The Trojans lost a heart breaker to Greenup County 2I-19; but really beat themselves because of a few mistakes. Mike Parker scored from 2 yards out and Estep hit Duncan for a 28 yard TD to go up 13-0. Greenup scored with 30 seconds left in the half and got an easy score set up by fumbled punt at their own 1 yard line. The Trojans came back as Parker scored on an 11 yard run, but Greenup scored to go up and withstood a last minute Trojan drive to hold on. Estep threw for 220 yards and Chris Duncan caught 6 passes for 150 yards.

The Trojans came back after being down 21-0 to defeat Galli-
polis 32-27. Estep threw for 274 yards and 2 TD's. Duncan caught 6 passes for 134 yards and a 12 yard TD, and Apel caught 5 passes for 104 yards and a 46 yard TD Parker rushed for 68 yards and 2 TD's and had 75 yards receiving along with his game winning 75 yard interception return for a TD.

The Trojans beat Russell 28-6 on a rainy and slippery night. Aaron Shabazz rushed 199 yards and scored three TD's on runs of 30 . 62 , and 3 yards. The other TD was a 42 yard run by Parker, who finished with 89 yards rushing.
The Trojans battled hard but came up on the short end of a 26 18 loss to a stronger Ashland team. The Trojans led at halftime 6-0 with the score coming on a Estep to Duncan pass of three yards. The Trojans scored to lead 12-6 as

as Parker scored on a 1 yard plunge. Estep hit Shabazz for a 73 yard T.D. for the Trojans last lead 18-13, as the Tomcats strength overtook the Trojans. Ashland went on to go 14-1 and win the state in Kentucky.

The Trojans lost another heartbreaker to rival Ironton 20-12 in front of a large crowd. The Trojans missed many opportunities and had some controversial calls against them in the contest. The Trojans down $14-0$ at the half came out firing as Estep hit Apel for a 53 yard gain and Duncan for a 10 yard T.D. $t 0$ narrow the margin to 14-7. A controversial roughing the kicker call set up lronton's final T.D. and the Trojans scored on 3 yard shuffle pass from Estep to Parker. Estep finished with 236 yards passing and Apel and Duncan finished with 98 and 71 yards receiving on the night. Shabazz had 97 yards rushing and 2 scores and Parker had 123 yards and 2 T.D.'s In the game Estep broke his school record by throwing his I 5th T.D. pass of the year and Chris Duncan broke his school record for most receptions and T.D. receptions in a season by making his 41 st catch and making his 8 th T.D. catch of the season.

The Trojans gained an ugly win on Homecoming night by beating Germantown Valley View 28-21. Matt Apel intercepted a pass and ran it back 30 yards for the first score. Estep then hit Duncan for a 20 yard T.D. Shabazz ran for 118 yards and 1 T.D. and Parker ran for 83 yards on the night. The Spartans went ahead 21-20 at the close of the third quarter, but Estep connected with Estep who outleaped the defender in the endzone to pull down the 20 yard T.D. catch and put the Trojans up 28-21 for good.

The Trojans went into the game needing a lot of help from other teams to make the playoffs and a win over Miami Trace. They destroyed the Panthers $50-21$ in the final game for the seniors. Mike Parker ran for over 100 yards and scored 4 T.D.'s on runs of $4,51,21$, and 12 yards. Shabazz also went for 100 yards and scored 3 T.D.'s on runs of 18.36 , and 4 yards.

The Trojans didn't make the playoffs, but with aa couple of breaks here and there, they very well could have been. Tke Trojans finished 7-3 under 2 nd year coach Curt Clifford and 6 th in the computer rankings in their region, with the top 4 going to the playoffs. The Trojans football progam is a class act now and strives on discipline. weightlifting, conditioning, and fumdamentals. The 7-3 record of the 1990-91 team goes down with the ' $75, ~ ' 80, ~ ' 84$, and, ' 88 teams as the only Trojans team the past 20 years with a record of 7.3 or better.
