DEAR FRIENDS:

The members of the Junior Women's City Club are grateful tonight for your attendance and we sincerely appreciate the splendid cooperation of everyone who has made this entertainment a reality.

Our club was organized in 1930 for the purpose of fostering leadership and developing a spirit of helpfulness in our community. Since that time our main project has been to furnish milk and cod liver oil to under-nourished children of pre-school age. Each year the proceeds from our Charity Ball are used for that purpose. We have contributed to many of the worth while projects in the community such as the Red Cross, Welfare, Girl Scouts, Fresh Air Camp, the sight-saving class at Lincoln School, and others. In fact, all money earned from public subscription is used for welfare work of some sort.

Because the tuberculosis situation in Scioto County has become such a serious one, our members have become interested in the disease and its prevention. Realizing that there is much to be done and that the necessary funds are not available, we have adopted another project, that of purchasing a fluoroscope for use at the Health Center and of conducting an educational campaign for the diagnosis and cure of tuberculosis. The Health Center is soon to have a new building which will provide a room especially for the fluoroscope. The fluoroscope is a very necessary factor in the early diagnosis of tuberculosis. In the past, the X-ray has been used to a good end, but too often the disease is not detected in its early stages. Many times the patient has already infected several other persons in his family. In order to have funds to carry on this campaign, we are presenting for your approval and entertainment, "BROADWAY BOUND."

Without your support this production could not have been possible. To each and every one of you who has encouraged, helped, and supported us, we express our appreciation. To those business firms which have cooperated so splendidly, to members of our cast, to our competent director, and to the members of all committees, we are grateful.

As club women, we feel that our work has been of value to this community, and we hope that with your continued interest and understanding we may be of greater service.

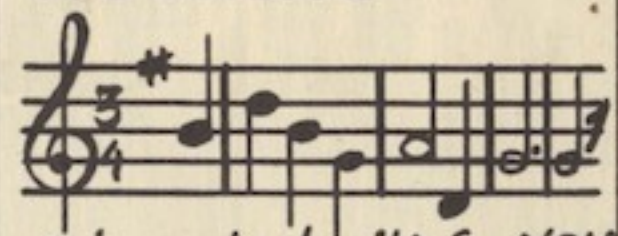
