





TRADE AND INDUSTRIAL EDUCATION

O. M. GWINN Supervisor-Director

The important function of vocational education is to prepare students to enter and advance in a trade or occupation. The instruction consists of three hours each day of study in the "shop" of the student's choice where the correct use of hand and machine tools is taught. The work performed in the shop must be on a useful basis under actual job conditions so far as possible. Students are given individual attention rather than group instruction in their shop training.


Approximately thirty percent of the student's time in school each day is devoted to the study of trade technology which includes shop mathematics, science, blueprint reading, sketching and trade information. These subjects differ from general subjects in that they are designed to apply directly to the chosen trade.

DISTRIBUTIVE EDUCATION PROGRAM

Distributive education is a term used to identify an instructional program in distribution and marketing. Distributive occupations are those followed by business proprietors, managers or employees engaged in marketing or merchandising goods or services. Such occupations may be found in various business establishments, including retailing, wholesaling, manufacturing, storing, transporting, financing, and risk bearing. Distributive education locally attempts to provide the kind and amount of instruction students would need to engage in some aspect of distribution or marketing after leaving school.

Combining Classroom Work and Store Experience . . . We Learn and Earn in Vocational Study Courses

In his senior year, the student works at least 15 hours per week during school time in an approved business establishment. No classes are scheduled in the afternoon when he reports to his job. This work experience acts as a laboratory where he applies the theory he has learned in class.

In class, he studies sales techniques, advertising, merchandise information, credit, personality development, arithmetic, distribution process, and other related topics.

COE TRAINING ON THE JOB The Rewards of Knowing Business Skills May Be Tremendous

The Commercial Coop Class specializes in education for senior girls and boys who are preparing themselves for employment in the city's many business offices. To obtain this type of education, pupils must meet qualifications set up by businesses pertaining to personality, integrity, intelligence, physical fitness, health, appearance, and skills. The classroom program of study includes: office procedures, office machines, business correspondence, filing, and advanced shorthand and transcription.

On-the-job experience is given by the Portsmouth employers who cooperate with the school in a training course to prepare youths for careers in the business field. These students attend school four periods a day for classroom instruction and are on the job for training during the afternoon.

TROJANS FALL TO CHARLESTON STONEWALL JACKSON IN OPENER, 58-18

Municipal Stadium, September 11, 1964

The game was strictly an offensive show, with the visiting Generals piling up 344 yards from scrimmage and another 66 through the air.

The Trojans used Gary Hauth's recovery of a Charleston fumble to post its first score. Steve Duncan started from his own 48, shook away from several tacklers in sweeping his right end and romped into the end zone to complete a 52-yard gallop.

Finally, the Trojans started a sustained drive late in the third quarter with Steve Duncan and Jeff Howland leading the way. The drive was stopped on East's 33-yard line. East was only able to score once more as the Trojan defense tightened. The final touchdown was made in the third quarter on a two-yard dash by Tigerman Wright to complete a 25-yard gain. So ended a bad night for the Trojans.






LANCASTER SCUTTLES PHS IN 27-0 WIN OVER TROJANS

We wish to give credit to the superb running by Steve Duncan and Mike Hughes.


TROJANS SUFFER 7TH DEFEAT AT HANDS OF SPRINGFIELD, 35-0 Springfield, October 23, 1964

WINLESS TROJANS FALL TO FRANKLIN HEIGHTS, 20-0 Columbus, October 30, 1964










ATHENS END TROJAN'S TOURNAMENT HOPES, 70-63 Athens-March 12




ATHLETICS FOR GIRLS

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"THE CHALLENGE OF CITIZENSHIP"

I look at the world through the eyes of an American Teenager. My generation never had to stand in a breadline waiting for food. We have never personally known the pain and horror of war, save what we have read in textbooks or heard from our parents. No one has ever shoved a rifle into our arms. We have never had to choose whether we would actually give our lives in defense of American ideals. But all of these things may someday be required of us, and we must be prepared to meet these challenges head-on.

There is no recipe for instant citizenship. To build the qualities of a good citizen requires many years. In the earliest time of life it is the parents who rear and mold the child, helping him form his first convictions and attitudes. Perhaps this accounts for the high rate of juvenile waywardness today. Too many parents simply don't have the time or the patience to help their children develop a set of high moral values. The formative years a child spends in school provide a tremendous opportunity to create a whole new generation of conscientious Americans. Although the school may do much toward developing a sense of fair play, its goal cannot be reached if the groundwork has not been laid in the home.

Perhaps we tend to underestimate the value of competent instructors during these years. (School presents the first real exposure to the outside world.) A child's teacher represents the first form of authority he has come into contact with after his parents. The teacher sets an example. The single most important attribute he may possess is justice. Many a young person who admired a teacher for his strict though fair manner has grown to adult-hood emulating that former idol.

Eventually individuals arrive at that magic age when they are permitted to drive automobiles, smoke, buy beer, and be married without parental consent. They can do all these things, just as adults, and yet they are not quite adults. Now laid before them is perhaps the most important decision they have had to face during their entire lives. All people must determine for themselves whether they intend to become social parisites or useful, productive citizens of this country.

Finally these people become twenty-one. They are looked upon by society as full-fledged adults. But along with adult privileges go adult responsibilities. We know that every eligible person has a duty to vote, but it is not enough merely to scribble an "X" on the ballot. Voters are challenged to select the very best candidates.

We say we believe in a democracy. But isn't it ironic that after every election some citizens are still violently unwilling to abide by the outcome? All that is asked of them is that they respect the right of majority rule, which, after all, is the very basis of our governmental system!

We have thus far traced the growth of an American from a baby to a voting citizen, but the cycle is not complete. Nor, in fact, will it ever be complete, for as we grow, rear children, and finally pass on, there is an overlapping generation to fill the void we have left. But ... Will we be ready to take over where our predecessors left off?

I plead with the leaders and adults of today—take care in what you do! Consider what kind of planet you are going to leave in the hands of your children! We shall make mistakes of our own, for we are human, and we shall be responsible for them. But please don't force us to pay a penalty for things we cannot control. Would you place a live bomb in the hands of an infant?

In the final analysis, the challenge for our time is to improve our country, and in turn our world, to remove the gnawing doubts, the violence, the hatred, the narrowmindedness of men.

We have a chance to improve upon the past, to correct the errors of the present, and to lay a solid foundation for the future. The youth of today must accept this challenge, so then history will look upon America as the society that advanced the world instead of one that nearly destroyed it!


TROJAN LIBRARY CLUB


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

OUR SCHOOL PARTICIPATES IN THE AMERICANS ABROAD PROGRAM

TROJAN AMBASSADORS OF FRIENDSHIP

The Americans Abroad Programs involve family and school experiences. They are not travel tours or "fun" trips. Students are abroad for approximately one year. Students leave the U.S. at any time from June, 1965, to early September, 1965, depending on the opening date of the schools in their host country. Return dates are dependent also on the host country's school system and range from June, 1966 to August, 1966.

Qualifications for all candidates include: excellent health, U.S. citizenship, class in school (must be members of the Junior or Senior class), language (at least two years of foreign language study), age (at least 16 by December 31, 1964), and academic record.

STUDENT EXCHANGE HIGHLIGHT OF PHS SOCIAL STUDIES CLUB

Sponsorship—Miss Mary Krausz

One of the best-known and largest foreign study programs for high school students is sponsored by the American Field Service. AFS arranges the exchange of high school juniors and seniors between the U.S. and countries of Europe, Latin America, and Asia. This year 304 such U.S. students studied under this program in 25 different countries.

Under the AFS program, travel expenses are usually paid by hometown communities. Overseas the U.S. students live with local families and attend local schools. In exchange, foreign students live with U.S. families in the participating communities, and attend local U.S. schools.






A highlight of the Hi-Y program is the annual Youth In

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
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OUR SCHOOL, PORTSMOUTH HIGH






