


National Honor ciety Inducts 7







Ohio State Poet Comes To West


















Curtain Rises On New Scene


Desire And Pride Motivate Young Team...

Seniors Honored For Academic Excellence, Creative Talent and Hard Work








SAE Goes Into Action









Dillow And Smedley Win Chopin And Sousa Awards
