

It seems to us, the Senatorian staff, that we can learn much from those around us who are having to reconstruct their lives to overcome the obstacles created by the closing of the bridge.






Miss River Days candidate, worked during the summer to fund her float and wardrobe, and she placed as second runner-up in the contest.


Portsmouth West was well represented, with the

majorettes winning a first and the band a second place, in these activities that are so special because they signal the end of summer and the beginning of a brand new school year.








River Days proved to be a rewarding time with the band winning the 2nd place trophy in AA competition and the majorettes winning the first place trophy.
















LIBRARY — The Room With A View










West Football is Drive, Determination and Dedication

Coach Tipton's 1978 football boys provided West fans with another spirited season. The cheerleaders and the Pep Club kept the halls filled with colorful banners urging the Big Orange to "CRUSH". At mid-season the Senators had faced the toughest part of their 1978 schedule, losing to Wheelersburg and Coal Grove. But after their 7-0 win over Notre Dame, the team had the incentive they needed and went on to post a season record of 7-3.


All-SOC Football First Team honors went to Brian Evans, Dan Meade, Mick Dillow and John Mauk; Second Team honors, to Rich Blakeman, Craig Bailey, Duane Pick and Dale Shupert. B. Evans, with more than 2,000 yards this season, was voted SOC Back of the Year, South East District Back of the Year, and Second Team All State. Dan Meade was voted to the First Team South East District squad. A capable Senator coaching staff — line coach, Steve Rapp, defensive secondary coach, John Boling, linebacker coach, Chris Gibson, and defensive end coach, Mike Brown — moulded a game-deciding defensive unit that was able to limit West opponents to an average of 35 yards per game rushing.







This year's Reserve team posted a record of 2-3.






Basketball Team Struggles Through Tough Season — Varsity Victories Hard to Come by

With the experience gained by the younger members of the squad, West could be a contender in league play next year.



Seniors Challenged by Tom Jones




Chosen as this year's senior class play was *Tom Jones*, a comedy about the London adventures of an orphan boy who was shunned and ridiculed by society.
