
Again, in October, the Portsmouth High School Band received a superior rating in the Tri-State Marching Band Festival held in Huntington, W. Va.





September 8, 1978

P.H.S. at Cincinnati LaSalle

TROJANS OVERWHELMED BY POWERFUL LASALLE

Trojans 0 LaSalle 34

The Portsmouth Trojans opened up their 1978 Football slate on the wrong foot, visiting the mighty class AAA LaSalle Lancers in Cincinnati. The Lancers dominated throughout the game.

The Lancers opened up their scoring spree on a 4 yard run by Walton in the first quarter, but it was a disasterous second quarter that put the Trojans out of sight. LaSalle scored 3 touchdowns in that quarter on a series of short drives initiated by several Trojan fumbles. Portsmouth fought LaSalle to a scoreless tie in the 3rd quarter with a fine display of defense and surrendered a solo touchdown to the home team in the 4th quarter. (It was the worst defeat for P.H.S. in 48 games and the first shutout since 1973). Portsmouth had 7 first downs and completed 7 of 14 passes for 41 yards. No Trojan runner carried the ball for more than 15 yards. Scott Burrows was voted the CIT player of the week.

TROJANS CLAWED BY TIGERS

The P.H.S. Trojans suffered their second straight shutout of the season Friday night at Spartan Stadium before a near capacity crowd against the Ironton Tigers. Neither team looked impressive, both being plagued by turnovers, although the Tigers suffering less than the Trojans. The game was very sloppily played with a total of ten turnovers in the contest. The Trojans suffered physical hurt also, with quarterback, Kirk McMahon, suffering a bruised shoulder, tight end Scott Burrows, a broken nose, and Mike Bratchett, a sprained neck.

The two teams traded turnovers, with Ironton coming out ahead 9-0 at the half, but it was a decisive second half that put the Trojans away with Ironton exploding for 20 points. The Trojans are yet to score in the young season, but have allowed their opponents a total of 63 points. A bright spot in the contest was the overwhelming performance by Floyd Cook who returned five kicks for a total of 103 yards. The Trojans will try to get back on their feet next Friday against Barboursville. Craig Wright was voted the CIT player of the week.

The game was summed up as a defensive struggle with good defensive efforts from Bc Kinskey and Scott Burrows of the Trojans. Barboursville's only score was a two-yard run by Pirate quarterback Chris White in the first quarter. Portsmouth's lone score came from a high snap from the center that put the Pirate punter in the end zone where he was dropped by Lynn Fuller and Bill Bickman of the Trojans for a safety. P.H.S. remains without a victory in the season. Floyd Cook was voted the CIT player of the week.

TROJANS LOSE TO LIONS

The Portsmouth Trojans drop their 1978 homecoming game to the Boyd County Lions by a score of 14 to 8. Mental mistakes and missed assignments were blamed for the defeat.

Boyd County put the first points on the board within the 5 minutes of the game, but the usual magnificent running game of the Lions which was 400 yards rushing in a single outing was held to a meager 135 led by defensive men, Brett Jordan and Chris Payton. In the fourth quarter the Trojans scored their first touchdown of the season by an 83 yard return of a Lion kickoff by Wyatt Taylor. Floyd Cook ran for the conversion points to put a total of 8 points on the board for the Trojans with 8:19 left on the clock. After that, neither team could move the ball, and the clock ran out with the ball in the Lion's possession. Chris Payton was voted the CIT player of the week.


MUSKETEERS STAB TROJANS

P.H.S. seemed to get a spark of life in the second half as Grant Montgomery scored on an explosive 45 yard run early in the third quarter. Greenup County followed up with a TD and an extra point to end the scoring. There was a noticable improvement in the Trojan defense from the first half to the second half, allowing Greenup County

Huntington East started the scoring late in the first period when PHS was forced into their own endzone resulting from a fumble causing a safety in Huntington East's favor. Later in the first half the Highlanders scored two touchdowns followed by extra points putting the Highlanders with a halftime lead of 16-0 over the Trojans. The Highlanders opened the scoring in the second half with another touchdown and extra point in the third period. A Trojan fumble set up another Highlander score.

The lone Trojan score came on a blocked kick by Danny Hosey which he recovered on the Highlander two-yard line. Kirk McMahon scored on a two-yard dart, but the extra point try failed, the score was 29-6 in favor of Huntington East. The Highlanders scored once more to push the final score to 35-6. Trojan turnovers cost the Men of Troy the game. Danny Hosey was voted the CIT player of the week.

The Portsmouth High School Trojans came out on the short end of the stick, scoring the most points in one game all season, but also giving up the most points in one game during the '78 grid season. They were blitzed by an amazing ground attack from Huntington, who racked up 300 yards on the ground to Portsmouth's 22. But one of the bright spots in the game was a fine serial show from Junior Kirk McMahon, who hit for 12 out of 22 passes for 169 yards and a touchdown.

The Trojan defense held the ponies to a 0-0 score in the first quarter, but was cracked for 2 TD's in the second, and 15-0 deficit at halftime. The Ponies controlled the ball almost all of third quarter, mounting up two long drives resulting in touchdowns and a 29-0 score at the end of three quarters of play. Then Trojan offense got fired up in the fourth quarter, rolling up two touchdowns, one on an outstanding run by Grant Montgomery, and a 42 yard bomb from Junior QB Kirk McMahon, coming back from a nagging shoulder injury, to Lynn Fuller. The tries for extra points failed and P.H.S. trailed 29-12. But the Ponies, still hungry for points, broke a 60 yard run for a touchdown, and recovered an onside kick and struck for another TD on the last play of the game on a 37 yard scoring strike. Kirk McMahon was voted the CIT player of the week.

Mental and physical mistakes brought on the 34-12 defeat of the

Portsmouth Trojans squad administered by the Ashland Tomcats. It was the 8th consecutive defeat this year for the winless Trojans, who fell behind early in the game on a roughing the kicker call as Ashland was about to punt the ball. It gave the Tomcats a second chance which was all they needed to move the ball in for a score and an 8-0 lead. It was a defensive struggle the rest of the way through the first half with no score for either team.

The second half proved disastrous for the Trojans as the Tomcats exploded for 26 points to the Trojans' 12. Three of their scores were on turnovers. One on an interception, and the other two on fumble recoveries. The Trojans, though, would never-say-die and came back with two long McMahon to Burrows touchdown passes, totaling 68 yards between them. Ashland tacked on 1 more touchdown for a 34-12 final score. Scott Burrows was voted the CIT player of the week.

In the second half, Russell scored again on a blocked punt and notched the score to 21-0. Russell's final score came on an interception which put the Red Devils on the 17 yardline. Five plays later they scored and an extra point kick boosted Russell's lead to 28-0. The lone Trojan score came on a ten yard pass from Donald Richardson to Lynn Fuller. The try for the extra point failed and the final score stood, Russell 28, PHS 6. A good performance was shown by leading rusher Grant Montgomery who tallied 88 yards. Richard Jordan was voted the CIT player of the week.


TROJANS TOPPLE TO TIGERS SEASON ENDS IN DISTRICT FINAL 52-54
