## THE MORE THINGS CHANGE

As editor of this year's Senatorian, I needed to choose a theme. We are West's fiftieth graduating class, so the fiftieth year celebration was a thematic feature I wanted to use. But how was I to take the experiences of West students over the past fifty years and find a common bond?

Although much history separates us, our school history is our shared experience.

Old yearbooks revealed a shared interest in music, friendships, fun, and sports. We had studied almost all the same subjects, in almost the same way. Some things have changed, but I felt that "The more things changed, the more they stayed the same. "I HAD FOUND MY THEME."
I want to thank everyone who allowed us to use their cherished photographs and memories.
Mr. Gillette and

his wife, Mary, wrote a splendid letter. I decided to use it in its entirety. They made our beginning days as a high school sound so challenging.

I know that those of you who read the Gillettes' letter will feel the same respect and admiration that I do for all those early teachers, students, and board members who had the will to persevere in less than ideal conditions.
As you go through this yearbook, you will encounter some of those people who were in on the beginning. In 1969 we moved from Washington High to a new building. We became the Portsmouth West High Senators. Lately, the name "Siders" has become a part of our tradition. But Siders, or Senators, we are still proud!

## FROM WASHINGTON RURAL HIGH SCHOOL

In the mid-thirties when students finished the eighth grade, they needed to travel to Portsmouth each day as tuition students if they wanted a high school education.

The hardship of travel and tuition in these depression days was a bit too much for many, and their formal education ended with graduation from the eighth grade.
Under the leadership of County Superintendent Edward O. McCowen, three townships were joined to form the Washington Local District, and plans were made for a rural high school. Contracts were let and work began.

When the first faculty was called together in September 1939, the high school building was incomplete. The teachers were sent home to return the first of October.

When they returned in October, the building had no water, no restrooms, no furniture, no heat and few textbooks. The teachers did what necessity required. They asked students to sit on the floor, turned to the new blackboards, and with chalk in hand, taught "out of their heads." They started. They improvised. They unpacked furniture as it arrived, uncrated textbooks, and taught six days a week to make up for the late start.

As fall and winter came, teachers brought kerosene heaters from home to

banish chill in their classrooms. Outhouses stood a distance from each end of the lower hall, and boards spanned the construction mud to them.
Each morning, Mr. Frank Rolf, the high school administrator, would tour the building, checking construction progress and noting what next needed to be done. Great piles of dirt lay roundabout, and at first, one wall was missing on the south wing. Slowly the building took shape.
No central inter-coms was available. Runners took notes to and from the central office, and a handbell was.rung in the lower hall to indicate class change times.
As soon as the gymnasium could be used, Russell B. Christian started basketball. Most players had never handled a basketball before, but in a few short years the Senators were winners in area play.
No music teacher was available. Mr. John Daulton, a science teacher, met before school with a chorus that sang for school functions that first year.
The high school was staffed that first year with district teachers from the elementary schools and other area teachers who qualified at the high school level.

The rest of school personnel includ-

Under the direction of Principal Frank B. Rolf, the first-year high school was granted a six-year charter, received ratings in the State scholarship tests, organized clubs and an athletic association second to none in the county. Mr. Rolf retired in 1962 as Executive Head of West High.

ed: Frank Rolf, principal; Lillian Davenport, English; Marguerite Rapp, Latin, French, Biology; Mary Bennett, Commercial; Margaret Hoch, Commercial; Edna Jolly, Home Economics; Russell B. Christian, History, Coach; John Daulton, Physics and Manual Training; John Stamm, Science; Phillip Daulton, Mathematics.

Two of that first-year faculty are still living in Scioto County. They are Mary Bennett Gillette and Edna Jolly.

The second year found the furniture in place and a fine inter-com installed. Water was still a problem, and the outhouses were still needed.

Twenty-eight new band instruments were purchased and loaned to students who ranked highest on the Seashore Test of Musical Aptitude. Other students whose parents had purchased instruments joined them, and the high school band numbered forty-five members. The first concert was given before the student body, and the second at Steelworkers Hall in New Boston.

During the first year the high school was in operation, district seniors could elect to finish their work at Portsmouth High School or attend the new school.

Eleven students chose to attend Washington Rural High School that first year to complete their senior year. They were: Nile Davis, Lee Evans, Doris Fawns, Clarence Henderson, Paul Hopkins, Robert Lowe, Ray Mauk, CarI Myers, Elbert Peed, Eloise Risner, and Carless Stepp.

Members of the board of education represented the three townships comprising the jointure. They were: George Jenkins, President; Roy Cunningham, William D. Evans, Ellison Ladd and Bessie Greene, Clerk-Member. Two members of that board are still living in Scioto County. They are Bessie Greene and Roy Cunningham.

## Harold "Monk" Everling 1946-60

In 1946, six years after its opening, Washington High School fielded its first football team, under Coach "Monk" Everling.

We asked Mr. Everling, now a resident of Florida, to share with us some memories of the first year of football at Washington High.
Headlines for the team's opener against McArthur read, SENATORS DROP 12-6 OPENER

WASHINGTON BOYS GIVE McARTHUR TOUGH BATTLE.

Well, that was the beginning, and Coach Everling adds more details about that year in his letter printed below.

Coach Everling's letter:
That first year, fall 1946, is one I will never forget. I called a meeting with the boys who thought they wanted to participate and got 23 boys, freshmen through seniors.

The budget for football was very small. Administration had no experience of the cost of fielding a team, so we had to get along on the bare essentials. We used the same pants for games that we used in practice every day. When game day arrived we issued jerseys with numbers, and the boys really got excited. The first time we dressed for practice, half of the boys had to be shown how to put on the padding. AImost everyone put his pads on backwards. Our first WIN was at West Liberty, Ky. We left early Friday morning on a school bus. Each boy brought a sack lunch, and the school provided soft drinks. We ate at a rest stop along the highway. A few "fans"
attended, mostly concerned parents. We won 6-0. The boys thought, "Hey, we have a good team!"' (It was West Liberty's first year also, and I knew what we were in for.) We lost all remaining games that first year, and all the games the following year. Our third year was a little better - we won three.
At the beginning of the "fifties", we won 23 straight before being defeated by Waverly, our bitterest rival outside of New Boston.
Looking back on those early years, I really have great respect for the boys and cheerleaders who were a part of our football program. Not a team in our league played under such adverse conditions.

For three years we played our HOME games away from home on the New Boston field. West had only a practice area, hard as concrete, inadequate dressing facilities, a shortage of equipment and first aid material. Coach Christian was my only assistant.

The experience I received and my associations with the boys who took part in the program will always be with me. They had a big impact on my life and the career that followed.

Students need to be made to work and to think as hard in their academic classes as football players are made to work and think on the football field.

Other things they remembered about the school in ' 39 were that they had good athletes and four years of Latin were taught. The senior class colors were gold and purple, and as a parting gift to the new school, the senior class donated shrubbery for landscaping.
