












FANS CHEER AS PHS TRAMPLES IRONTON Municipal Stadium—September 17, 1965


Head coach Carl Benhase has directed the PHS Football Trojans for the past two years. Before coming to PHS he was head football coach at Hanover College in Indiana.


ZANESVILLE OVERPOWERS TROJANS, 34-8 Municipal Stadium—September 24, 1965


The speedy Blue Devil backfield took charge and moved against the Trojans after two minutes of play in the first quarter. PHS responded by easily moving






The Trojans moved the ball well all through the

TROJANS DROP CLOSE ONE TO ASHLAND 65-64 PHS Gym—Dec. 10, 1965






National Honor Society



Out on the court the players are warming up. Talking, laughing, and milling around, crowds of fans await the beginning of the game. Suddenly there is a hush. As the lights dim, spotlighted in the darkness is the flag of the United States of America. Everyone stands a little straighter, holds himself a little taller. The talking and laughing cease as the spectators honor the flag of the United States.

In such displays of public reverence for our flag and by thoughtful teachings in the home, the American youth learns, from his earliest years, the respect and loyalty due the Stars and Stripes—the flag that represents "our land of the free and home of the brave."

But outward respect is not enough; for how long will this land be that of the free and is America truly the home of the brave?

In past generations these questions were undeniably answered—answered by the pounding guns and tramping feet of our fathers and forefathers fighting to make this country the great nation that it is-truly the greatest nation on earth! Every American did his part to bring "our boys" home victorious. Planting victory gardens and buying war bonds exemplify but two of a vast number of ways that Americans rose to the vital challenge of democracy in a war-torn world.

Today the phrases "peace in our time," "making the world safe for democracy," and "a war to end wars" seem to mean little to those for whom they actually were spoken.

The ears of my generation appear deafened by the false beliefs that "freedom is forever" and "communism could never happen in America." We, the youth of America, and as such, apprentices to the adult citizens, hold in our hands the future of the world. We must keep ourselves well-informed about both national and world situations. We must influence others by our example to become champions of democracy. We must profit from the teachings and from the mistakes of our parents and elders. In these ways we will become true Americans, thus preparing ourselves to accept the challenge of democracy as adults capable of making those decisions which will keep democracy alive and working.

Can the suffering and tragedy of war have touched our lives so distantly that we have forgotten the value of our freedom and the price that we may one day

be forced to pay for our neglect? Must we, too, fight a World War before we prove ourselves worthy of our tremendous heritage? This can not be! In our nuclear age World War would mean only total destruction-not freedom's salvation but its annihilation!

As long as men live, the dream of freedom shall never die; the spirit of liberty cries out to every race in every age. Man's body may be enslaved, but his spirit shall never be conquered.

The burning of draft cards and the anti-U.S. demonstrations in our own country are dangerously weakening our American image, as is the apparent decline in moral and spiritual values. We teen-agers must lead the way back by showing our patriotism, by backing our men at the front with letters and encouragement, and most of all by our own enthusiastic and sincere belief in them. How long will it take for our enemies to overcome our way of life if we continue to let the sordid actions of a few speak for us? We may not really believe in what they say and do, but if we are silent we seem to.

We must speak out against poor citizenship in every form. We must live cleanly new generation, willing and able to keep America strong and free. DOTTIE BERNDT


