Ohio has offered the Post Secondary Enrollment Option Program (PSEOP) to high school students to attend any Ohio college. PSEOP has been available to PHS students for the past ten years. Each college sets its own requirements for admission into the program. Shawnee State requires the students maintain a 3.0 gpa.
