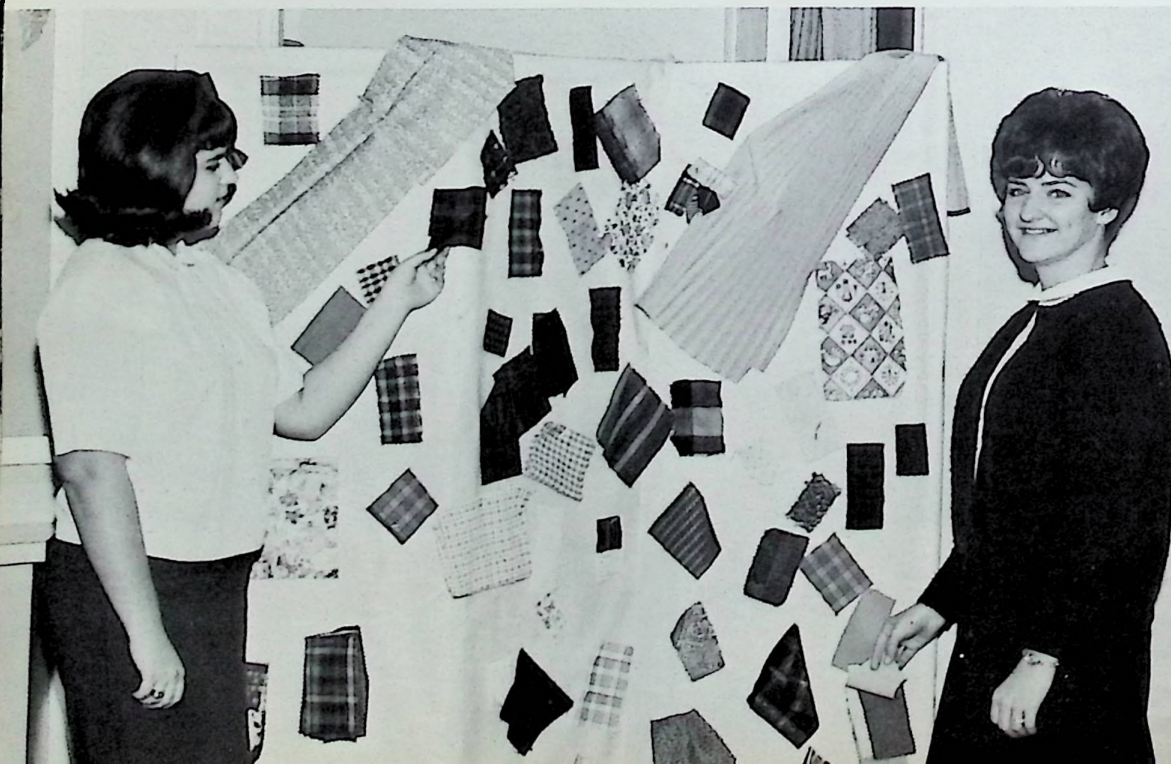

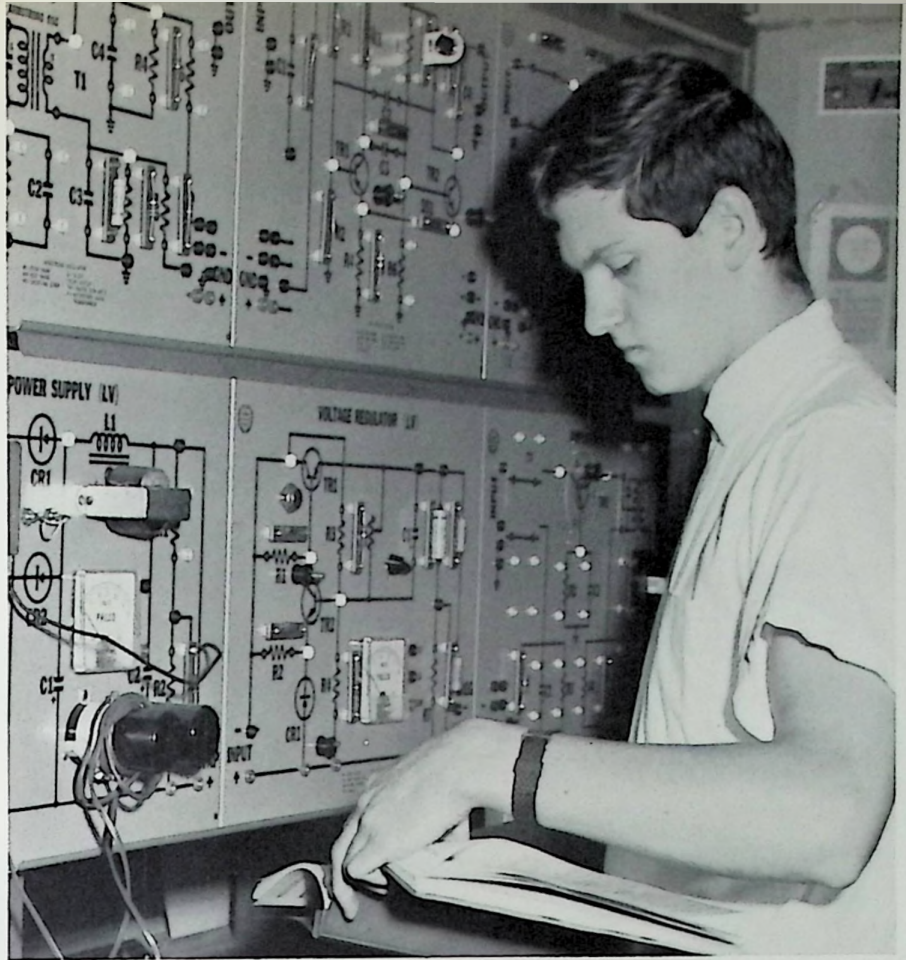

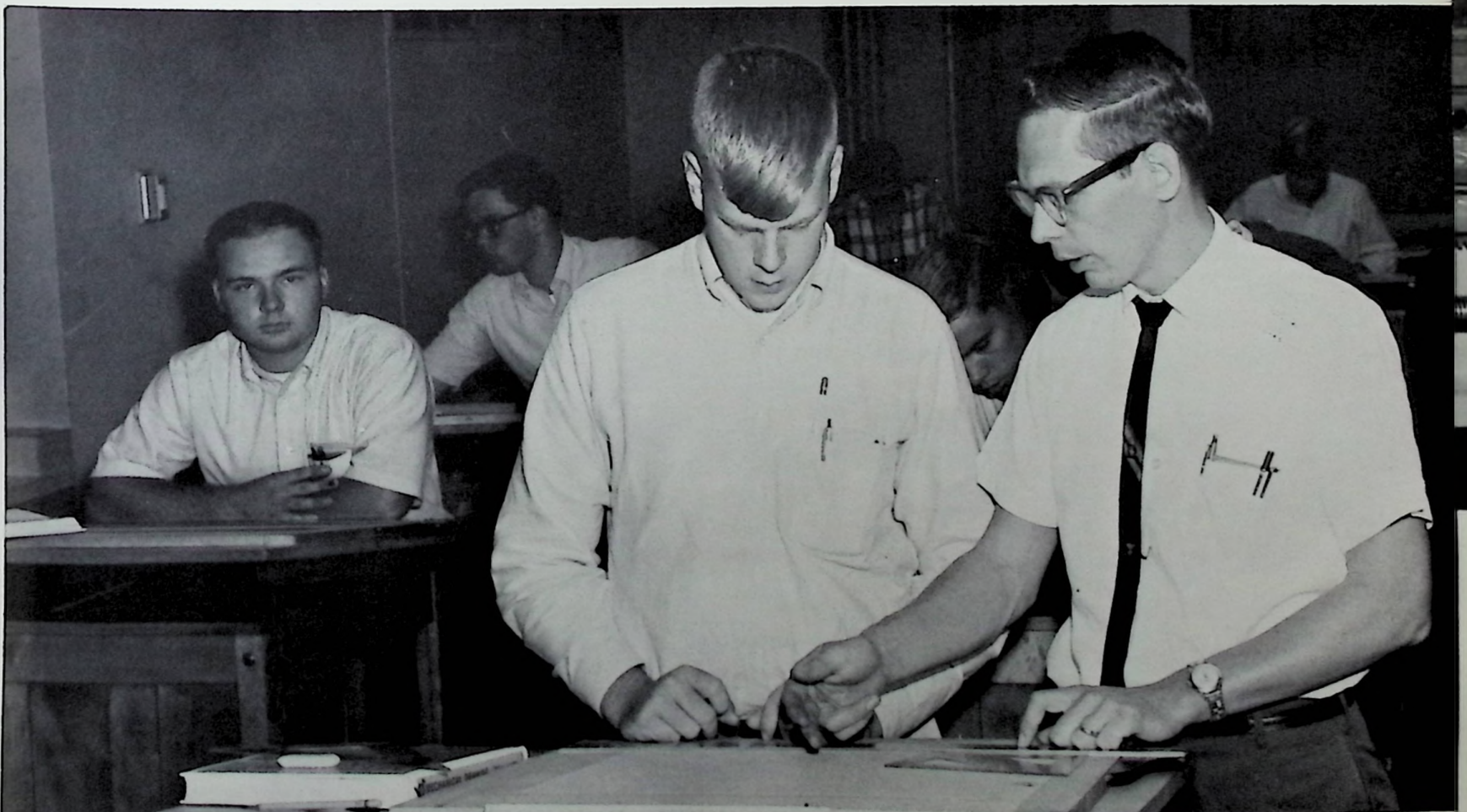
EDUCATION GEARED TO JOB GROWTH

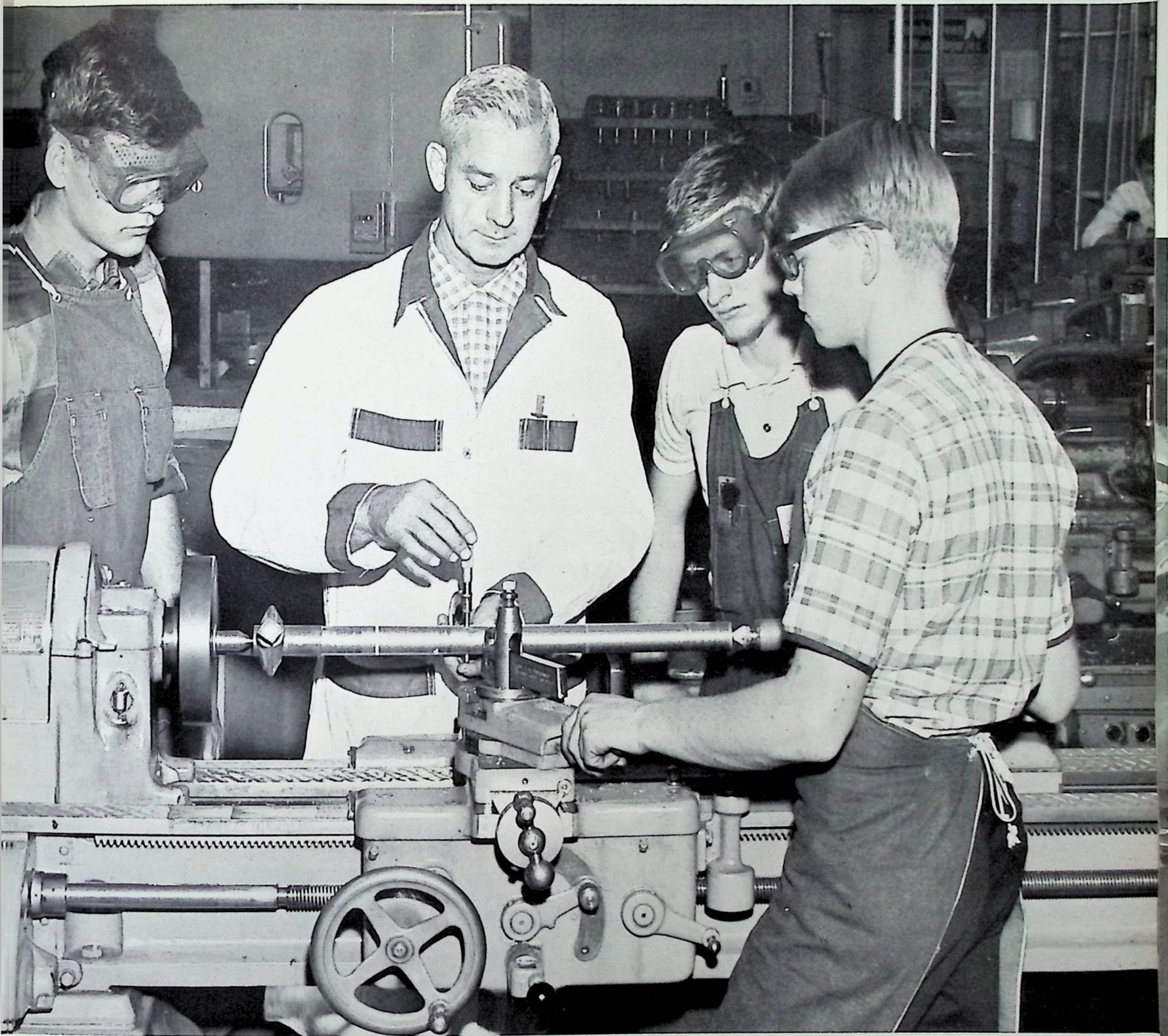

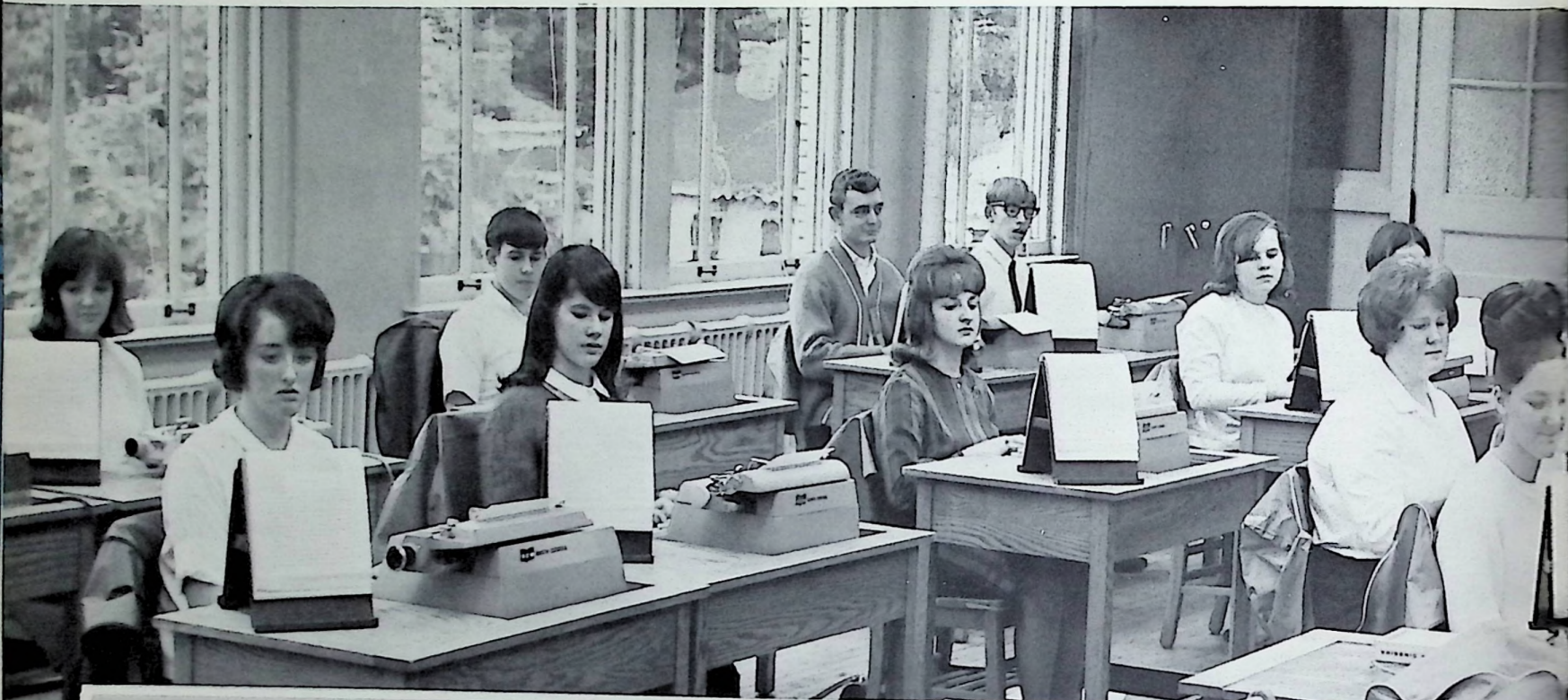


OPPORTUNITIES FOR CAREER TRAINING IN COE

COOPERATIVE OFFICE EDUCATION MRS. ALBERTA LUTHER, COORDINATOR

COE places emphasis on jobs and the importance of preparing students for employment now while they are still in school. COE believes this emphasis helps to give more meaning to the student training program with its flexibility of integrating classroom and office employment. Students attend school four periods a day for classroom instruction and are on the job for training during the afternoon.

The COE program of study includes: office procedures, office machines, business correspondence, filing, data processing, and advanced shorthand and transcription.

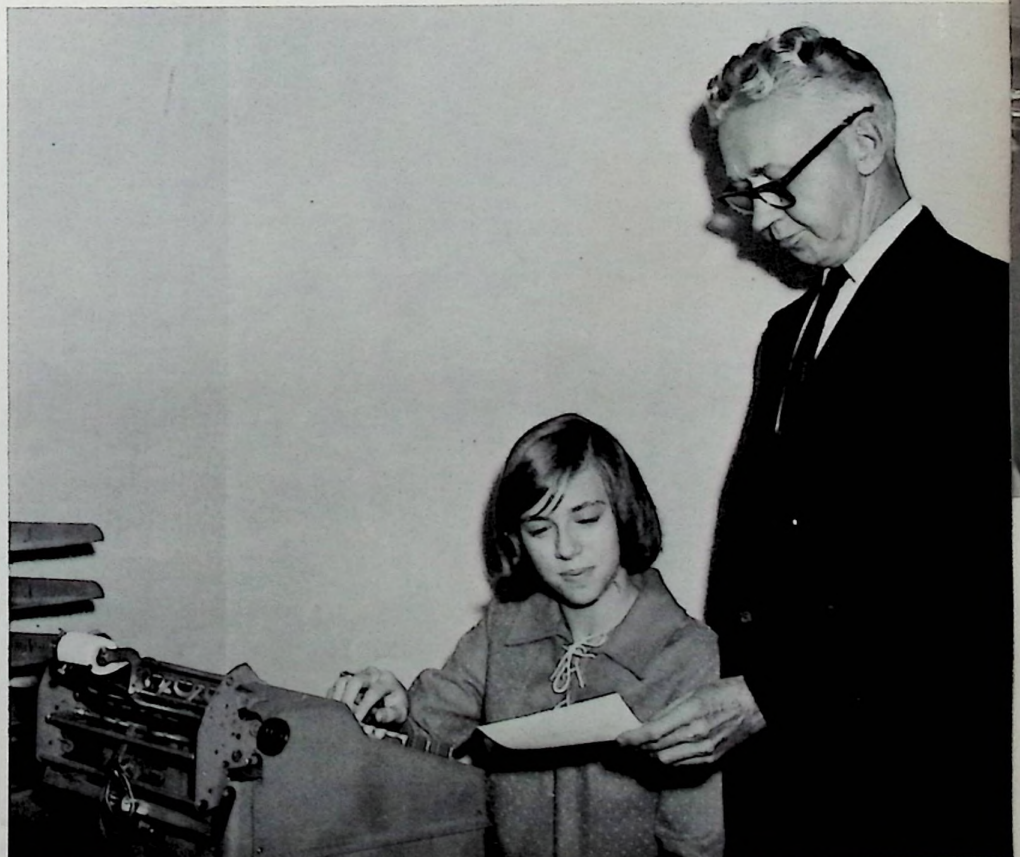

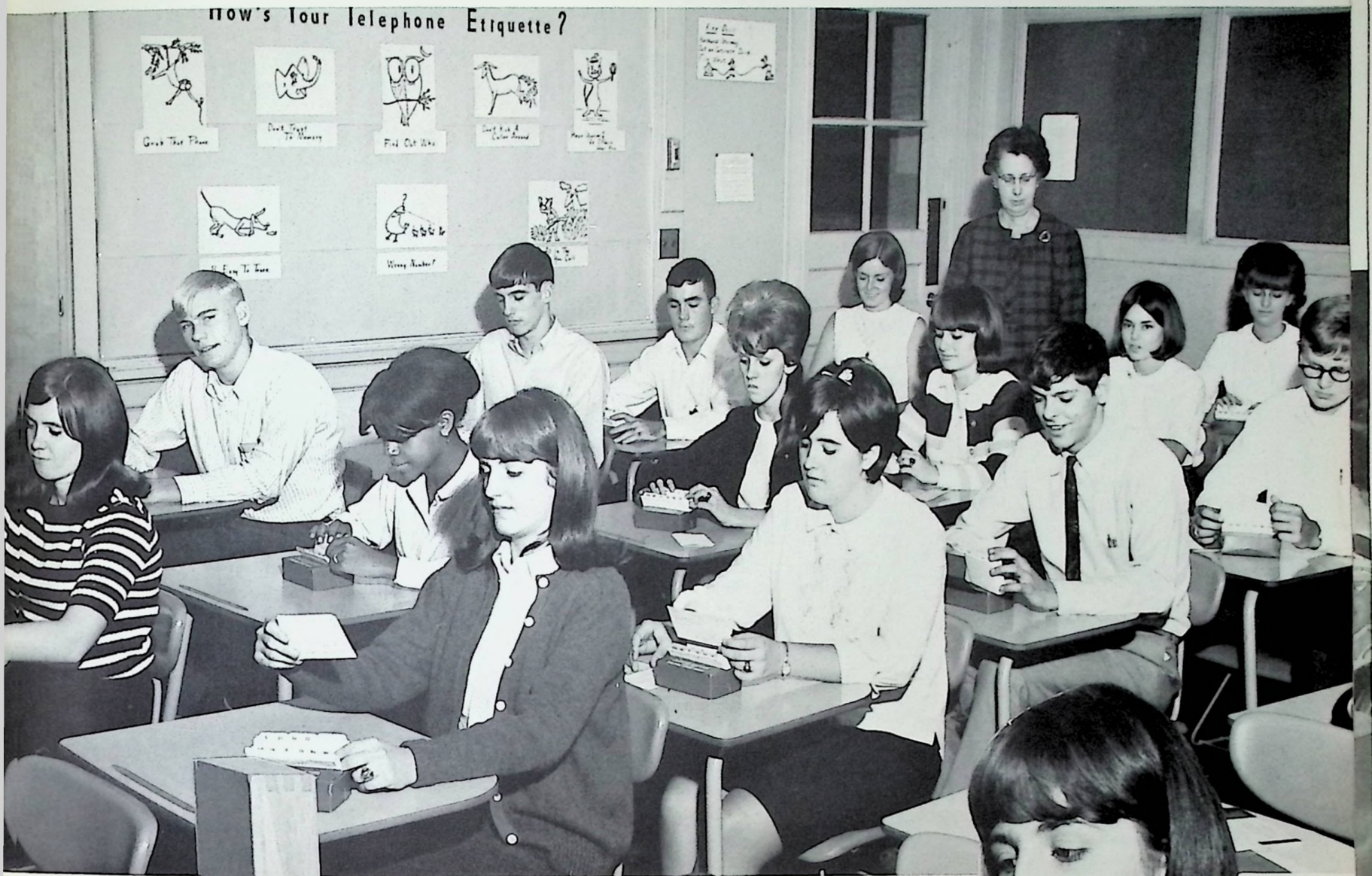

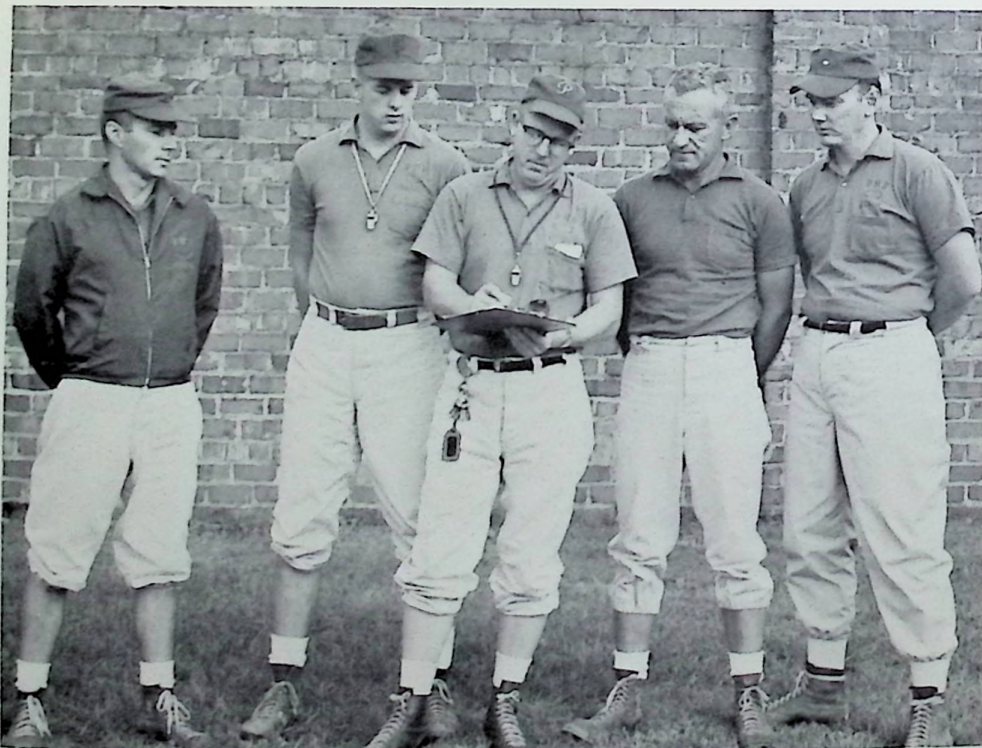

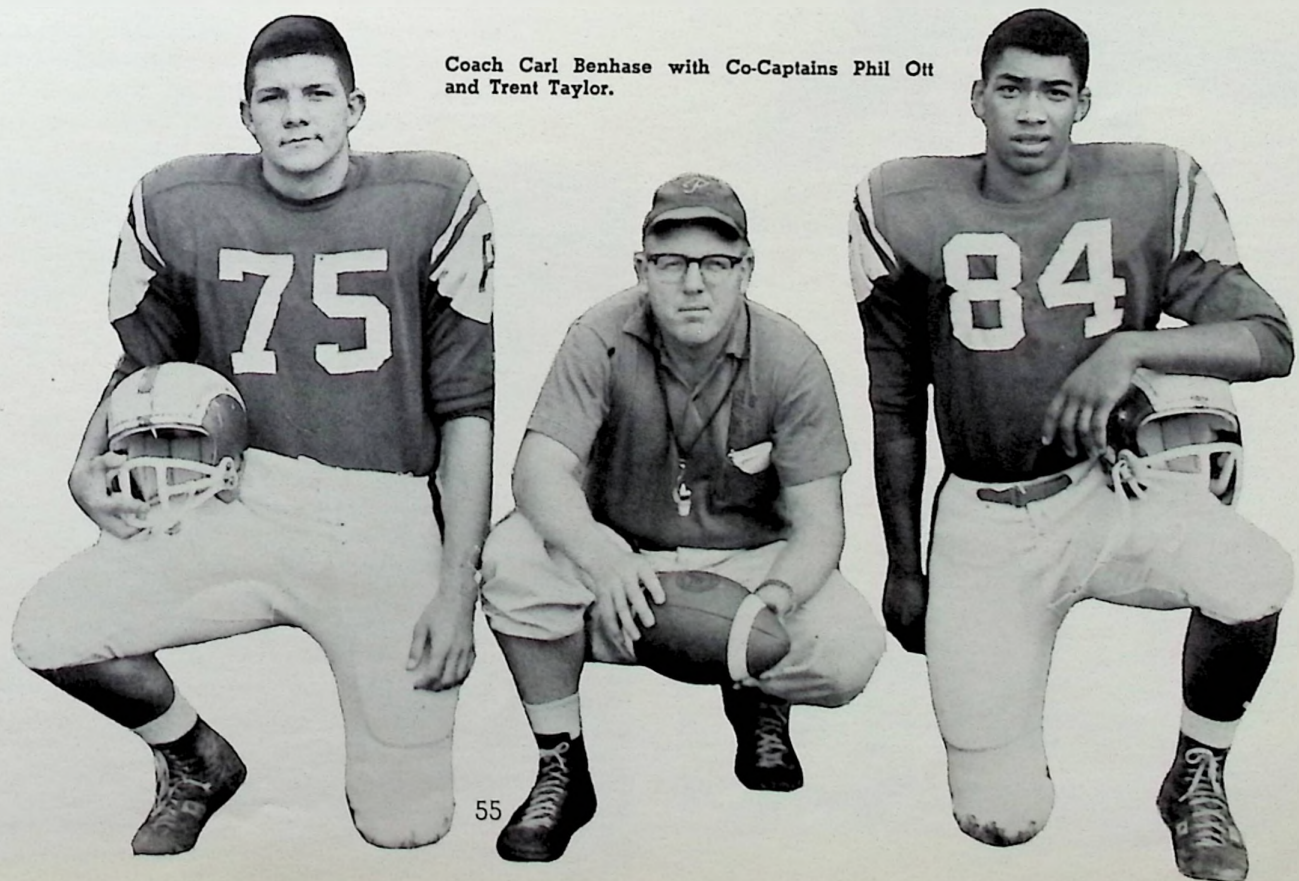

Municipal Stadium—September 9, 1966

It was a long time coming, four years in fact, before Portsmouth High School again opened a football season on a successful note. However, victory finally came on Friday, September 9th, when the Trojan warriors romped to a 39-14 victory over Cincinnati La Salle.

The Trojans, after a slow start in the first period, finally began to roll. Quarterback John Boling hit Tony Booker on a clutch third down pass that covered 18 yards to the Portsmouth 40-yard line. Rich Cunningham picked up two and Boling went untouched for 58 yards on a keeper play around the right end for the touchdown.

The Trojans dominated the game in an all-round superb performance. Earl Lewis led the scoring parade with three touchdowns followed by Booker with two and Boling with one. Phil Ott kicked for the extra point and Greg Sagraves caught a pass from Boling for more extra points.

TROJANS ROMP OVER IRONTON 31-0

Municipal Stadium—September 16, 1966

It was the defensive team's turn to sparkle, and that they did in leading the Trojans to a 31-0 win over the Ironton Tigers before an eager parents night crowd. Never since the opening game of the 1964 season had the Trojan defense made a score. All this was changed with the Ironton game.

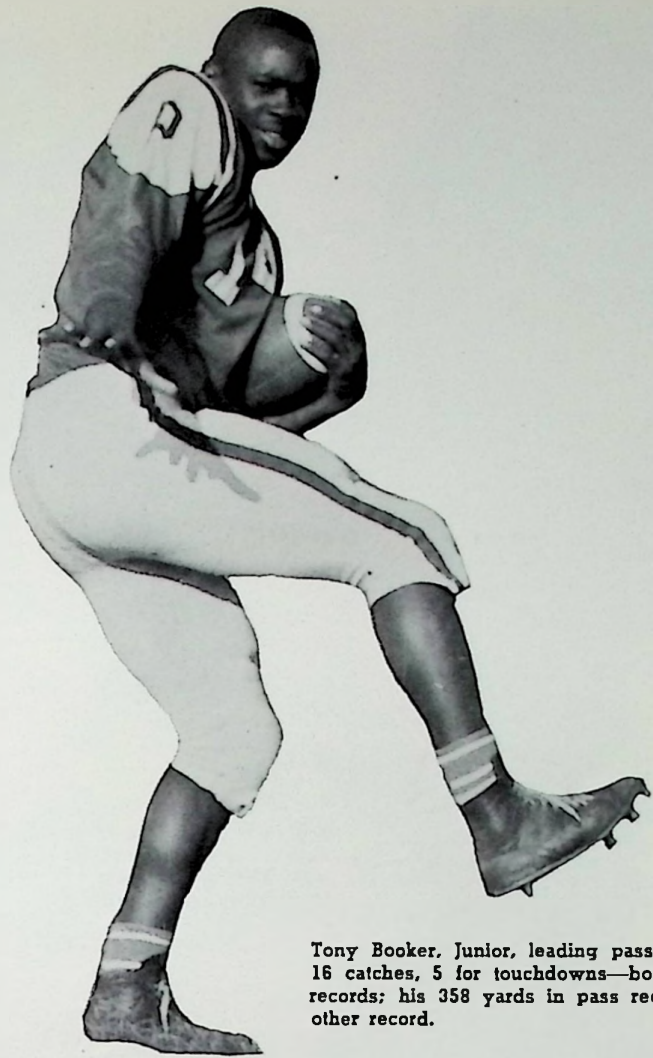

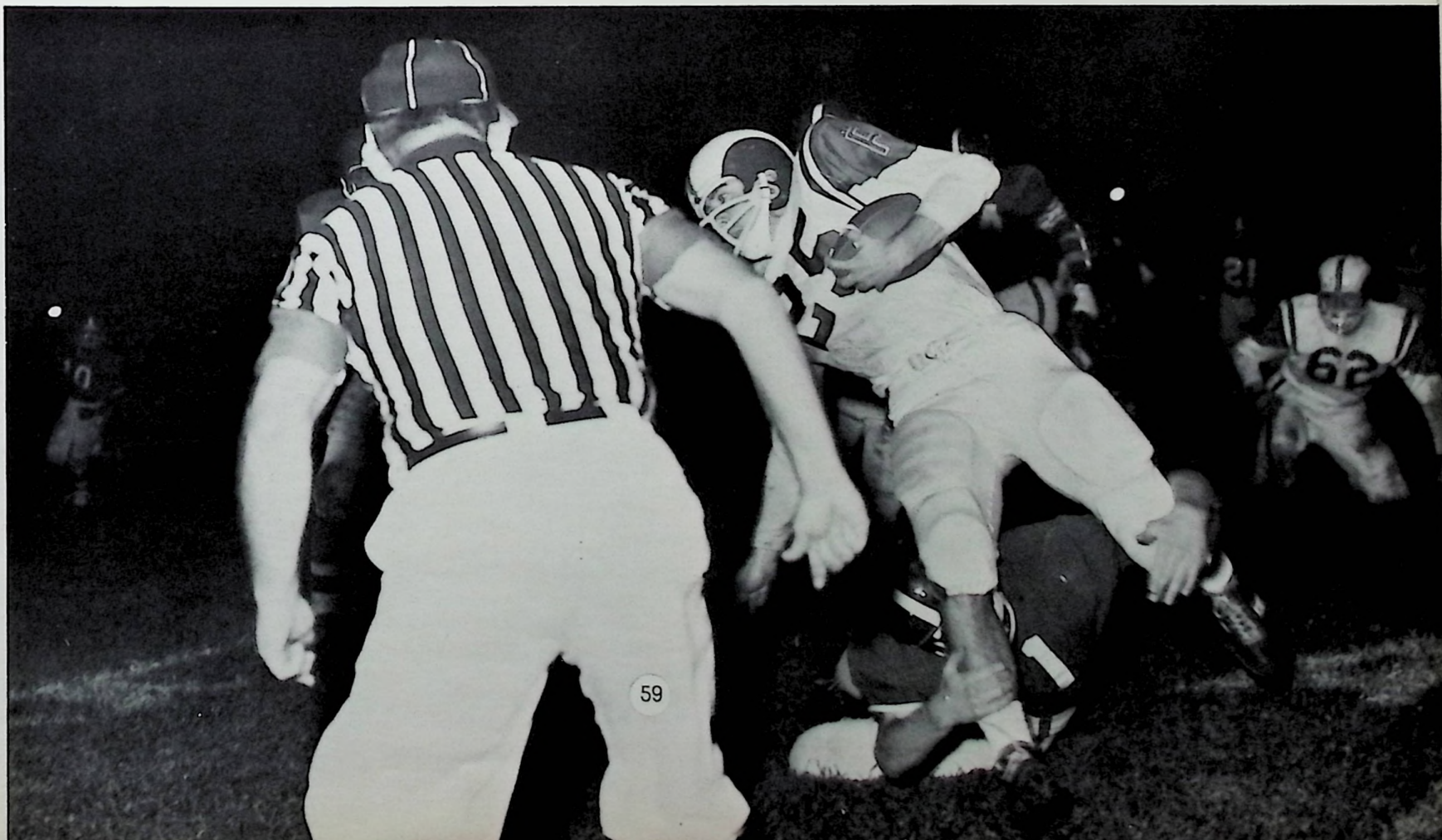

TROJANS TRIUMPH OVER IRONTON 91-73

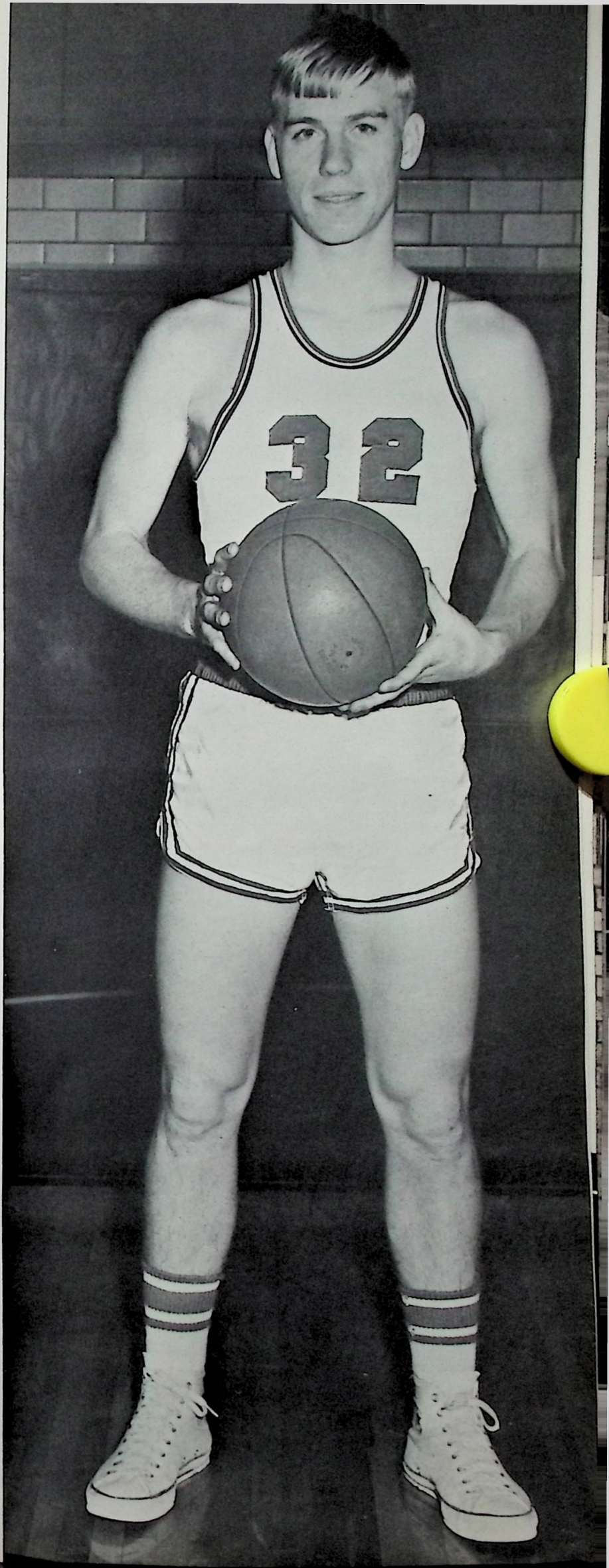
PHS Gym—December 10, 1966

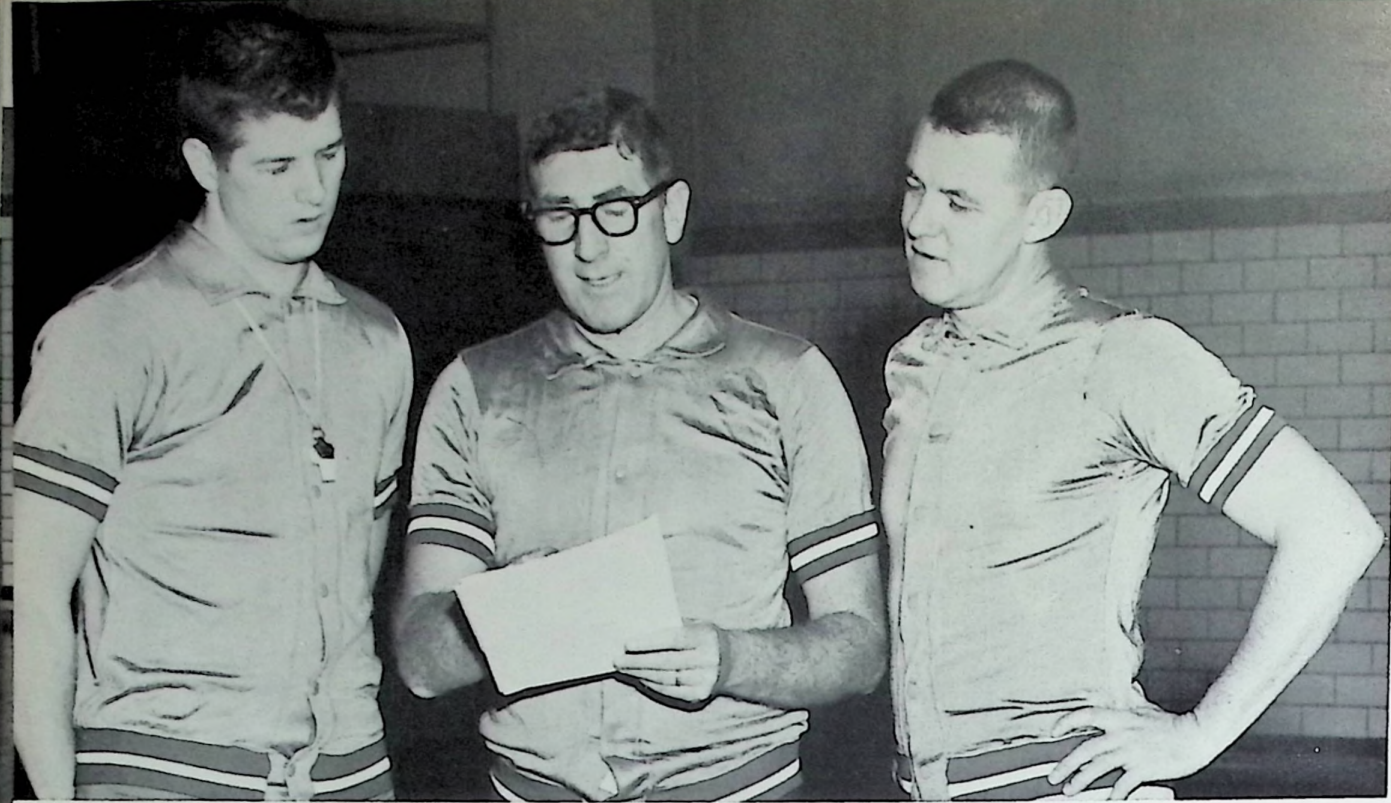

He served as co-captain this year. He won the foul efficiency position and is a good scrappy ball player. He gave a good performance in all ball games.

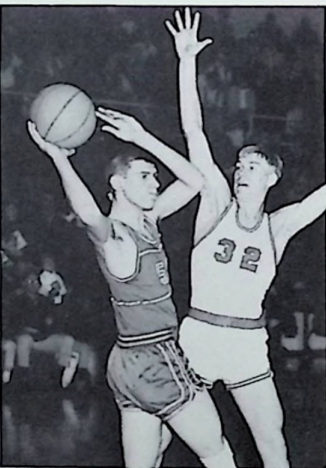

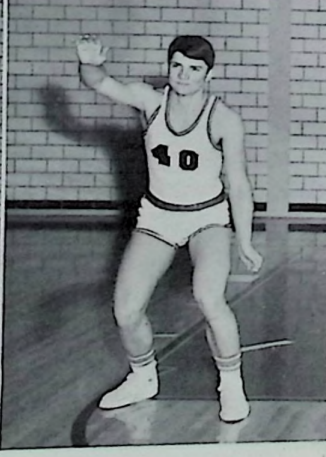

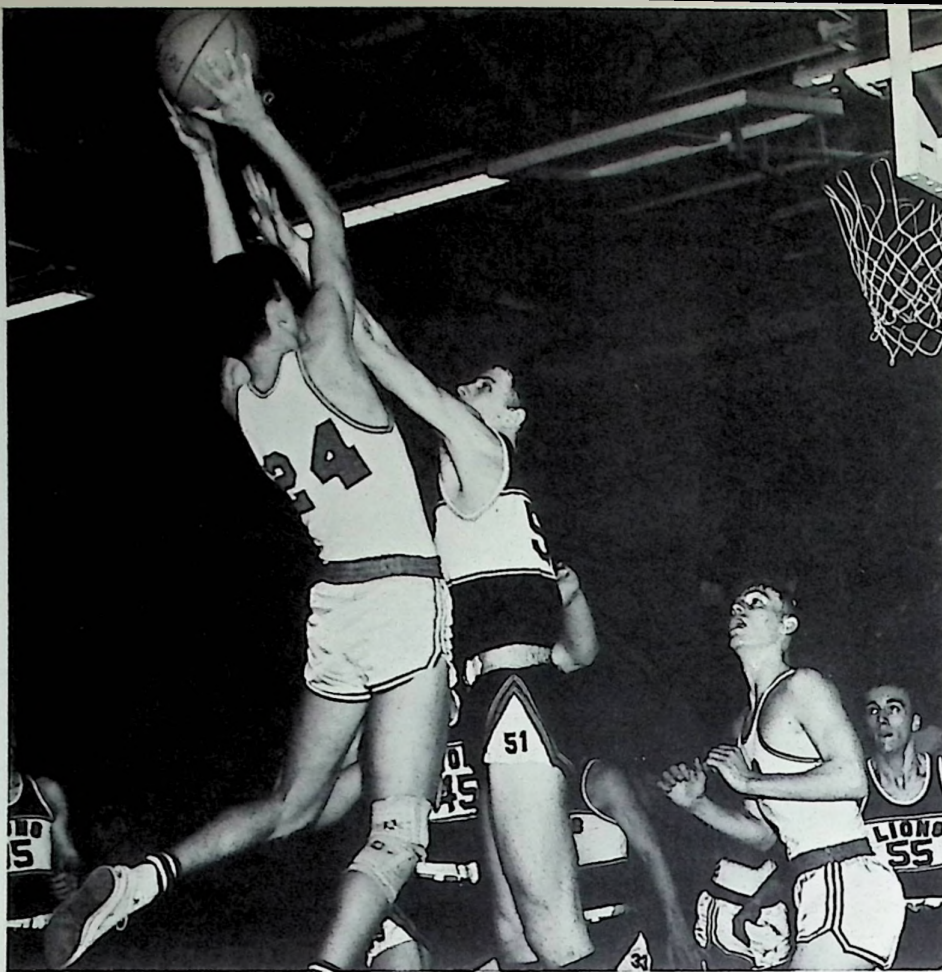

The Men of Troy showed a great desire to win, but the Cardinals were just too powerful. Coach George Heller shook up the lineup by starting two sophomores, Jon Daniels and Charlie Taylor. PHS went cold in the early part of the second period which allowed Worthington to jump into the lead.

Walt Mannon and Charlie Taylor led the Trojans in scoring with 18 tallies each.

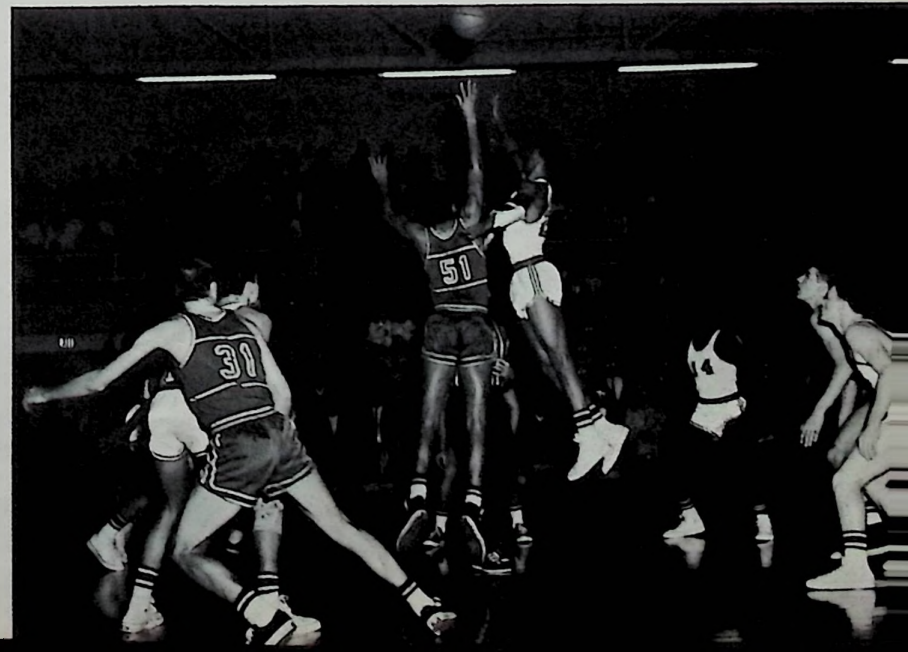
TOP RATED COLUMBUS EAST FINALLY STOPS TROJANS 83-54

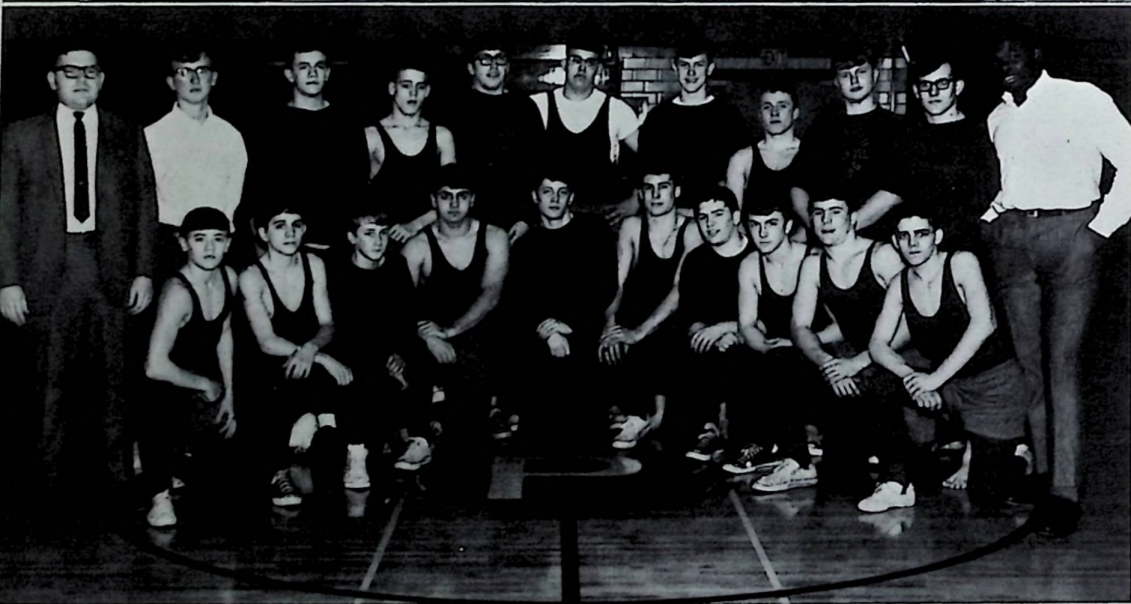

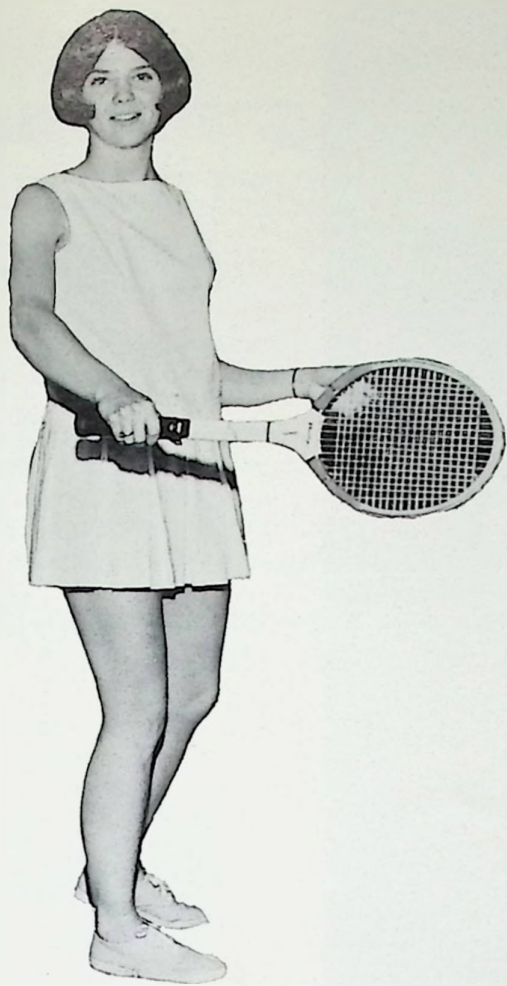

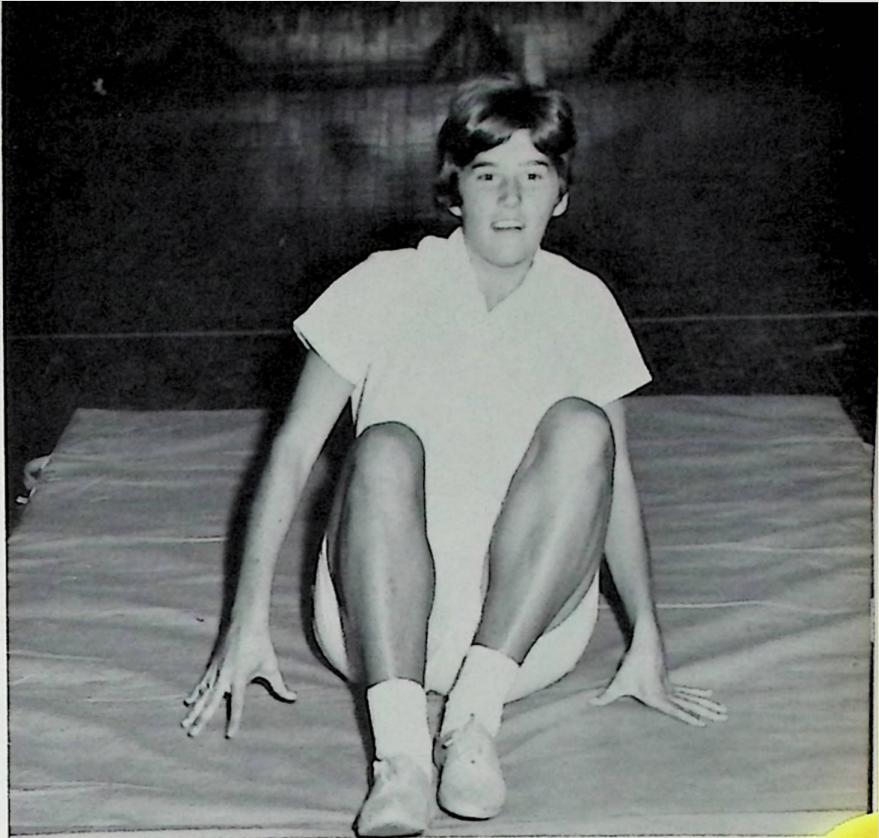

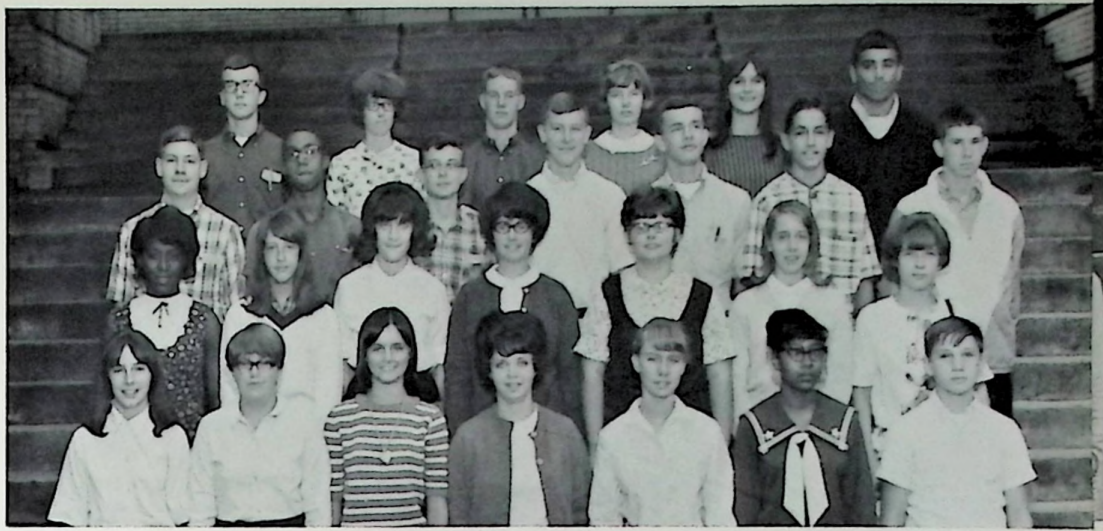
We elected as our sophomore class leaders, Bill An-

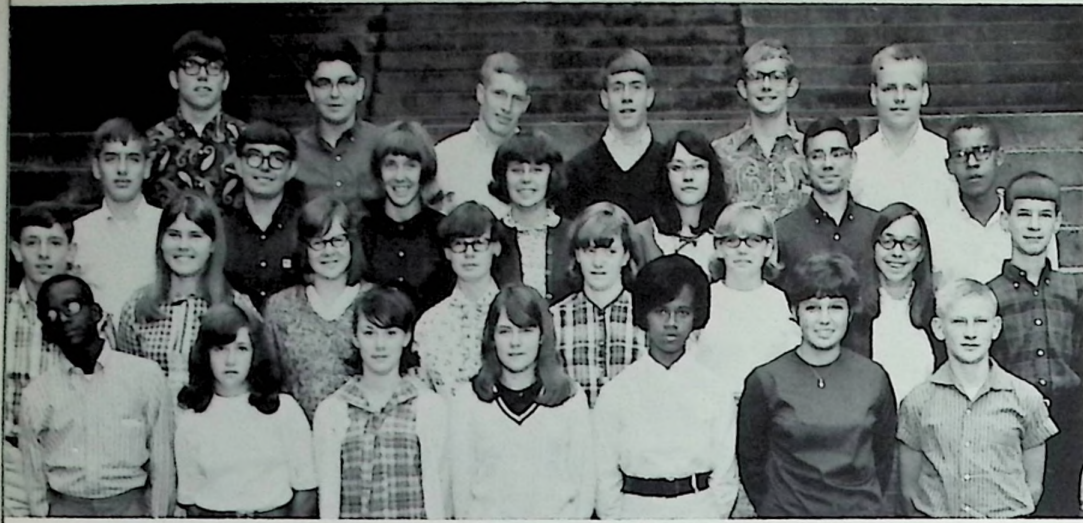

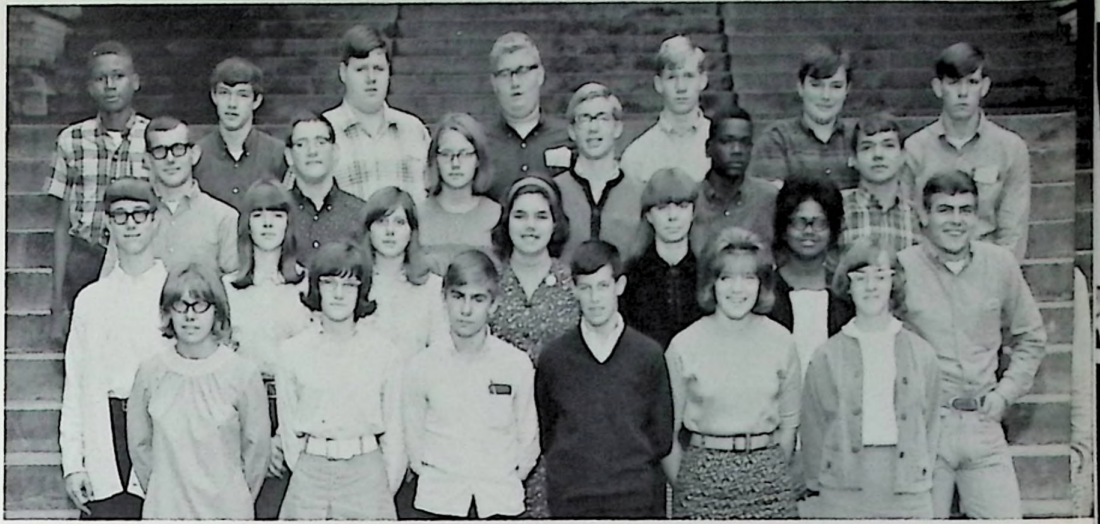

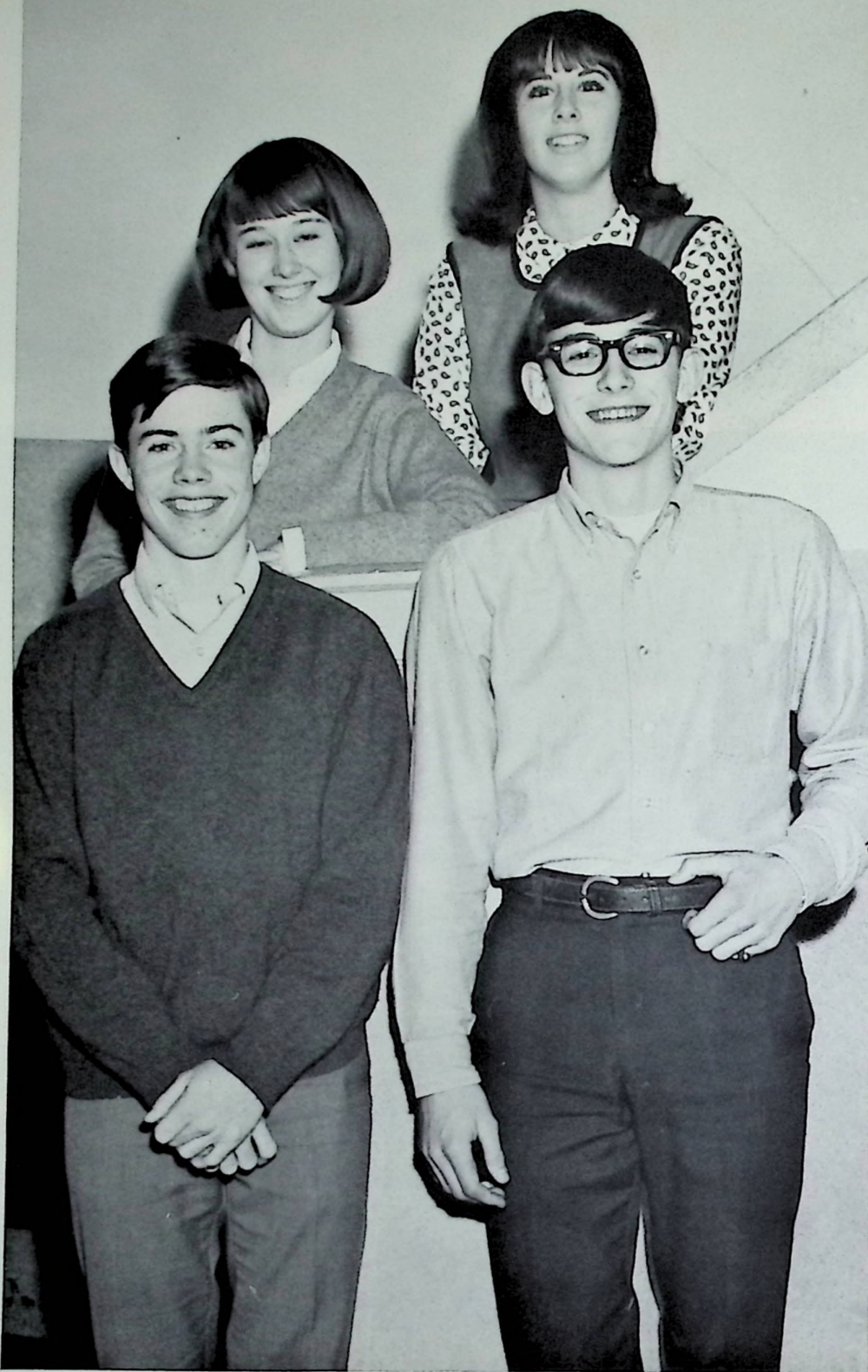

In the fall of '66, after a heated campaign, Curt Newton became our Junior Class President. Jim Anderson

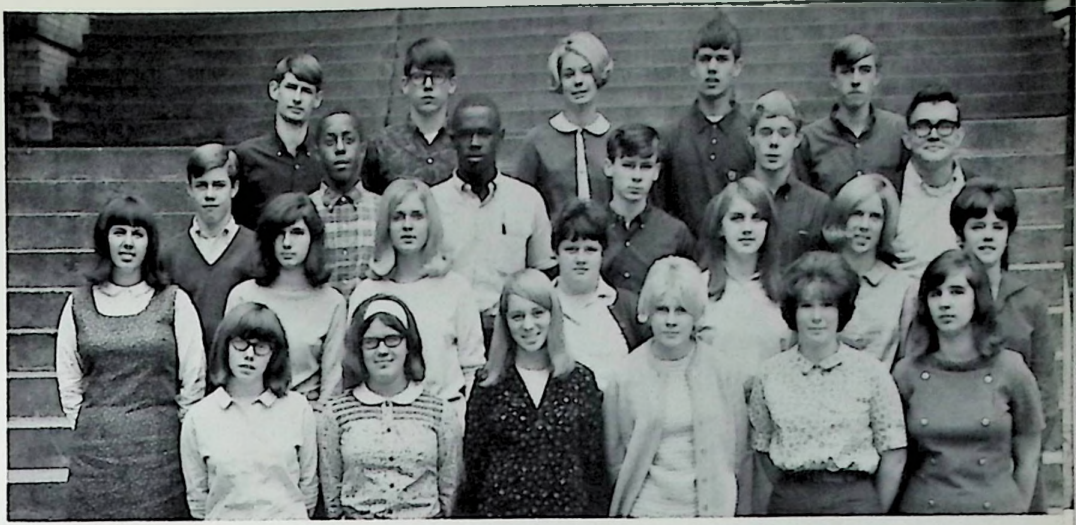

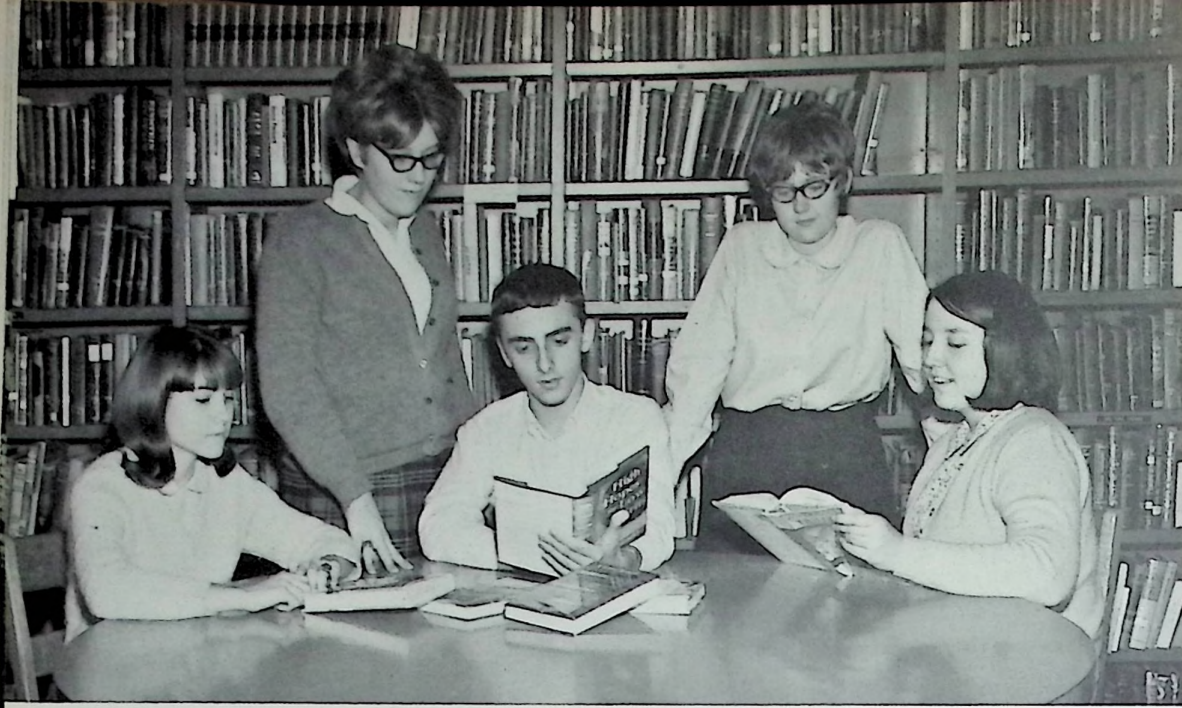

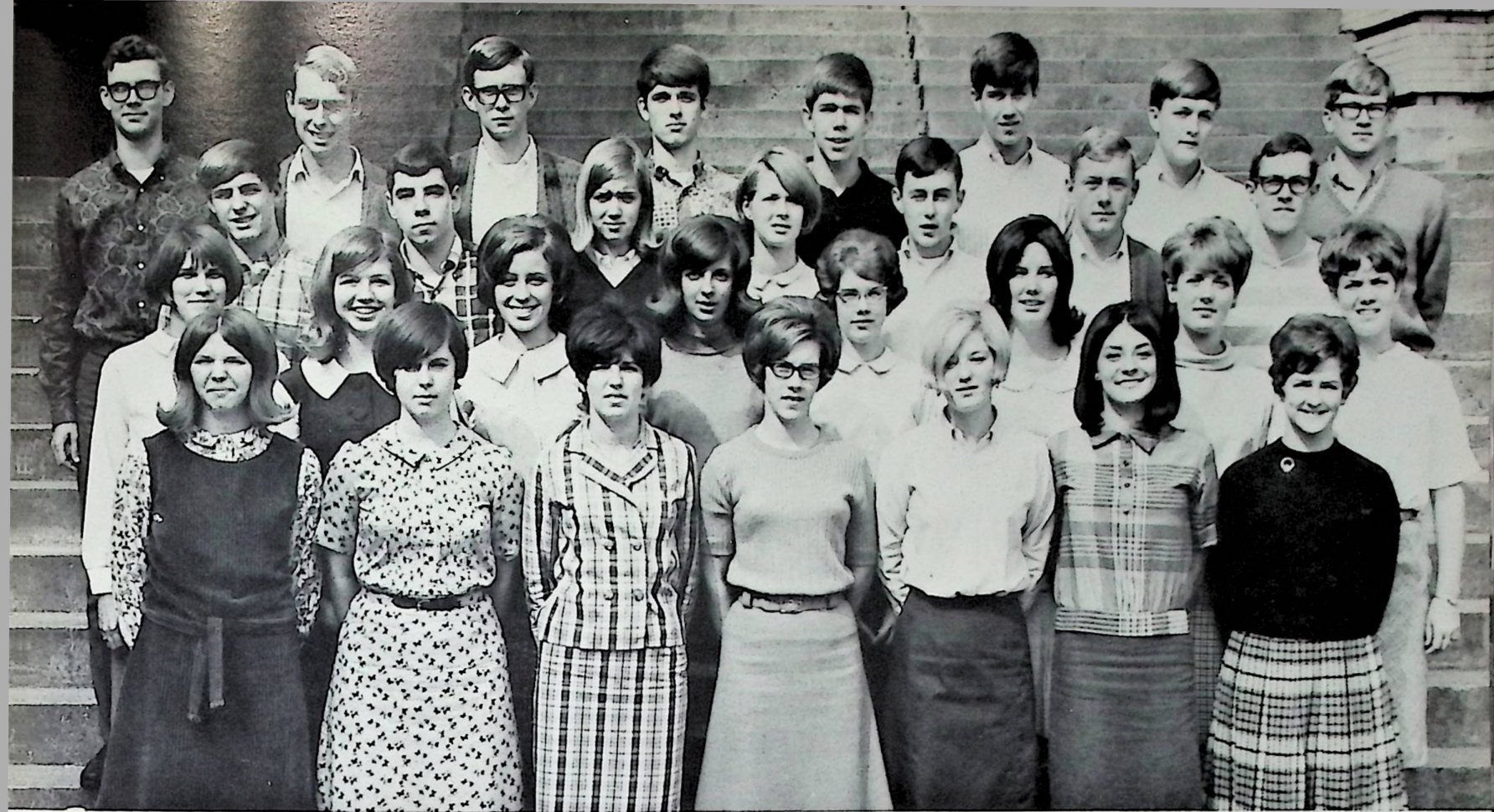

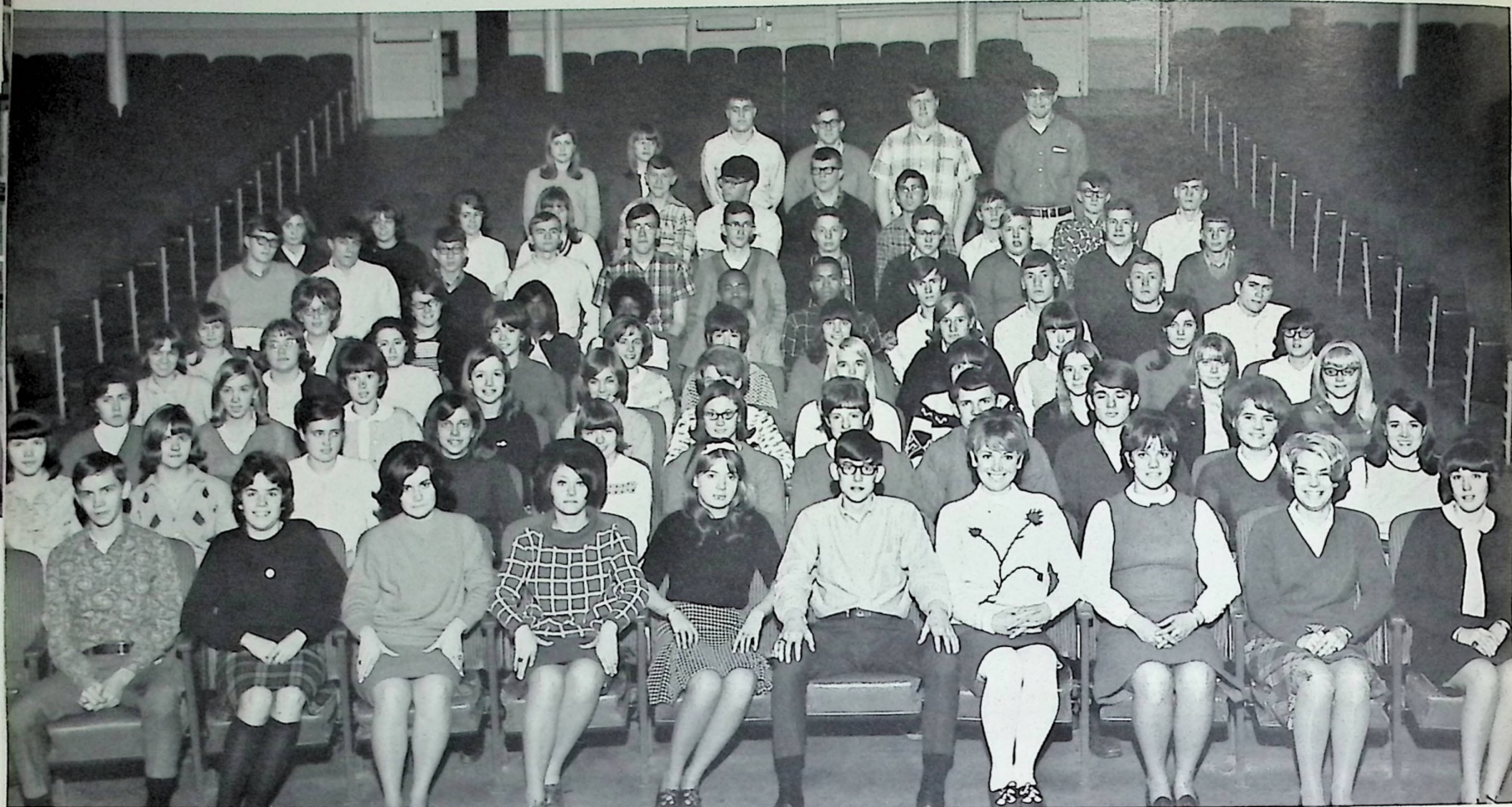

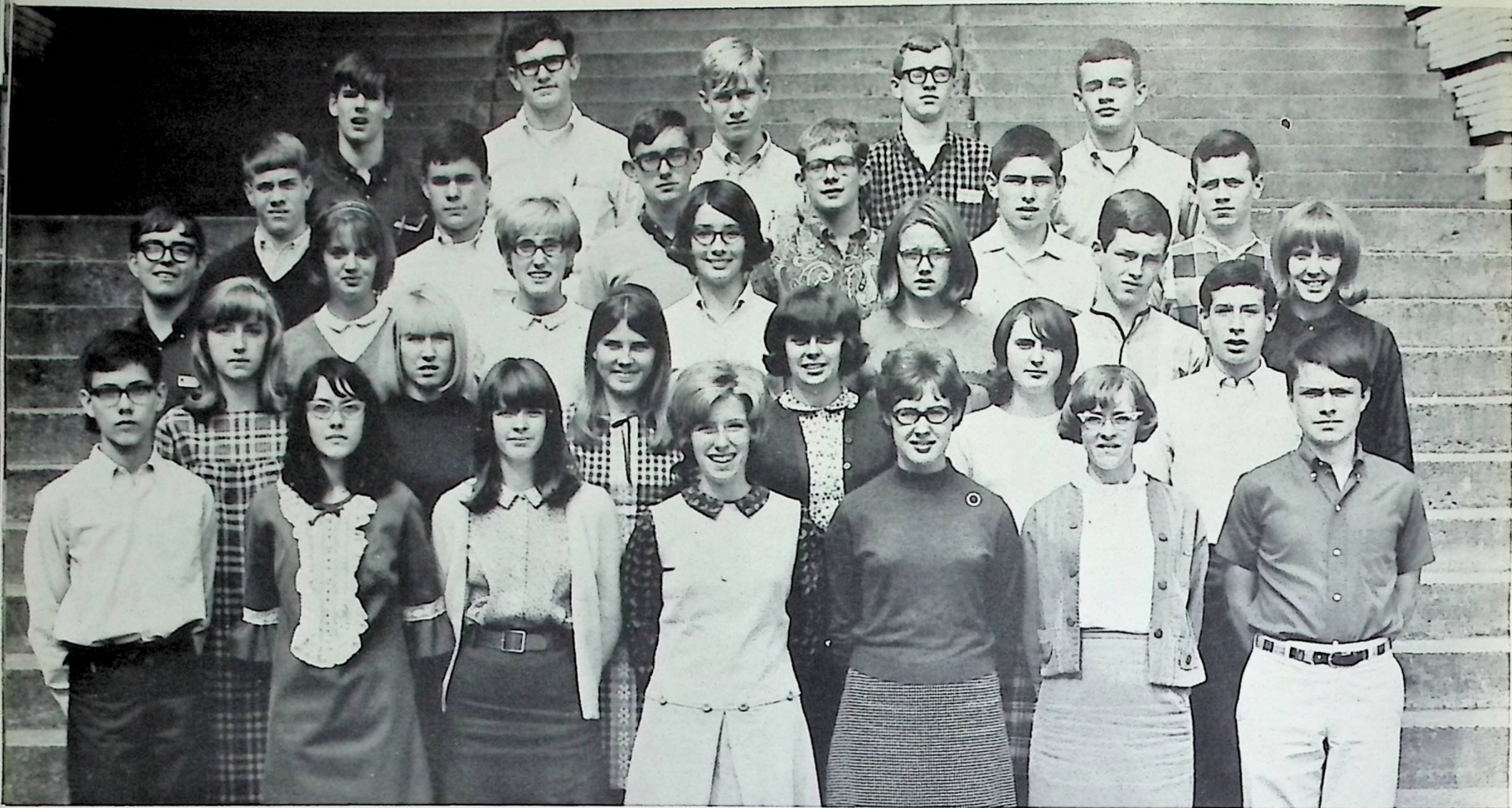

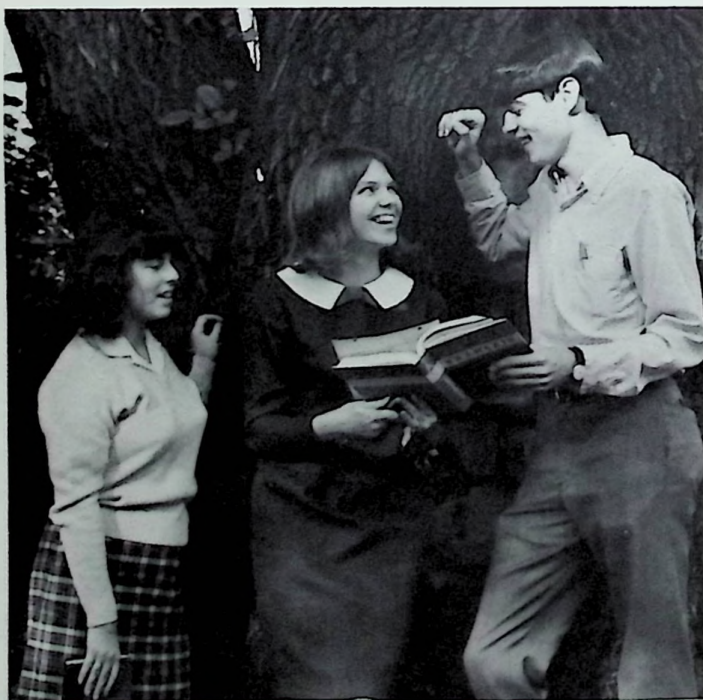

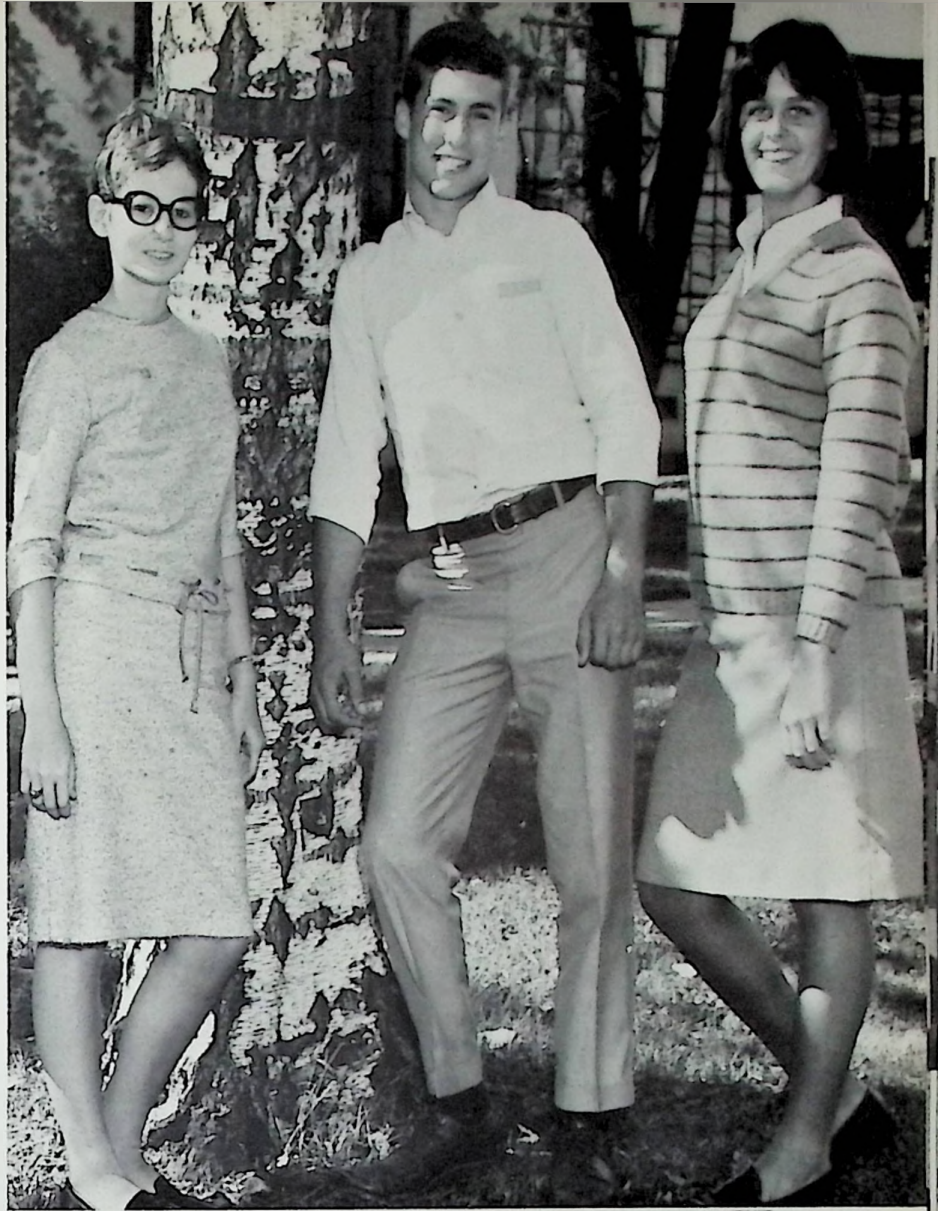

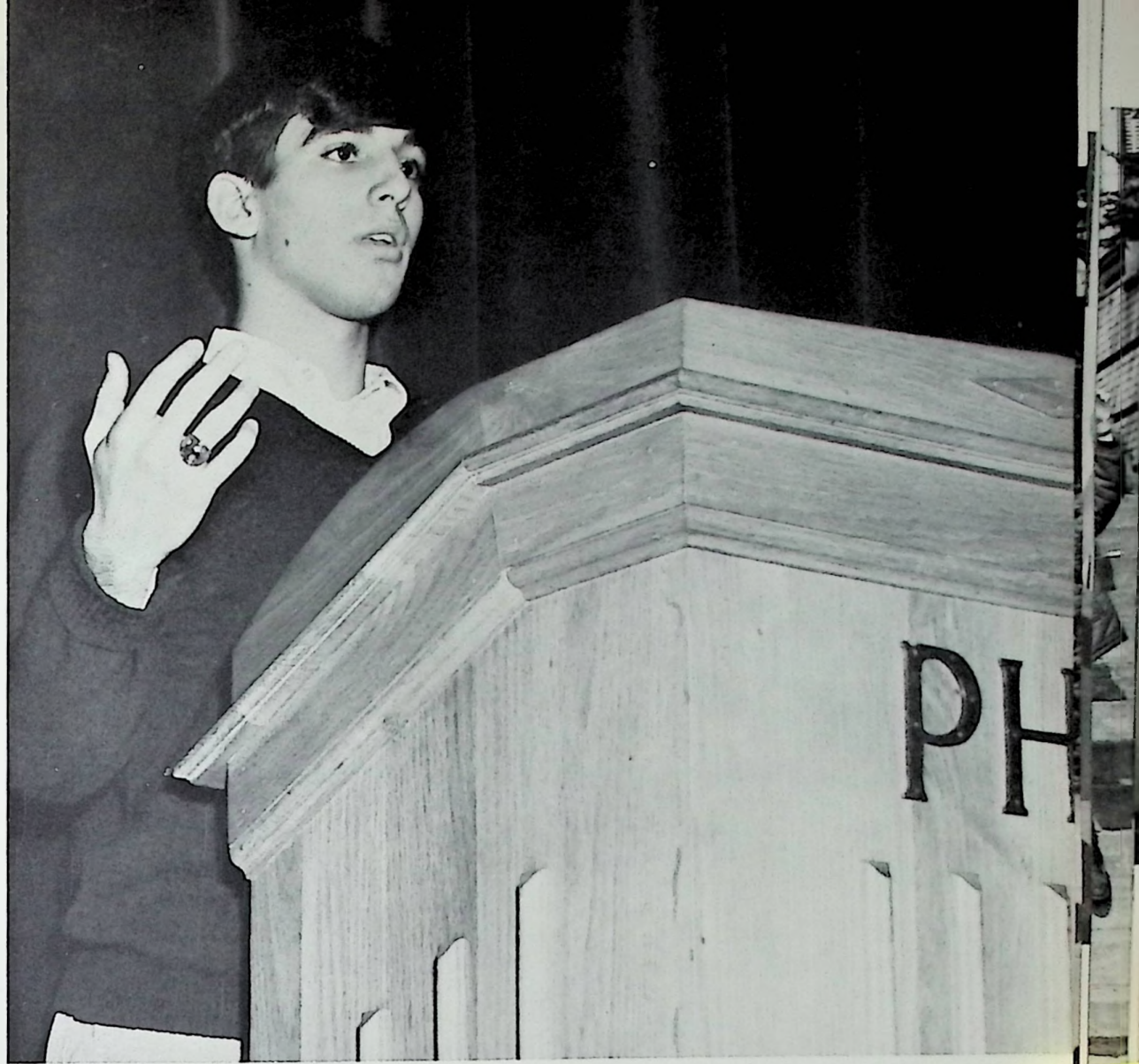

WHAT SHOULD BE THE FOREIGN AID POLICY OF THE UNITED STATES

Each year the National University Extension Association (NUEA) selects a general topic for nationwide debate in U. S. high schools. This year's topic was: "What should be the foreign aid policy of the United States?"

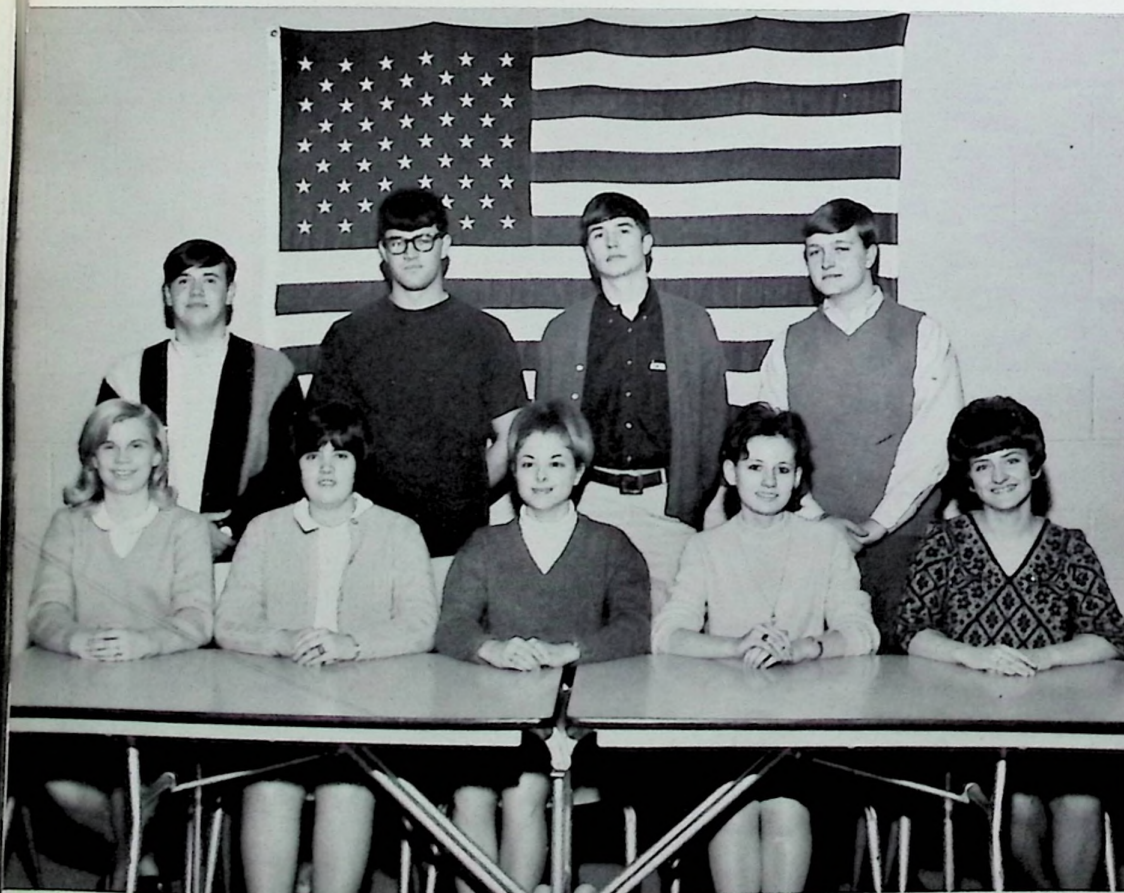
