He taught five years at New Boston grade school, five years at Glenwood High, four years at Wheelersburg High.



The Central Catholic Titans were our next victims. This game was predicted to be close, but ended up far from it. The Tigers had an easy victory with a final score of 37-7.




The season record thus stood New Boston 6 wins and 4 loses.








GARY BOREN - Guard and Center. Gary played terrific ball during the season and scored 269 points. Gary's defensive ability proved to be a great factor for our success.
