




RIVER DAYS - AMBER BUSSA

In Memory of Mr. Robert Schwamberger








January 12, 1950 -- April 13, 2006

Mr. Robert (Bob) Schwamberger, 56, of Wheelersburg, died Thursday, April 13, 2006, at his residence. A 1967 graduate of WHS, he graduated from Morehead State University (B.S. Ed.) and from the University of Dayton (M.A. in Ed. Admin.) Mr. Schwamberger was a dedicated educational leader, classroom teacher, administrator, coach, and friend. As an educator, Mr. Schwamberger dedicated his life to his love for children. He became a full time teacher at Wheelersburg where he impacted the lives of many for the past 28 years. At Wheelersburg, he was a Social Studies teacher at both the middle and high schools and formerly aught driver's education. Administratively, Mr. Schwamberger had served as Assistant High School Principal and Elementary Principal. In athletics, Coach Schwamberger served as unior high football coach and arsity assistant football coach. He tarted the girls' junior high pasketball program and later served as girls' varsity basketball coach. He was also a former golf coach at WHS. He is remembered by his student athletes for his impact on heir lives that extends beyond the ield of competition. His current students and colleagues will miss his

STUDENT COUNCIL



After elections were held in early September, the 2005-2006 members of Student Council got to work. The members completed their Pirate Card fundraiser to cover the entire year's expenses. Council and Y.E.S. members led a district-wide donation project for Hurricane Katrina victims raising over \$3,000. Student Council sent 13 boxes to Operation Christmas Child and donated \$700 to the Wheelersburg Toy Drive for WHS classmates. Support for Mr. Schwamberger and his family was given throughout the year and a special memorial plaque and \$500 donation to the scholarship fund was given in memory of Mr. Schwamberger who died on April 13, 2006. Student Council ended their work for the year with the retirement assembly held on May 17, 2006, to honor retirees Mrs. Craig and Mr. Keller.











In a season opener that had the makings of a classic, the Pirates were narrowly defeated by the Ironton Tigers. After scoring in the third quarter after recovering a blocked field goal, the Pirates took the lead 6-0. Ironton finally scored in the 4th quarter taking the lead 7.6. The Pirates drove back down the field until penalties slowed the drive and an interception in the final minutes sealed the win for Ironton. The Pirates, reeling from an 0-2 record, returned home to Ed Miller Stadium to do battle with the Valley Indians. It was the Pirates' defense that stole the spotlight of this game, shutting out the Indians. After a late third quarter score, it all went down hill for the Indians as the Pirates scored 27 unanswered points in their first victory of the year. The Pirates, going into a must win game to keep playoff hopes alive, came out firing and didn't let a rain delay slow them down as they went on to defeat the previously undefeated Boyd County Lions, 35-18. Beginning SOC action, the Pirates wasted no time in what became a 41-0 rout of the Falcons. It started on the Pirates' first offensive play when Brandon White broke into open field for a touchdown. The Pirates started rolling and went in at halftime with a score of 41-0. In a classic rivalry matchup, the Pirates made short work of the Trojans. After recovering a fumbled kickoff, the Pirates scored on the first play from scrimmage. The defense allowed what had been a powerful Trojans offense to score only six points. Before the night was over the Pirates had scored 48 points in what became a shellacking of the Trojans. As the Pirates suited up for football action against Waverly, the rain continued to pour, but the Burg just kept on trucking in their 41-6 victory over the Tigers. The Pirates won their third SOC game and continued their winning streak by defeating the Northwest Mohawks 46-0. Starting quarterback John Storey was injured and sophomore Dustin Cook filled in and, after shaking off some first quarter jitters, the Pirates started rolling, scoring 46 unanswered points on the night. Then in a battle for the ages, the WHS Pirates won their 26th SOC Championship defeating West, 14-7. Playing in thick mud the Pirates managed to rack up 242 yards behind the offensive line. It was the defense that shone when held West in the red zone on 4th down with seconds left to secure the Pirate victory. In playoff action, the Pirates fought back in the second half against Centerburg but fell one touchdown short. The Pirates finished their season at 8-3 and as SOC II Champions.










VARSITY & JV VOLLEYBALL







VARSITY & JV SOCCER

The Pirate soccer team got off to a good start in the preseason facing several opponents in the Ohio Cup summer tournament in Cincinnati. After an opening game tie with Piketon which forced the Pirates to change GK Nate Prosch due to a head injury, the Pirates earned their first win and shutout of the season against Minford 5-0 and their second shutout with a 3-0 blanking of the Northwest Mohawks with Chase Schwalbach picking up a hat trick. In their first match-up of the season against rival Waverly, the Pirates were defeated 1-3 in a very physical game. Senior Drew Sampson picked up his first hat trick of the season behind his 5 goals in the 12-0 routing of Valley. The Pirates rebounded from a loss to New Boston by downing Minford 3-0 as the second half of the season continued. Senior Derrick Gleim paced the Pirates with a hat trick as the Pirates defeated the Mohawks, 6-0. Matt Coburn, a first-year junior, played in goal for the first time in his career and shared the duty with senior Joe Days. In the second match up with Waverly, the two teams played a scoreless match until just 12 minutes remained in the first half. With 26:53 remaining in the game, the Pirates tied the score but the Tigers scored again at 9:48 for the SOC championship. With 3 assists in the 7-1 win over Greenup Co., Drew Sampson tied the WHS record for Most Assists in a Career. The record of 71 was held by Dustin Sampson, Drew's brother, who played from 1993-1996. The assists total also placed Drew in the Top 10 on the OHSAA all-time assist list. In a 1-1 tie with South Webster, Matt Coburn recorded 12 saves at keeper and then picked up his first shutout in their 3-0 win over South Point. Senior Craig Chaffin made his mark against West scoring a goal and assisting on two others as the Pirates finished the regular season with a 3-1 win, a 2nd place in SOC II, and a record of 10-4-2 (8-3-1). In the Division III sectional final, Wes Lyon proved his value as the sophomore scored two goals and assisted on the other two as the Pirates defeated New Boston 4-2 for the championship title and the right to advance to the district tournament. Drew broke the WHS record with his 72nd assist in the win. In the district, the Pirates jumped out to an early lead when Drew hit Wes for a header only 27 seconds into the game. However the Pirates hit the target only once in the 7-1 loss to the Zane Trace Pioneers. The Pirates will graduate 8 seniors including four-year starter Drew Sampson, and three-year starters Craig Chaffin and Scott Dials. Head Coach Paul Boll completed his 20th season as the Pirates ended with an overall 11-5-2 record.





VARSITY BOYS' BASKETBALL

The 2005-2006 boys basketball season was one of the most successful in school history, marking the team's 5th trip to the final four. Though the season got off to a slow start with an early season SOC loss to Northwest, the boys were able to re-group and end up with a record of 23-3. In the last season game, the Pirates revenged their earlier season loss to South Webster with a 84-67 victory that propelled them into their deep tournament run. The team was able to breeze through sectional and district play, defeating Fairland 82-42 at the Convo to clinch the team's 14th district title. The regional tournament proved to be much tougher for Coach Barrick and the boys. They were able to pull out hard-fought and memorable wins against Chesapeake in the semis and Ironton in the finals. 




JV-FRESHMAN BOYS BASKETBALL






BASKETBALL CHEERLEADERS




SWIMMING





dy Pirates opened the season with four wins prior to the first Wheelersburg-West clash. Unfortunately, the Pirates would not overcome the deficit despite scoring two runs with two outs in the bottom of the seventh and took the 2-3 loss, their first SOC loss as well. The girls learned their lesson in the loss and went to work to change what was needed. 





The Pirates began the season as the defending SOC II champions and returned seven seniors to lead the team. WHS won their first meeting with rival Minford to start conference play. In a tri-match with Portsmouth and Zane Trace, the Pirates ran their winning streak to 12 games and had not lost since their first game of the season. After senior John Storey hit two homers against Zane Trace, Dustin Cook followed up with two of his own against PHS, including a grand slam in the third inning to take the lead. With their second SOC championship in hand due to a 12-0 conference record, the Pirates claimed a 9-2 win over Northwest and picked up their 20th win of the season. In the 13-1 win over Oak Hill to end the regular season, senior Calebb Proehl was a perfect 4 for 4 at the plate, including a grand slam in the bottom of the fifth to end the game. For much of the season, the Pirates had relied on their high-powered offense as the team rolled on to the SOC title. However, the Pirate defense shone and made an early lead last as they beat New Lexington 2-1 in the Divison III district semifinal. Probably the play of the game was the diving catch made by Alex Wamsley in left field in the second inning to record the out. The Pirates had grown tired of winning close games and after an 8-run first inning, they were assured that the district final against Zane Trace wouldn't be close while on their way to a 16-6 victory. The Pirates made their first trip since 2000 to the regional tournament at the V.A. Memorial Stadium in Chillicothe. WHS beat West Lafayete Ridgewood

4-0 in the regional semifinal behind undefeated pitcher Justin Stegman (12-0) and a veteran ball club. The next day the Pirates met Marion Pleasant in the regional championship. WHS gave their all, including an attempt to steal home by Brandon White and a headfirst slide into first by John Storey, unfortunately the Pirates lost 1-2. WHS ended their season

26-6, picked up SOC II, sectional and district championships and amassed more than 70 wins to just 16 losses for the seniors over the past four years.



GIRLS' TRACK

The Lady Pirates began the season under new leadership as Assistant Coach Paul Boll became the Head Coach. Senior leadership was found in Amber Bussa, Chelsey Conley, Jan Spaulding, and Jessie Sexton. The Lady Pirates went on to earn nine first place finishes for the season's meets. At the Wheelersburg Invitational, the girls were edged for first place by Oak Hill in Division III, 92.3 points to 91.3 points. Amber Bussa was the high-point medalist with 36 points. Amber also claimed high point medalist in all of the seasons meets. In the SOC meet, the Lady Pirates finished second and Amber earned the high point award with 33 as she won the 100-meter hurdles for the fourth year in a row. Amber and Brittany Warner competed in the Jesse Owens Track Classic held at OSU. Amber placed third in the long jump with an effort of 15' 7 1/2". The Lady Pirates won the Division III district title in a close meet at Rock Hill, beating Belpre and Valley by only three points. Qualifying for the regional meet were Amber Bussa, Jan Spaulding, Faith Morgan, and Kyleigh Miller who placed fourth in the 1600-meter relay; Jan, Kyleigh, Sarah Allen and Brittany Warner placed 2nd in the 3200-meter relay; Kyleigh also placed fourth in the 800-meter run; and Amber placed in three individual events that included 2nd in the long jump, 1st in the 100-meter hurdles and 2nd in the 300-meter hurdles.
















The Pirates returned a large number of athletes from last year's team, including five seniors. The Pirates took first place in Division II at the Wheelersburg Invitational with a score of 112.5, defeating its nearest opponent, Piketon, by 40.5. Seniors Nick Warner and Jared Campbell, and the 800 meter relay team, all took first place. WHS has not lost its home invitational since 1994. Nick Warner won two events at the Annual Jesse Owens Track Classic held at OSU. He won the discus toss with a personal best effort of 158' 9" and won the shot put with a throw of 51' 3". Jared Campbell's toss of 50' 7 1/2" claimed 2nd place. Going into the SOC meet, the Pirates had claimed nine first place finishes during the season and came away with a second place finish in the SOC II. The boys finished runner-up in the Division II district meet and qualified 10 Pirates to go to the regional. At the regional meet, senior Nick Warner earned 2nd in the discus with a throw of 153' 8", and placed 4th in the shot with 52' 5 1/2" to qualify him for the Division II state meet. In the state shot put, Nick came in 8th with a throw of 51' 4 1/2" for a place on the podium. In the discus, Nick qualified for the finals in 9th place, but was unable to move onto the podium as his throw of 148' 10" kept him in 9th place. We are proud of his accomplishments!








