Over and over again, repetition, monotony, memorization; mechanical as the motions were, they made assemblies and fire drills seem like extravaganzas.









Friendships thrived in a somewhat hectic atmosphere. Boys daily ran the risk of tardiness by walking girls to classes far from their own.























