





THE NEW GENERATION




The Tartan boys battled to bring home a 20-0 victory over the St. Joe Flyers in the 1986 Homecoming game, played Friday evening. October 3.

With nineteen seconds left, Chris Jennings ran five yards for the Tartans' final touchdown. Messer made it an even twenty points with a completed field goal.











Tony Raike: Close Annamarie's department store (that she will open).




Experience leads Tartans









The salutatory honor was presented to Pam Keeton by Principal Mike Flaig.













1987 Junior-Senior Prom


