Tom Haensse, exchange student from Celle, Germany, came to PHS under the auspices of the International Students Placement Service. He traveled to the U.S. on the Aurelia, an Italian ship which also transported some 700 other foreign students.
Our German student explained that his school system is somewhat different from ours. German students have 13 years of public school as contrasted to our 12. Elementary school is composed of grades 1-4, and high school consists of grades 5-13. The students attend school from August to June and have a six-week vacation. Their school sessions last six days a week, only in the mornings.
At PHS, Tom studied trigonometry, American history, American literature, fourth-year French, chemistry, and physical education. After returning to Germany, Tom intends to finish his two years of high school, enter the army and later attend college where he hopes to major in engineering.
While attending PHS this year, the exchange student's American "parents" were Mr. and Mrs. William C. Anderson of 2339 Timberview Drive.

Portsmouth High has a well-rounded vocational prugram geared to provide for the needs of students on many levels. This training assures an opportunity for students to prepare for the fast-moving vocational and technical fields by receiving high school training in good general basic skills and knowledge or by following a definite program leading to a specific job.

A guidance counselor works closely with these students to help them be ready to seek and secure employment in local industry. This year students had the opportunity to visit area industries and to talk to prospective employers where they received firsthand information as to what is expected of them on the job.
