## Tartans finish off perfect regular season

This year Allard Park received several upgrades, including a new logo and a visiting coaches crow's nest - now it's got a brand new chapionship banner - and a new goal post. For the first time in East history, the Tartans earned back-to-back SOC I football championships with a 12-0 victory over Notre Dame at home. The win also secured the first home playoff game in school history and marks the first 10-0 season for the Tartans since the school broke away from Portsmouth City.

## Ready for Retirement Sciotoville's Sandy Odle leaves after 28 years

Last week was the end of classes at Sciotoville Community School - or East High School, as it's often better known - and while many students will return to face another year of classrooms and teachers, one teacher won't be there to welcome them back.

Sandy Odle, of North Morland, has been a teacher at East High School for 38 years, beginning her career teaching young girls in home economics. The class covered areas such as food, clothing, child development, family relations, home decorating and family finances.
"I had all girls in the classes, and most girls would stay with the classes all four years," Odle said. "Then in about the mid•.70s, we started having male students in the classes. I think the boys realized they needed to know how to cook. The way of life was changing and divorce was more prevalent, and they could no longer expect to have a wife there to take care of them. More women we working and duties at home needed to be shared more."

Today, things are very different, she said. The male/female enrollment in her classes have shifted to nearly 50/50. Technologies have improved dramatically, and cooking also no longer is baking cookies, brownies and pies, but creating a nutritious meal on a limited budget.
"I take them on a shopping trip. They have a $\$ 10$ budget, and they have to plan a full meal and stay within that budget, and they have to incorporate all the basic food groups in their meal. When I first give the assignment, they think, 'No way, you can't do it for \$10.' But then when they get to the store and reading price tags and making choices, they find out they have more than enough," Odle said.

Also, the class no longer is called home economics, but rather family and consumer sciences.

In addition to family and consumer sciences, Odle also taught a senior-level life planning course, to help students learn how to fill out an application, create a resume and prepare them for job interviews.

One of my favorite things is to be out shopping or something, and run into a former student and find out how they're doing and what career path they've chosen," she said. "I specifically remember one time one man came up to me at a football game, and he had been someone that was somewhat trouble in the classroom. He said, 'I'm raising two kids by myself, so I wish I had learned more of what you tried to teach me.'"

Not only a teacher, Odle also spent many years as the cheerleading coach and girls junior high basketball coach - even helping to create the junior high program at East High School in the 1970s.
"That was a real experience," she laughed. "They didn't even know most of the rules, they didn't know anything about playing basketball. Mostly I concentrated on sportsmanship, and Snuffy Smith was the varsity coach, so I just got them to learn the rules and let him be the one to develop their skills."

Odle gave her last class on Wednesday of last week, and said she's looking forward to her retirement as she joins her husband - who's already waiting for her in their new Florida home.

The school hosted a retirement celebration for Odle Tuesday evening at Sciotoville Christian Life Center, across from the school.
"The neatest thing about Sandy is, as I've seen some veteran teachers lose that motivation to meet the needs of kids toward the end of their career, I have seen the oppisite in Sandy Odle. She's worked harder probably in the past eight years with her kids to benefit their futures and their needs," said Sciotoville Community School Principal Dennis DeCamp. "Sandy has been a great proponent for kids, and a great proponent for our school."

Lisa Tom, who worked as a student teacher in Odle's classroom five years ago, now will return to East to pick up Odle's classes for the 2008-09 school year. Like Odle, Tom has her teaching degree from Ohio University.
