



A Show of Hands

Thinking power is just not enough when it comes to specialized classes such as Home Economics, Industrial Arts, Accounting, Typing, and Occupational Work Experience. From learning the keys on the typewriter to the on-the-job training, students developed skills that can be used in later life.

Home Economics prepare both boys and girls for life on their own by teaching sewing and cooking. Occupational Work Experience and Occupational Work Adjustment provide job experience to those who plan on working right after high school. Students in accounting, general business and business law learn skills that will prepare them for a career in business administration. Typing and stenography offer students a chance to learn skills that can be used in a secretarial career.

Other "hands on" classes like art, drawing, singles living and family living provide students with a wide range of choices to pick from. Each class specializes in skills that are useful now and will be in the years to come.


Highlight Of Season














Nothing Better To Do



Fads



Spring Break






Cruisin'
