






Memories of OTWAY HIGH SCHOOL

DEDICATION

We, the Seniors of Otway High School, wish to dedicate this annual to Mr. A. B. Jones because we feel that he has done more than any other person to advance and improve our school.

Mr. Jones, who was born April 6, 1882, attended the Jones' School until he was eighteen years old. At the close of the 1899-1900 school term, he attended the Lucasville School for ten weeks after which he passed the County Examination and received a One Year Certificate to teach. He never had the opportunity of attending high school, but did heme work and took college entrance examinations for his high school credits. His college work was done in Miami, Ohio, Wilmington and Chicago, and graduated from the later in 1923, he received a B. S. Degree in Education. He also did post-graduate work for several terms at the University of Cincinnati.



ALVIN BURTON JONES

Mr. Jones taught in the one room country schools for five years. In 1906 he came to Otway as Supervising Principal. He taught here for the next fourteen years and then went to Peeb'es High School as Supervising P incipal for the next three yeas, after which he acted as Supervising Principal of Minford High School for one year. In 1925, he returned to Otway and was Supervising Principal he e for the next twenty years. Leaving Otway in 1945, he taught one year at Portsmouth High School and one year at Washington Township High School. In 1947, he retired from the teaching profession to devote full time as a life insurance salesman. A short message from Mr. Jones in which he says: "I spent thirty-four years as the Supervising Principal of the Otway School, and I feel very grateful to a generous community for the support given me. I have a feeling of pride for whatever contribution I may have made in the growth of the school from a three room elementary to the present centralized high school."



Class History


As the task of writing the class history has this year fallen to me, I will try to relate some of the experiences of the class of 1951, These experiences are not new. This was an exciting adventure for all of us- quite unlike anything we had ever experienced. If we were naughtier than usualy that year, please try to bear in mind that we were, after all, only a group of children struggling to be grown up and never quite succeeding.

In the eighth grade we were brought briefly into the limelight by the eighth grade test; and of course the next year we and our new classmates from Union Township were the center of attention at the Freshman's Initiation.

In our Sophomore year we worked and played quietly by ourselves. We weren't noticed much that year, being neither green Freshman, nor busy Juniors and Seniors. The next year we had many activities, such as raising money for the Junior-Senior trip to Washington, and participating in the Junior Class Play. We learned to take responsibility-at least the doses seemed big to us. Sometimes lessons and other activities piled up so high around our ears that we'd pray to get a leg broken so that we wouldn't have to face it all. Of course none of us ever succeeded in getting our prayer answered, but one girl made an attempt worthy of mention. It turned out to be a sprain, but she had to stay income a week.



Now we are on the home stretch, and look back and marvel at the speed of time; and yet we know it was well spent. We fattened on friendships, laughter, tears, and even disappointments. Perhaps thatlearning to take disappointment and failure and still keep on trying--was the biggest lesson of all.

What we have done in the last twelve years will never go down in history, but who of us will ever forget these years? Even if we were never to see each other again after graduation, we could never be entirely dissevered, for we have each of us so unmistakeably left a mark on all the others, that in the years to come, the history that each of us makes will be the triumph or the tragedy of us all.
