Valued at $\$ 6,000$, the scholarship provides a four-year college course leading to a Bachelor Degree in Industrial and Labor Relations.

Two other former Northwest students--Dennis Davis and Carolyn Diehlmann--won the DSC Scholarship in 1960 and 1962, respectively. They are now enrolled at Ohio State.

Established in 1956, the DSC Scholarship has been awarded to eight ambitious, deserving area students.
