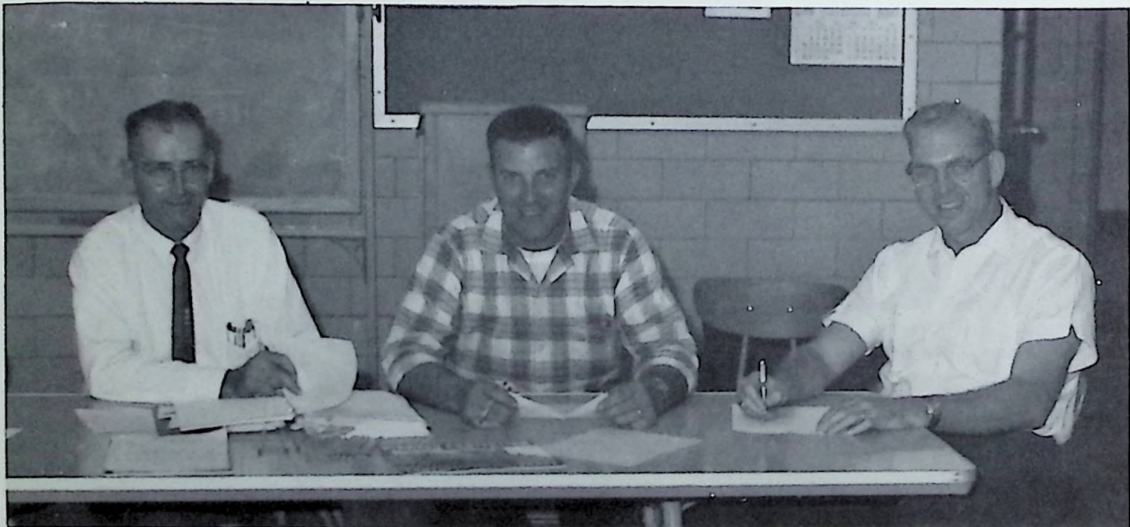
"I believe that the public schools of America and this country will continue to lead the way for a better, stronger, and greater America. I believe that the American people are too strongly committed to education to ever let it down.

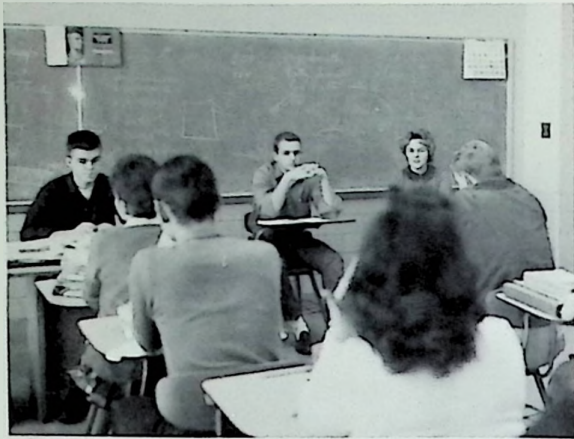

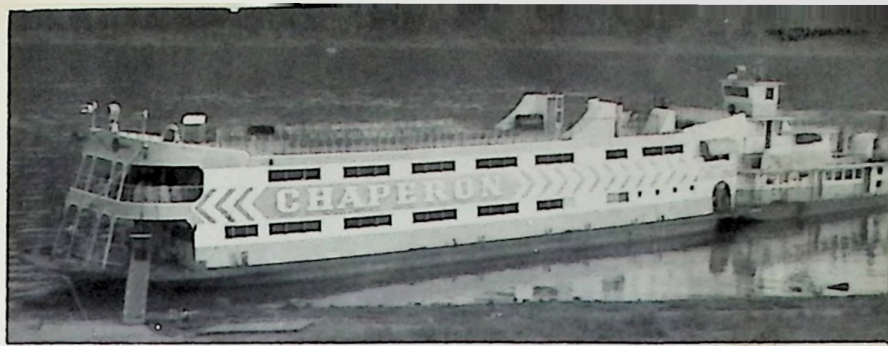

Northwest was again honored this year by being chosen as the site of the County Music Festival. Here we see a practice session in the cafeteria.

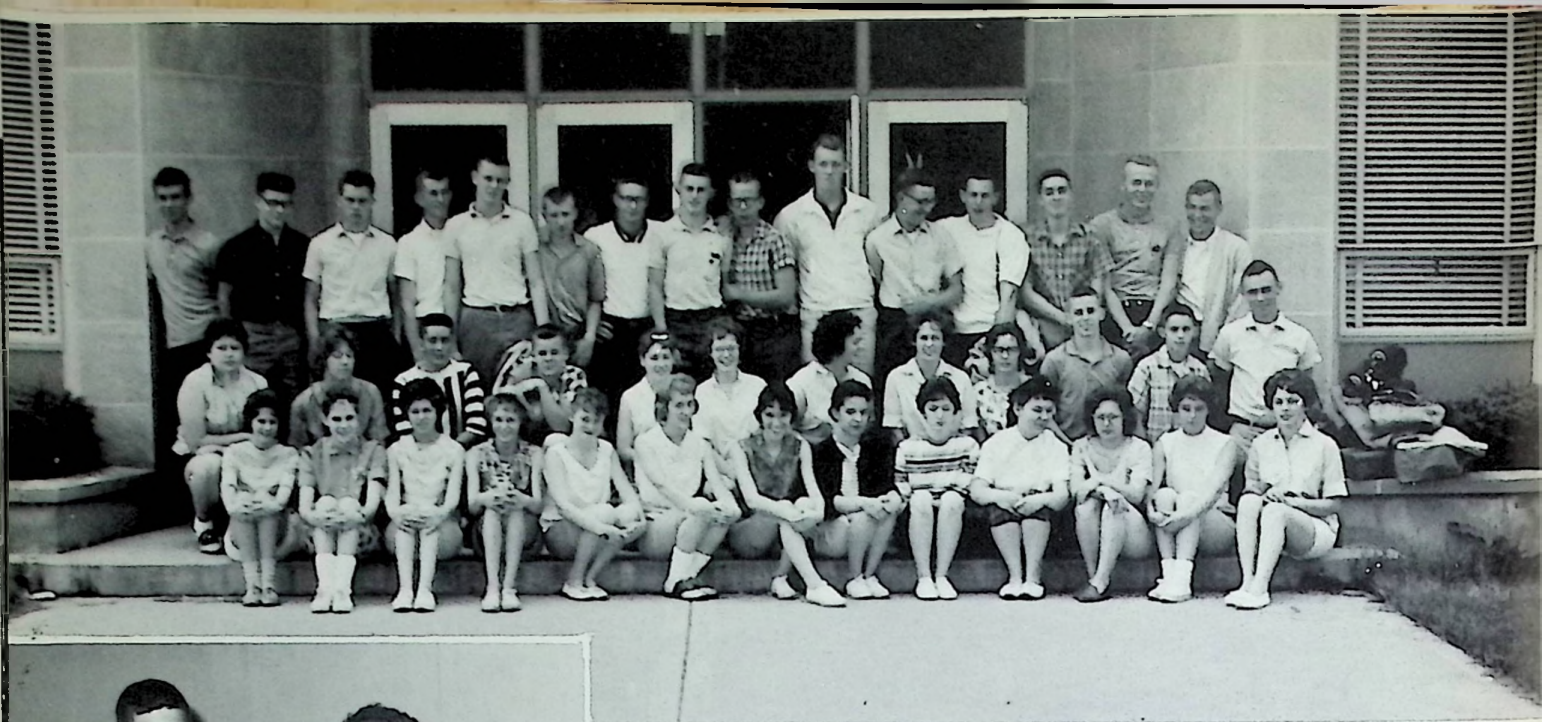


Glee Club

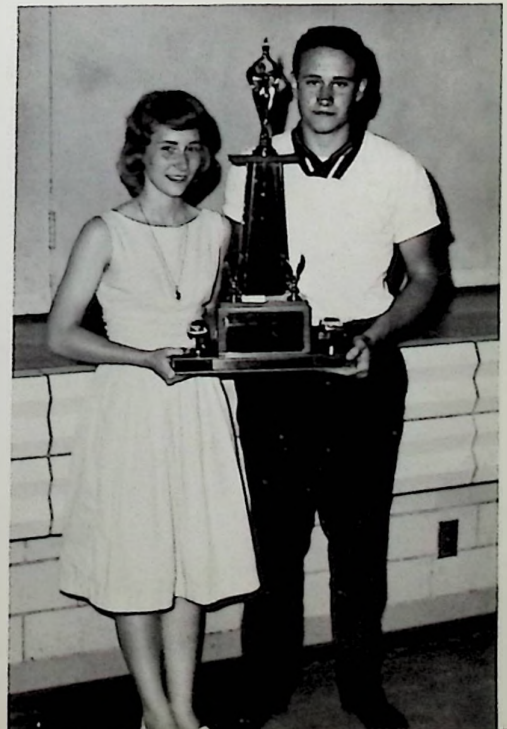

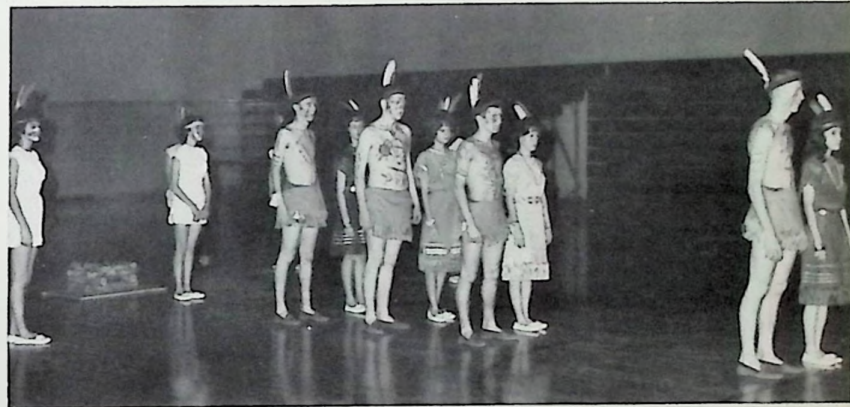

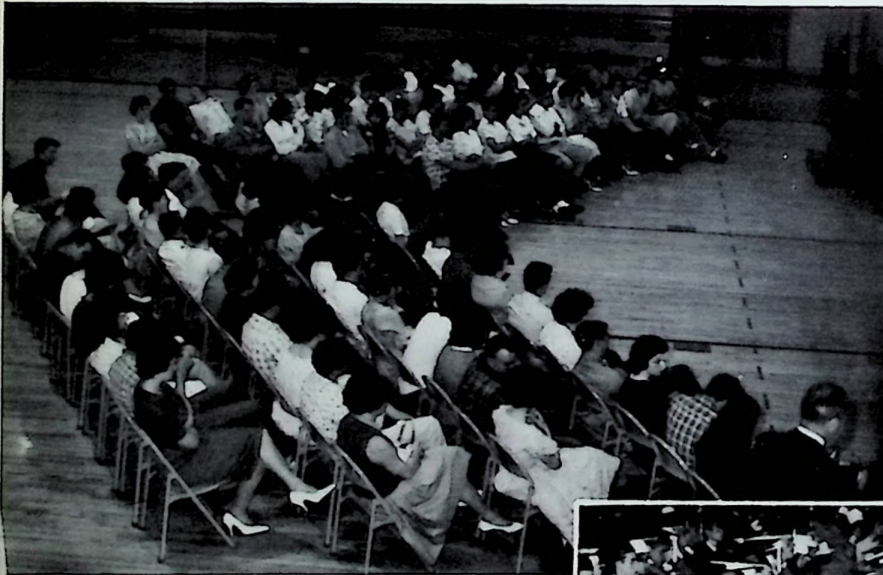
