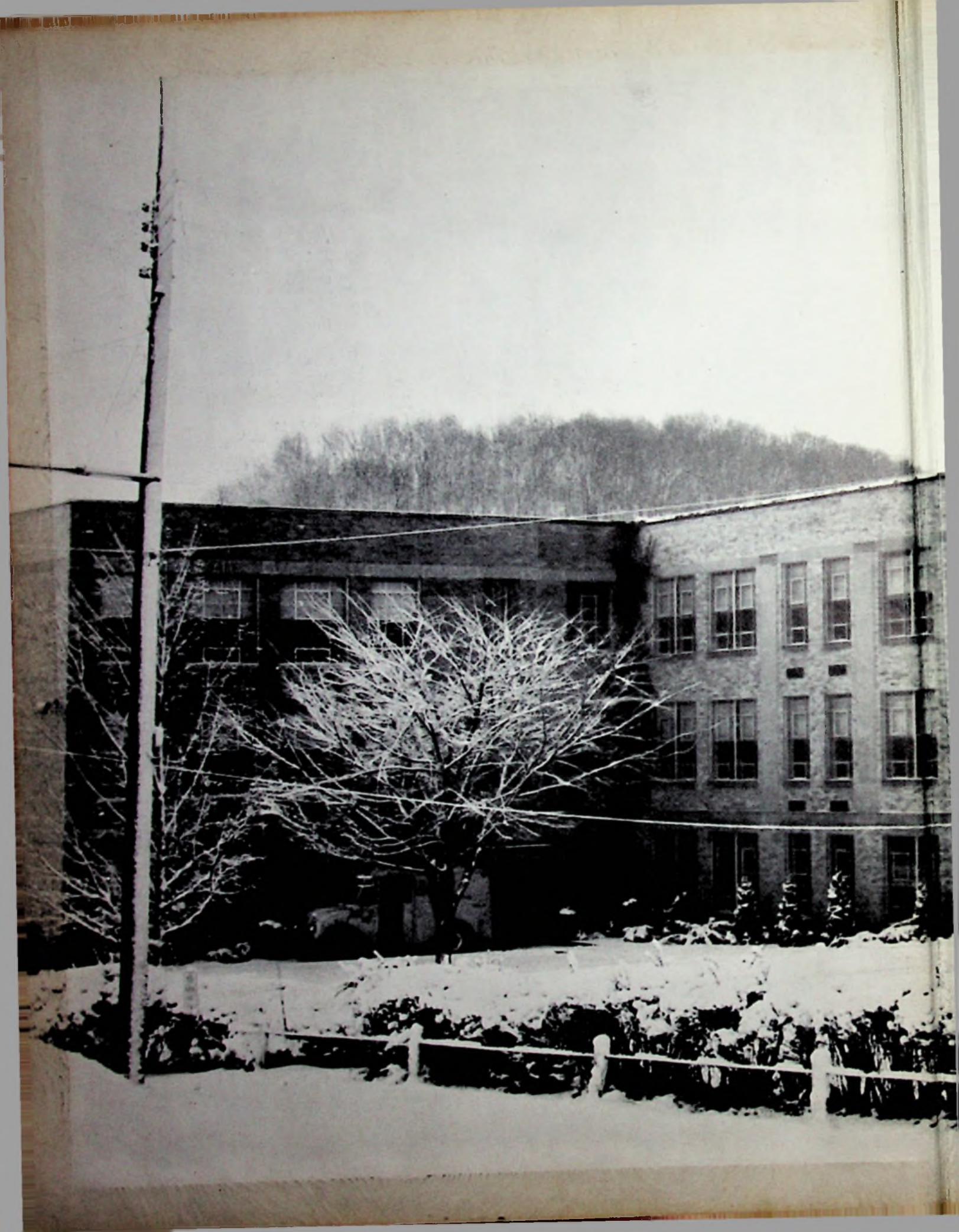

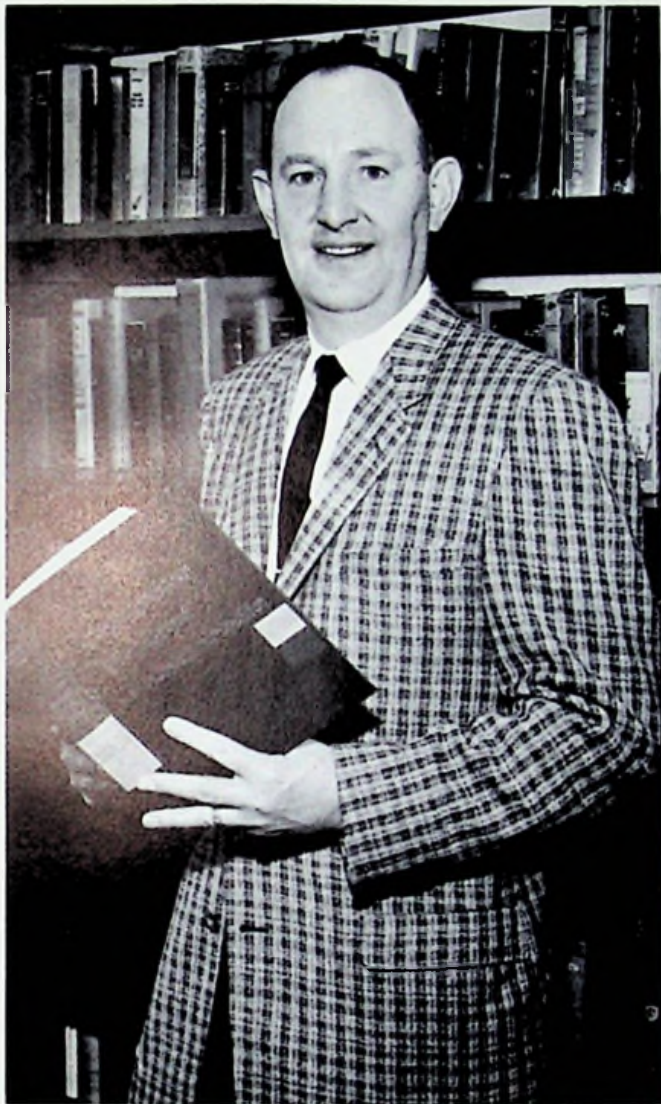

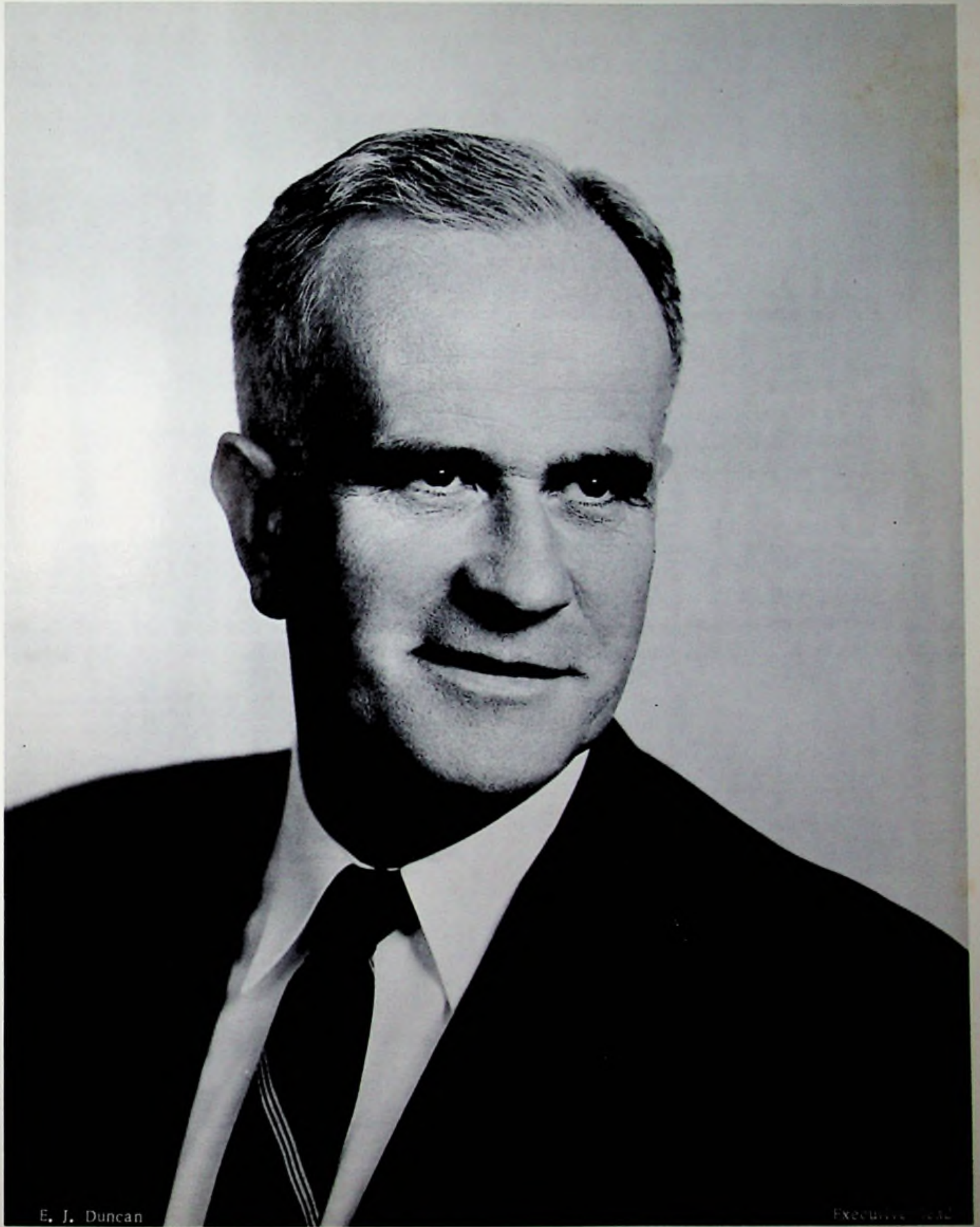
POLICIES

THE TIME OF OUR LIFE

In 1955, we, the Class of '59, began our journey toward our horizon, that one final goal - graduation. In our first high school election we chose Larry Riddlebarger, president; Janet Brisker, vice president; Roger Evans, secretary and Ruthann Adams, treasurer. Our home room representatives to the Student Council were Gayle Pflieger, Glenn Gleim, Jerry Spradlin, and Larry Riddlebarger. We cheered our athletic-minded boys on to victories in both basketball and baseball. Janet Brisker was chosen Homecoming Queen attendant from our class. Many of us will not forget the parades and concerts with the band. Our sponsors for the freshman year were Mr. Hall, Mr. Scott, and Mr. Mitchell.

Guiding us along the second mile of the way was Mr. Lewis, Mr. Pflieger, Mr. Bates. We chose Paul Moore, president; Dave Marcum, vice president; Inez Deemer, secretary; and Jerry Lavender, treasurer. Several of the members of our class were initiated into the Tri-K and Buccaneer clubs. Paul Moore, Jim Krohn, Alice Willis, and Peggy Hutchinson voiced the opinions of the sophomore class as representatives to the Student Council. Virginia Knore represented our class at the Homecoming Game. Carol Shumway and Gayle Pflieger were chosen to cheer our boys along on the basketball court. Janet Brisker won the Scioto County Conservation Essay contest.

We started on our third year with Jim Vogelsong as president; Glenn Gleim, vice president; Alice Willis, secretary and Dail Irwin, treasurer. We had the annual Junior magazine sales with Eugene Risner and Jim Vogelsong as high salesmen. Kay Clifford, Bill McCormick, Jim Vogelsong, and Leon Knore were chosen to represent the class on the Student Council. Some of our classmates received some teaching experience as members of the F. T. A. David George, Darla Martin, Roxie Martin, and Janet Brisker were the Junior representatives to the annual staff. Mary Susan Jenkins was our Junior Homecoming Queen attendant. Gayle Pflieger and Carol Shumway were re-elected to the cheerleading post. There were five Juniors - Roxie Martin, Darla Martin, Janet Brisker, Leon Knore, and Eugene Risner - inducted into the National Honor Society in the spring. With the help of Miss Daily, Mrs. Higgins, and Mr. Wheeler, we presented our class play "Wedding Spells." At the end of the year we gave the seniors the annual banquet and prom with the theme of "Sail Along Silvery Moon." Everyone will agree that this was the most exciting year of all.

As September '58 rolled around we entered school for our final year. Our sponsors were Miss Coriell, Mr. Huffman, and a new teacher, Mr. Mayer. We chose Larry Riddlebarger, president; Glenn Gleim, vice president; Mary Jenkins, secretary and Leon Blackburn, treasurer. Roxie Martin placed tenth in the county on the Senior Scholarship test. Leon Blackburn and Bob Adkins, our basketball co-captains, were chosen for the All-Star team. Alice Willis reigned as Homecoming Queen with Virginia Knore as her senior attendant. 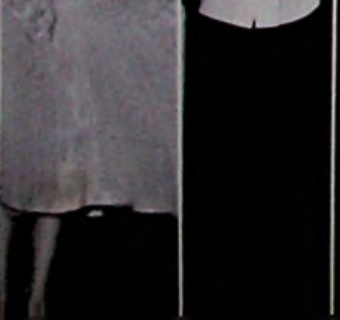

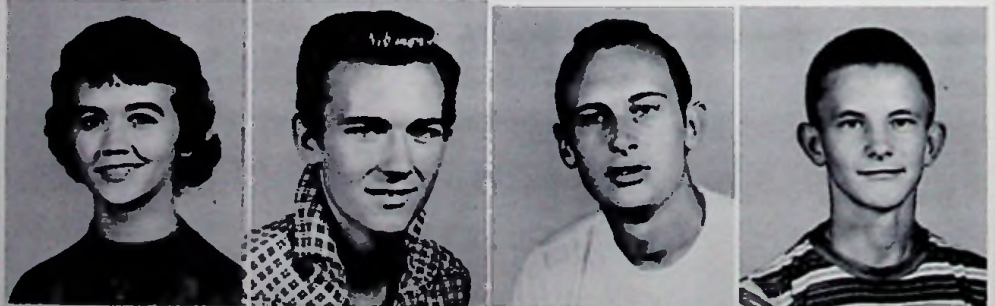

Miss Barker, a junior, won the senior grand award for girls with her biological exhibit called "Hormone Detection of Pregnancy." She will be eligible to compete at the National Science Fair May 9 at Hartford, Conn.

THE OTHER TOP winner is Bill Paul Hunt, a Huntington High School junior, who took the grand award for boys with a biological exhibit entitled "Hypophysectomy and Metabolism of Rats." He, too, is eligible for the Hartford show.

Miss Barker — Minford's second grand award winner in recent years — tops a list of nine Scioto County pupils who were adjudged winners in the fair held in Memorial Field House. A total of 509 exhibits was entered by more than 600 junior and senior high school pupils from Ohio, West Virginia and Kentucky.

A Salute To Science And Sue

Congratulations to Sue Carolyn Barker, Minford High School's second grand award winner, in the Marshall College regional science fair.

Her months and months of study and preparation paid off over the weekend with one of two top awards in the fifth annual competition at Huntington. Now she gets a chance to go for higher honors in the National Science Fair next month at Hartford, Conn.

More than 600 students showed more than 500 exhibits in the science fair. Perhaps one of the students who displayed a mathemati-

cal entry could do a better job of figuring the odds, but Sue Carolyn's chances at taking the top prize were something like 250-1 or 300-1. And that's a pretty high hurdle.

Of course, Sue Carolyn had the benefit of some top-notch instruction. Minford's science staff has turned out two grand award winners in the last five years. The other is Hayes Wilcox, who won in 1956 and now is in his senior year at Ohio State University.

Two grand award winners in five years, plus two more lesser prize winners this year, speaks well for Minford's science teachers.

Our science program paid off again this year at the Regional Science Fair at Huntington, where Sue Barker came away joyously with a Grand Award for her project on the "Hormone Detection of Pregnancy."

This distinction completes a three-year run of grand award winners for Minford. In May Sue, with Mr. Coriell in proud attendance, displayed her project in Hartford, Connecticut, at the National Science Fair, and made many new friends from all over the world. That became a certainty when the Minford Board of Education approved a request of the school's Booster Club that the gridiron sport be initiated with the fall term.

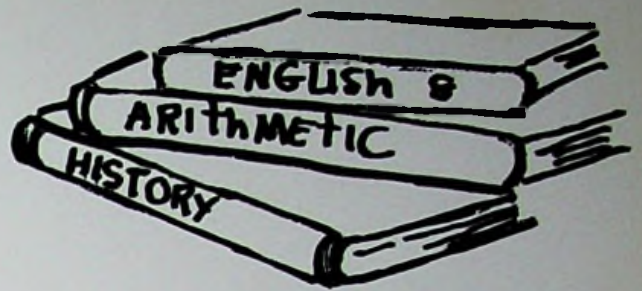
