Mrs. Kitt's class received the call to help out Kirby's flower shop, and they readily accepted. The flower shop wanted the students to fill the aquapics for preparation for the





criteria. After completing this dish, the groups sat down and feasted on their new creations. Jimmy may have won this time, but Eric is determined to beat him during the next cooking challenge.



























