



Questions that are most commonly requested by all employers and colleges are:

New Boston quickly bounced back to down West 24-6. Steve Ross led the Tiger scoring attack with two touchdowns with Fred Wolfe scoring the other.


Glenwood played a better game than their 24-14 score indicated in their loss to Rock Hill.



Frazier was a member of the All-State's third team. Harr received honorable mention. Harr also won the team's Most Valuable Player Award.


