## Potent Defense Helps Offense

The Senators enjoyed another fine gridiron season with an of fense that averaged 25 points per game. The defensive unit complemented the offense as they posted six shutouts en route to a nifty 7-3 season mark. West's defense yielded but 6.7 points per game shutting out their opponents in the first quarter of every game. Posting three consecu-
tive whitewash wins to open their season, the Senators fell victim to Notre Dame Titans in game four, 9-0. West then reeled off four straight victories. During that stretch, the "Orange Crush," as they became known to their fans, allowed just eight points. The final two weeks of the schedule saw the Senators losing 20-7 to Wheelersburg and 30-

0 to state-ranked Reading Community of Cincinnati. The new stadium for the second season, housed large home crowds as the team enjoyed tremendous fan support. In fact during the Wheelersburg contest, followers lined the sidelines to witness the decisive Southern Ohio Conference game.

shortly afterward scored again to lead 13-0. Greenup County scored just prior to the first-half end when the action was halted due to rain.

In game two of the season, West found themselves trailing 21-0 at halftime to the Green Bobcats. The Senators outplayed Green 12-0 in the second half but lost 21-12.

West seemingly peaked at this point of the season as they posted back-to-back shutouts against Notre Dame and Northwest.

The final two games were close ones with the Senators on the losing end. Wheelersburg edged West 12-6 and Rock Hill squeezed out an 8-0 triumph.
