hauling hay.
He got 6 ton
to day.

We all eat dinner
at Mr. Jake Qu
bills.

I wrote Mrs.
Father a letter
to day and sent
it over to the
office by Mr. Eff

October 3: 1890

A nice day.
Heavy fog this
morning. After
the sun showed
out bright and
hot.

We finished
up Johnnie's
hay, came
home. He bailed
10 ton and 18 hun
dreds.

We came home
in time to help
finish the barn.
Pa is gone to night

Oct. 4.

The forenoon
nice. A heavy fog
this morning.

Rained this afternoon
but not much. The work
the roads.

Two teams and
4 hands, all day.
Pa came home
this evening.

Grant Miller
was here today
to see Pa. Father
Jenny & Smith are
to Mr. Holman to a

A rainy looking
forenoon.

Not much rain
A little cool.

I got ready and
went over to Mr.
Grill's. Got
there about 4 o'clock
in the evening.

The girls were
playing on the
organ. Lida was
sick. Ellie's finger
is bitten.

Oct. 5.

After spending a delightful evening was bringing our pleasant trip to a close when I received from a cannon ball in my breast, the shell known as G. B.

After discharging my rifle, which was my first time, I saddled my horse and homeward bound.

Oct. 6.

A rainy morning. Cleared up and got cooler. I felt all over in spots all day. He hauled corn out of the bottoms. I got to bed a little earlier than a common. I slept in the barn last night. On awaking I heard them laughing about the old boy getting up.

Oct. 7.

A cloudy ball day. The turned our first furry for wheat today. Pa went to town.

There were 4 sheep here.

Two stayed all night. Press. Horganit Rose.

14 years ago today Pa started from the sweat.

Oct. 8.

A nice day. Very heavy fog. Squire & I plowed all day. Our sheep dealer left this morning without the sheep.

They bought several head off of load - back & received a letter last night from Char. Town. Pa. Co. from Penna.

Oct 9

A nice day
A little frost
this morning

The dogs have
been on our whys
last night.

Coyotes & killed
13 head that
we found.

Smith & I have
put in the day
hunting whys.

They went over and
killed the Philly
dogs. Mr. Goodwin
and Park stay all
night.

Oct. 10.

A nice day
Turns cool in
the evening.

Smith & I have
skinned the two
dead whys
and sold them
to Mr. Goodwin.

They have
been hunting
whys all day.

He started out to
hunt for whys
and did not get
back till evening.

The feller stayed all
night.

Oct. 11.

A nice day
Squire & I plowed
till noon.

Mr. Friedman &
Pard struck out.

Mr. Ball came
over and Squire
& I went with
him to look at

the 4 dead sheep
Afterwards Squire

& I fixed fence
Artie & Stella

Bothwell came
up and stayed

all night. He played

Oct. 12.

A small shower
this morning.

The rest of the
day was nice
and warm.

Smith, Pettie
& Stallard & Hirt

went up to
Ognale Eliasen

I have been at
home all day reading

ing up on pul-
iticks and

preaching on
the organ.

Oct. 13.

A nice warm day. Rained a little after sundown.

I plowed half day and harrowed the other half. Went Bennett was down after truck drums.

I paid him and sent the money to the seat of the boy. Smith has gone up to a party to George Bennett's tonight.

Oct. 14.

A nice day. Began to get cool in the evening. To wet to harrow this morning I cut 11 stocks of corn and helped carry the popcorn up garet.

After dinner I harrowed.

John Hartail was here for dinner. He is out looking for himself. Jennie started to school to day.

Oct 15:

A big frost
this morning.
The frost
falls. I harrowed
about all day.
The snow
frost wheat
fall. I sowed
my first.

Pa butchered
a calf this morning.

I wrote Miss

Oct 16.

A rainy cool
day. We have
done little if
any thing
Squire & I sowed
a couple of
sugar beets.
Took the horse
off the dog house
& hauled one
load of feed
- came right on
to get it.

Oct. 17.

A nice cool day.
A frost this
morning.

Smith & I hauled
corn from across
the creek half
day.

Pa, Ma, & Lilla
went up to
Aunt Rye's.

Pa went up to
mill. They broke
the buggy. Lilla
& I laid up them
I harrowed in
wheat the rest of
the day.

Oct. 18.

A nice day but
The wind made
it disagreeable.
The furnace was
so hot & running.

Smith & I
took on an expedition
by punching out
that we was

on the eve of
celebrating a party.

He gave them
the slip and
went to the box
where I remained
the night.

Oct 19

A cool cloudy
forenoon. Clear
up and was
nice the rest of
the day. I came
up and built
the fire the
morning. It
was raining
this morning.

David & Clarence
Hamon. was here
stayed all day.

Had a splinter
time. A large crowd
was here last
night.

Oct 20.

A big frost
had the day.
The freight
the fresh home
Tried to order
and fence the
rest of the day.
Clarence Hall
was over.

Oct. 21.

A big frost
consequently ice
froze in the
pans.

Spencer & Smith
picked up some
bricks - brushed

A frost this
morning

Did not get
back till after
dark I have read
several chapters of Scott's
poems.

Oct. 25.

A quiet day.
Heavy fog.
A dry wind rain
set in about
noon and rained
the rest of the day.
He hauled for
for the cribs
hauled them
down and
hewed them
Made a platform
in the stable.
I have read
Scott's grammar

Oct. 26.

A cold windy
day. Rained a
little during
the later part
of the day.
He was at home
all day except
Genie. He went
to church in
the evening.
Emmie Hallwa
was here all day.
I read the paper
Scott's grammar
and the bible.

Oct. 27.

A chilly cold day.

Had breakfast
at the crib.

Set the traps
and got the
sills.

Genie & I dug
the sweet po-
tatoes.

Read several
chapters of
Scott's journal
work on
Lady of the Lake.

Oct. 28.

A cold damp
day, windy.

He butchered
these hogs. I
worked at the
crib the rest
of the day.

I have a severe
cold.

Went to bed
early.

Oct. 25,

A cold, windy,
damp day.
Rained and sleeted
part of the day.
Pa went over to
Suits. Ica
He worked at
the cribs & the
buggy.
I still have
a bad cold.

Have read several
items in the News
on unilateral report
and Scott.

Oct. 30.

A cold day.
Rained & snowed
a little during
the day. The
first snow this
year. He worked
at the cribs all
day. Pa is layed
up with the
