


Brittany Prater Miss River Days Pageant





The Pirates concluded the 2009 golf season triumphantly with their second consecutive SOC Championship, finishing with an overall record of 72-21. They finished their conference schedule unscathed, with a 34-0 record against SOC II opponents. Their season low score of 153 came during the critical time of SOC play at Shawnee, giving them a lead they would not relinquish. Webb Ballard's 37, Kyle Cline's 38, and a pair of 39s from Casey Pennington and Nathan Rawlins paved the way for an eventual 40-stroke victory over 2nd place West, Four starters earned All-SOC honors. 








First District Championship Title VARSITY VOLLEYBALL

The Lady Pirates compiled a record of 22-4 (12-2) as they earned the SOC Division II Runner-Up title, Sectional Championship title, and their first District Championship title.
