






KENTUCKY HILLS and the U. S. Grant bridge, seen through the bow of the excursion steamer "Senator", provide a picturesque view.





## 1940 Grid Summary

Seven wins, three losses, and a lone tie game gave the Portsmouth Trojans a better than average record for the 1940 edition of the grid machine. The lads opened the season October 13 with a bang as they ran, passed, tackled, and blocked like champions to humble Columbus East, 33 to 0. One week later, however, Durham, N. C., brought one of the most powerful teams seen in these parts for several years to Trojanland, and the southerners took advantage of a blocked kick, a costly fumble, and a pass interception to gain a 21 to 0 victory.


Journeying to Springfield the next Friday the Red and Blue bounced back into the win column with a smashing victory over Springfield, 28 to 7, and continued their winning ways on the road at the expense of Chillicothe, 27 to 0, on October 4. Akron South invaded Municipal Stadium the following Friday and became the fourth victim of Coach Jenkins' charges, the final score being 19 to 6. Snow proved a stumbling block at Youngstown, and the highly favored Trojans barely managed to eke out a 6 to 0 victory over Chaney.

Middletown, always a tough foe but weaker than usual this fall, was beaten by our boys, 12 to 0, on the Middies' own field, but on November 2 the Trojans staged a "track meet" with Huntington East, a new opponent on the schedule, who absorbed a 47 to 0 drubbing. Ironton, traditional up-river rival, on November 15 refused to allow the game to be cancelled even though miserable weather conditions prevailed, and on a snow-covered field managed to hold the selected Troymen to a scoreless tie. Thanksgiving night the Trojans were humming the popular tune, "Can't Get Indiana Off My Mind" after Hammond's juggernaut came out on the long end of the Turkey Day score, 14 to 0. The Jenkinsmen agreed to play Toledo Waite in a charity bowl post-season clash November 25, but life proved anything but a "bowl of cherries" as the Indians in their own back-yard soundly trounced our injury-riddled eleven, 39 to 6.

Fifteen Seniors played their final game for P. H. S. against Waite and will surely be sorely missed next fall by Coach Paul Jenkins. However, considering the unseasonable weather which gave us early snow and late high temperatures, along with the countless injuries which plagued the squad all season, it was another fine chapter in Portsmouth grid history.







# Twelve Teams Toppled By Ellsesser's Lads

# Review of 1940 - 41 Basketball Season

Despite the fact that many ardent fans hesitated to predict the future after the mid-semester graduation of Captain Del Rice, Ken Brady, and Don Horton, our fighting Trojans went on to compile a better than average record of twelve victories and four defeats for the 1940-41 season. It was Coach Peggy Ellsesser's first year at the head of the coaching helm.

Opening the campaign against Marietta at Grant Gym on December 20, the red and blue managed to nose out the Tigers, 21 to 19, and followed with a 38 to 22 win over Akron North one week later. Dayton Roosevelt, first Southern Ohio League foe, bowed to our inspired warriors, 40 to 23, as Del Rice looped 18 points, and local interest soared as Sciotoville, Chillicothe, and Ironton crumbled before the Ellsesser-coached steamroller by the respective scores of 38 to 12, 41 to 12, and 52 to 26. Rice carved a niche in the P. H. S. hall of fame when he scored 27 points at Ironton. Springfield, recognized as one of the state's top-ranking quintets, found the Trojmen definitely "on" and the Wildcats "hit the skids" to the tune of 49 to 21. High point-getters were Joe Babcock and "Sparky" Echols with 10 each. The next night away from home, having played Ironton, Springfield, and Middletown all in the same

week proved too much for our lads and they suffered their first defeat at the hands of the Middies, 35 to 26.

A "breather" in Huntington East, whom the Trojans soundly shellacked, 41 to 9, ten points of which were counted by Herb Swern, gave the "new" team valuable experience, and things looked even brighter when they tripped Ironton, 41 to 12, for their ninth win. However, those same undefeated Middies wrecked Portsmouth's chances of sharing the S. O. L. title when they completely outclassed P. H. S., 37 to 19. Ottie Apel did the best for Peg's five with 7 markers.

Springfield shared second place in the S. O. L. with our boys by virtue of their last-minute victory over them, 36 to 34. Dayton Roosevelt also proved hard to handle, but Bill Williams' basket in the last ten seconds gave the margin for a Trojan win, 29 to 28. Huntington Central handed the Ohio youths their fourth setback, 45 to 39, but Zanesville bowed to Ellsesser's boys in a thriller, 27 to 25.

The Trojans humbled Chillicothe, 33 to 30, in the final game of the regular season, and March 8 begins the fight at the South-eastern District Tournament as a stepping-stone to the State Championship!














